shade by the following methods. Then fill the bathtub shade by the following methods. Then fill the bathtub
or sink with enough warm water to cover the shade Add detergent and swish to dissolve. Vacuum the shade inside and out to remove surface dirt. Then dunk the shade in the watef and move it from side to side and up
and down. If soil is stubborn, you may need to rub with and down. If soil is stubborn, you may need to rub with
a well lathered, soft-bristled brush. Rinse shade in several changes of clean water. Dip up and down. Dry the shade by tying a string to the middle of
the frame. Then hang up over the bathtub or from a
clothesline outdoors to drip dry Or pat dry with towel. Plastic, plastic coating or parchment shades may be
