he was saved on the Damasucs Road. Others, that he was not saved umtil he went into the city, and it was told him what he "MUST do." (Acts 9:6). In Acts 22:16, Ananias, "a devout man" said unto Saul, "And now why tarriest thou? arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy

3. That the washing is NOT baptism, but in the passage it FOLLOWS baptism, or is SOMETHING BAPTISM

6. It couldn't have been BEFORE Jesus told him to go INTO THE CITY, BECAUSE JESUS DIDNT KNOW IT. He said "THERE it shall be told thee what thou MUST do." (Acts 9:6). 4. If he was SAVED while PRAYING in the city of Damascus, Ananias DIDNT KNNO
for he went to tell him what to do to be saved. 5. If he was SAVED while FASTING a ERRABLE SAAVED MAN anybody ever read of
7. He couldn't have been saved when Ananias laid his hands on him, FOR THAT WAS BE FORE he did what he was told to do to be saved.
When was Saul Saved? Ananias said to him, "Arise, and be baptized, and WASH AWAY THY SINS." Saul's sins-were really washed away in the blood of Christ (1 John 1:7), that IS WHAA
