Fighting root knot nematodes in the first step is to get a good soil mendations sampel so that the tiny insects can be properly diagnosed.

The fall months are usually the best for taking soil samples for nematodes, microscopic worms that feed on plant roots. During this time, nematodes are generally in the free living stage and can be recovered

easily by checking soil sampels. To obtain a soil sample, take soil from an area where plants were grown this summer or from the root zone of existing plants. An area where beans, squash, cucumbers or susceptible tomato varieties were grown is the most desirable. Samwill give an inaccurate picture of the that have root knot resistance.

An area treated in your garden this fall should provide protection for nematode sensitive crops such as okra or lima beans next spring.





Fifty-three bands participated, and Floyd estimated, between 28,000 and 30,000 persons filled the stands.



Agricultural producers will soon be faced with figuring their tax liability for 1984. According to Wayne Taylor, now is the time to do final planning to reduce the tax burden.

Producers should determine where the business now stands from the records kept during the year. To get an estimate of the tax liability before the end of the year a little simple arithmetic will help. Total income from all sources to date and project income to be received for the expenses to date and proj expenses for the remainder of the ar. Then, look at last year's tax return and estimate personal deductions

and depreciation. estimates of itemized personal not service the added debt. deductions and depreciation from the

projected 1984 income to obtain a rough estimate of taxable income for

Taylor suggests reviewing the position shown and then make business decisions accordingly. If additional machinery or equipment is needed and these purchases were being considered anyway, tax liability for cash basis taxpayers could be reduced by making needed investments prior to January 1. In some instances, good buys on various supplies can be found and remainder of the year. Next, total should be purchased now if they are going to be needed.

Post Office Offers Christmas Tips

The Postal Service advises that with a little bit of care, holiday cards and packages can arrive on time and in good condition.

In addition to mailing early, customers are urged to properly address cards and packages with the name, apartment or house number and street number, and the city, state and ZIP code reserved for the

It is also a good idea to put a slip of paper with the recipient's name and address and your return address inside parcels, and be sure your return address and ZIP code are on the outside of the parcel as well.

Customers are also reminded to check the size of their envelopes before mailing Christmas and other holiday cards. Letter size standards require that envelopes be at least 3-1/2 inches high and 5 inches long to be accepted for mailing.

Parcels will arrive at their intended destination in good shape if you follow a few simple suggestions:

CLUB STEAK

Make sure contents are wellcushioned and there is no empty space in the box. Use crumpled newspaper around the item, including all sides, top and bottom. Commercially available foam shells or air-pocket padding also are good cushioning materials. Padded mailbags are a good way to mail small items.

Just use your carton. Brown paper and twine cord are not necessary. Paper can rip, and twine can become entangled in mail processing equipment.

Tips For **Improving** Game Land

Hunting season is in full swing by December. Charles VanDeaver, district conservationist for the USDA Soil Conservation Service in Clarksville, encourages sportsmen to be observant while hunting.

"You might learn some ways to improve the habitat of your favorite game for the 1985-86 hunting season," VanDeaver said. "For instance, inland duck hunters will likely see more ducks on stock tanks and farm ponds this year. During the summer drought, water levels receded lower than usual, exposing more pond bottom for a longer period of time.

VanDeaver said Japanese millet, which is commercially available, can be planted along the water's edge next summer. Even if fall rains do not flood your plantings, surface feeding ducks will feed on dry land.

"Your hunting sport may be deer, quail, turkey or pheasant," VanDeaver said. "While hunting, keep in mind that good habitat is the key to success. Identify the important characteristics of good habitat for your game. After the season closes, come to the SCS office for assistance in improving the habitat of your favorite game animal."

The local SCS field office gives technical assistance to landowners, operators and others through the Red River County Soil and Water Conservation District.


