
Primarily, we speak of the person that works for a company who has a retirement program of their own for the employee. However, if the amount received from the retirement program, less voluntary contributions, is deposited within 60 days to an IRA, tax can be avoided until withdrawals begin. The taxes will normally be less when the total annual income has been decreased by retirement.
