Weekly Ag Update

On the average, agricultural production costs should remain about the same in 1983 as they were in 1982, says Wayne Taylor, economist-management for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.
Some fertilizer materials are less expensive now than six months ago. Therefore, the purchase of fertilizer could help reduce the tax burden if the purchases are made before January 1.
Also, now may be a good time to buy machinery if the producer has the money and needs depreciation and investment credit. Some tractor companies, for example, would like to reduce their inventory and offer a finance-lease that will allow the producer to buy the equipment for 10 percent or more of the original purchase price after the last period. Producers should keep in mind that payments have to be made on purchases and if the cash flow will not stand the payments, Taylor says do not make the purchase.
Producers should plan the 1983 operation carefully. Taylor suggests using the calculator and a lot of paper in figuring operating budgets. East Texas producers should try to maintain as much equity in their operation as possible now in order to have the financial strength to take advantage of better times when they come.

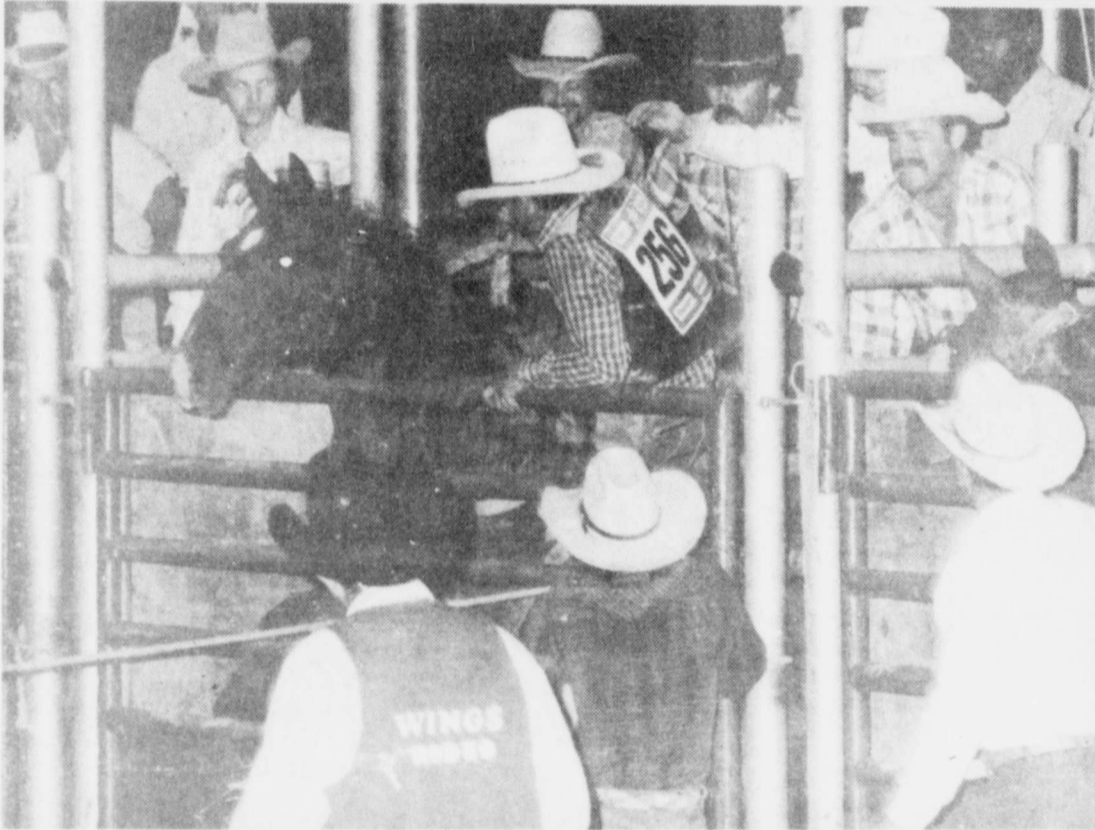
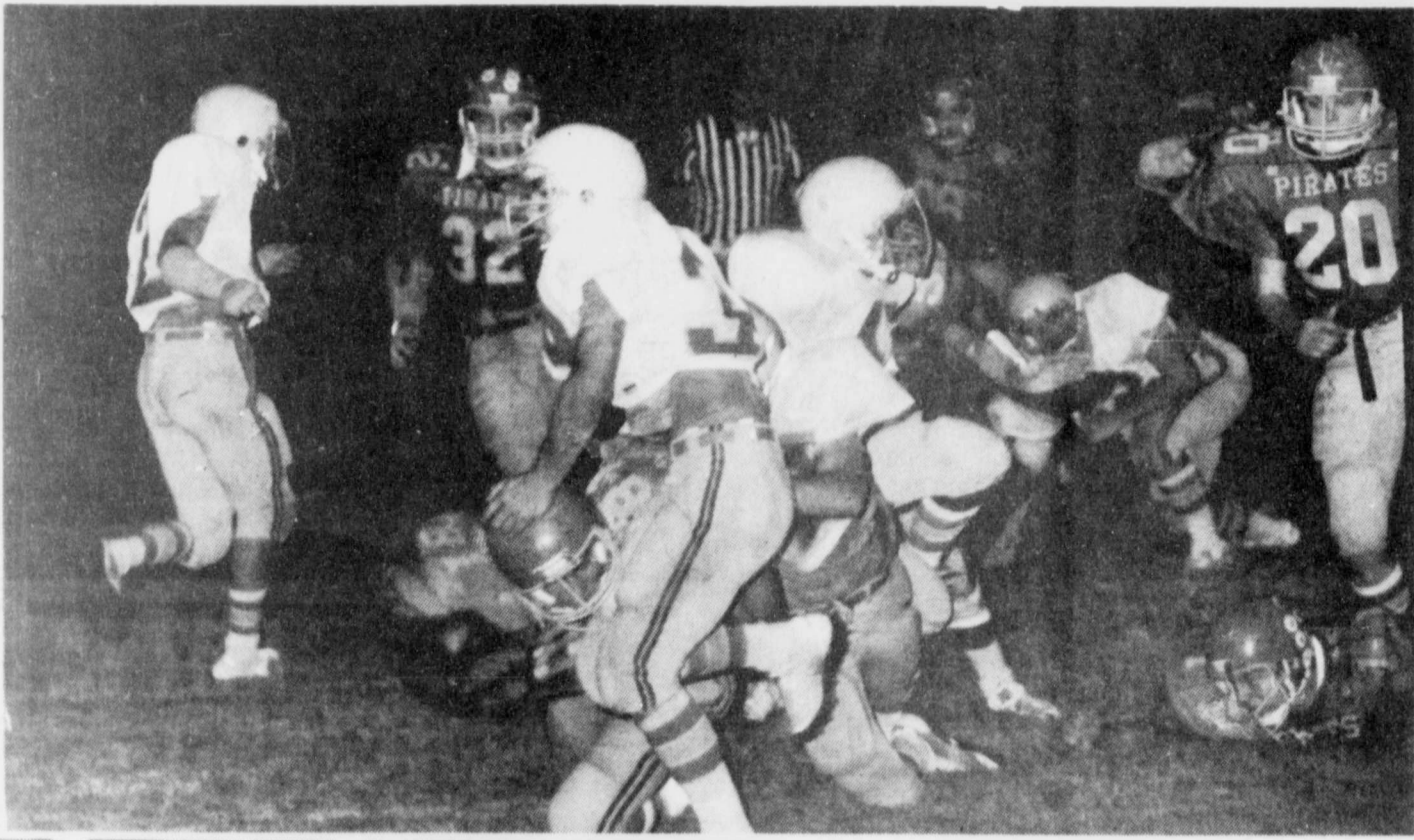

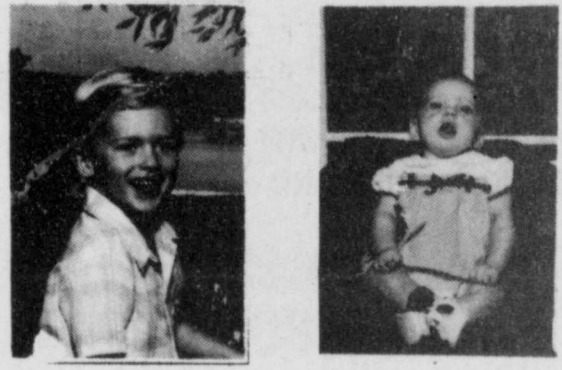
Mrs. E.W. Burks Honored On 89th Birthday

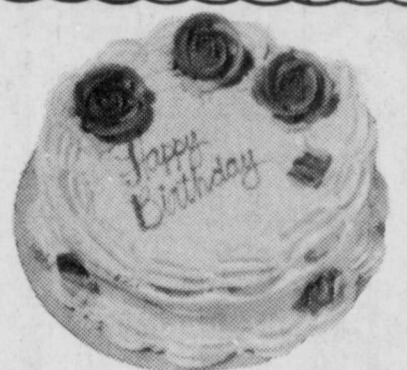

Education Service Receives Grant

The Region VIII Education Service Center has received a grant of \$20,104 from the Ark-Tex Council of Governments for a one-year alcohol education project. The grant will sponsor alcohol education to teachers, students, civic groups, or other interested parties. Irresponsible use of alcohol is a growing problem among young people and is known to be the leading cause of automobile deaths among youth. Young people as well as adults need more education about alcohol and alcohol abuse if alcohol problems are to be prevented. The Alcohol Education Project will provide accurate information about drinking to the students, teachers and parents in the eleven county area of Region VIII. The programs can be geared to the particular needs of the audience and can cover any facet of the growing alcohol abuse problem in the country. Although there are no quick and easy answers to the complex issue, education and information are the initial steps toward reaching the youth and adults in the area.
