Both the Varsity boys and girls teams met defeat Tuesday night as they met New Diana. The losses now total two for the girls team in district competition and brings the Rebels tied in district with the team from Redwater.

The Dragons came back in the second stanza with 12, but Rivercrest netted 21 of their own to widen their lead. David Rozell, Bradley Moore, John Hines and Randy Galloway each got four points. Stan Wood added two and Davis and Jeffery each connected on a free throw. The halftime score read 37-22.

David Rozell was hot in the third quarter as he popped the net for 12 points. John Hines hit for two which brought the score to 51-30.

The Rebels continued to dominate the contest in the final period. Larry Davis shot for eight points and Rozell added six more. Bradley Moore and Scott Brown each scored two while Stan Wood, John Hines, Kelly Jeffery and Mark Brown connected on free throws. They totaled 24 points in the last quarter to bring the final to 75-43.

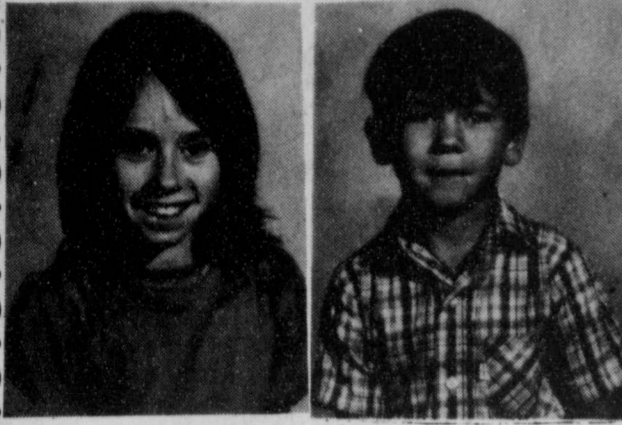

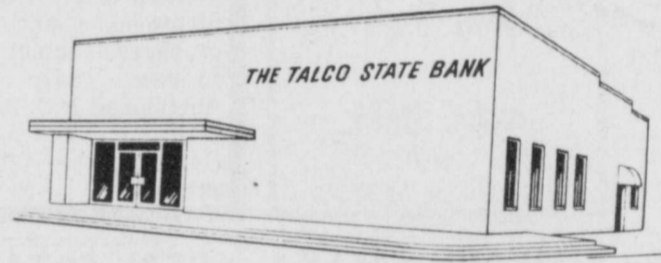
