Judge Completes Training

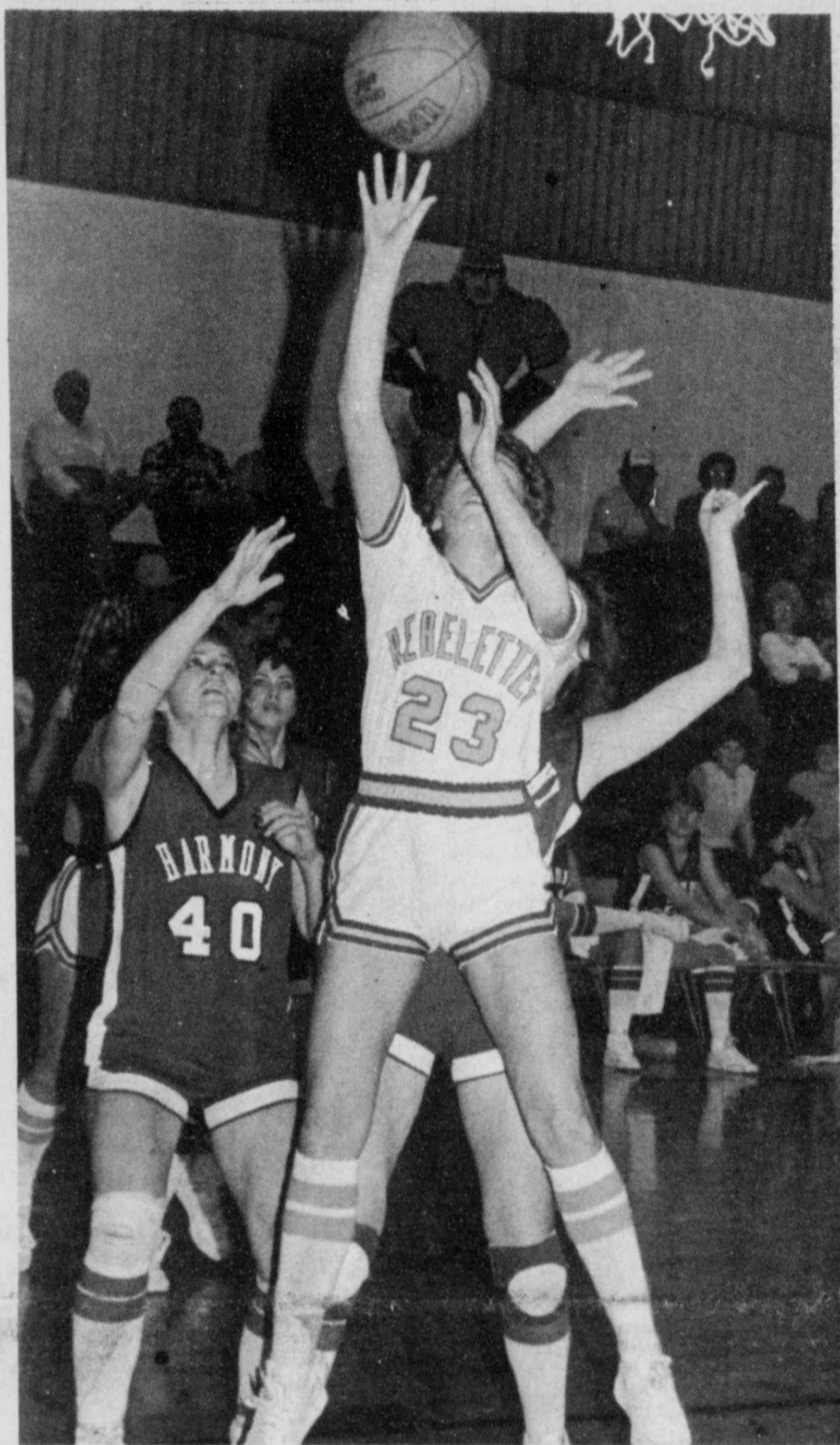

Karnack came back with twenty points in the third period but the Rebelettes answered with 13 of their own. Karnack took the lead by one point at the end of the third period.

Rivercrest hit for thirteen more in the final period and with a good defensive effort held Karnack to eight. The Rebelettes were on top 53-41 in the final count.

Scoring for the Rebelettes were Mary Jane Savage with 26; Staci Griffin with 12; Donna Sessums with 7; and Tricia Duffer and Kelly Anschutz with four.

Harmony posed no problems to the Rebelettes, either JV or varsity, as the Rivercrest girls defeated the Lady Eagles 60-41 in varsity play, and 32-12 in JV play on the Rebelettes own turf.

As far as human response was concerned, that first Christmas left a lot to be desired. Oh, of course there was Mary. And there was Joseph. And there was that decree from the mighty Caesar Augustus that Mary and Joseph had to obey. So that got them to Bethlehem for the beginning of God's climactic revelation of himself to the world. While they were in Bethlehem, she gave birth to a baby boy and his name was called Jesus. But Bethlehem must have slept through it. The birthplace itself was a stable.

There were shepherds in the field that night. And they got the message. It caused them to leave their sheep on that dark night and make their way to Bethlehem to see what had been made known to them. And there were wisemen who came from the East in search of "Him who had been born King of the Jews." Other than that, the human response was practically nil.

But God's work was spectacular. A sudden burst of bright light shining on that shepherd's field causing

those present sudden alarm. An angel of the Lord appeared before them and sought to remove their fear: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord." Investigation Continues In Shooting Death

The death of a Cuthand resident, Ernest Borders, is still under investigation by the Red River County Sheriff's office, and at present, no arrest has been made, nor any official suspect named.

Ernest Borders, age 60, was found lying on the floor of his home by Sheriff's deputies after a call of a shooting incident.

He had apparently been shot twice in the head, and was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace J.C. Watson of Bogata.

All evidence, including the body, was sent to Southwest Forensic Science Center in Dallas for autopsy and investigation. The matter is currently under investigation, but little is known.

Funeral services for Mr. Borders were at 2 p.m. Saturday, December 15 at the Temple Baptist Church in Clarksville with the Rev. Eddie Slaton officiating. Burial was in Cuthand Cemetery by Bogata Funeral Home.

Mr. Borders was born Aug. 27, 1925 in Terrell, a son of Harry Albert and Mary Elizabeth Skinner Borders. He married Minnie (Belle) Moore on Nov. 21, 1944, in Greenville. He was a member of the Bogata Veterans of Foreign Wars and Local No. 669, and was a veteran of the U.S. Navy. He was a member of the Baptist Church. He was retired from Automatic Sprinkler Systems.

Surviving are his wife; two sons,

Tommy Borders of Deport and Danny Borders of Blossom; one granddaughter, Jena Borders of Deport; two grandsons, Michael Borders of Deport and Daniel Borders of Blossom; two brothers, Preston Borders of Mesquite and Ben Borders of The Colony.

Judge Braswell Passes Sentences

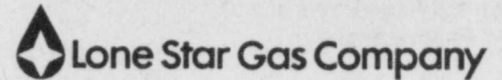

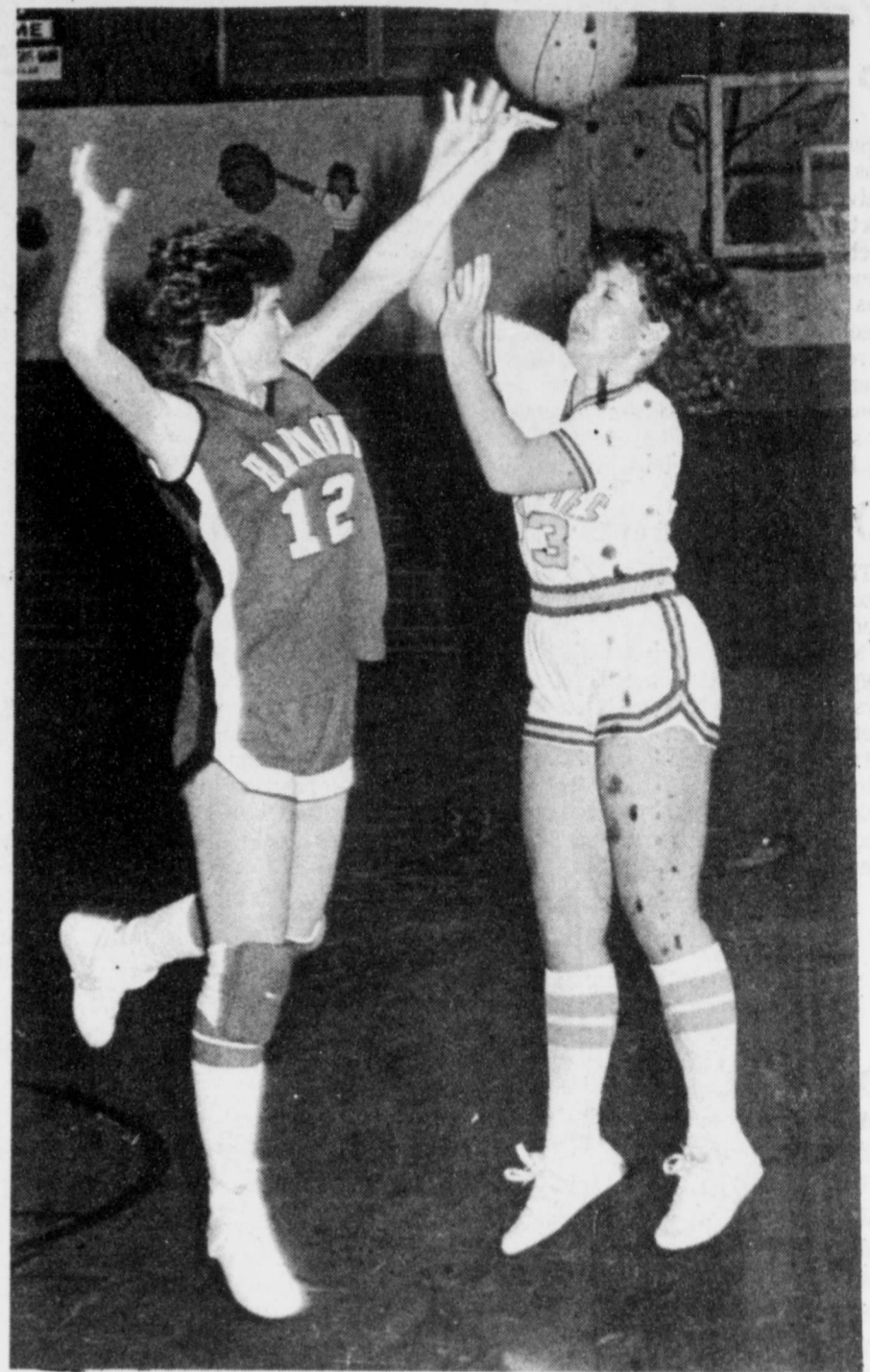

Going To Grandma's

Christmas 1913: We were living at Deport, and our Grandmother Leach and uncle John were living on the Leach homestead at Garvinsville (Outhand), about twenty miles away. We decided to go to Grandma's for Christmas. The weather was cold and threatening snow. The top was already up on the buggy, so Dad put up the storm curtains, and hitched up the horses. Mother put a few packages and a lunch in the compartment behind and under the buggy seat. She wrapped some hot bricks and placed them on the floor behind the dashboard. We loaded up and were off, all wearing warm clothing and winter coats, and we were covered with a thick lap robe. There were no highways, just frozen muddy roads between the farms. The north wind whistled through the bare cotton stalks as we made our way across the prairie. At Bogata we stopped at the camp ground on Morrison Branch, now Bogata Park, watered and fed the horses, and built a camp fire so that we could warm our feet and also make coffee. After lunch was over we were on our way again. Traveling

was better in the sandy land timber country, the wind didn't blow as much, and there were no frozen ruts except in the branch bottoms. We had to ford the creeks as there were no bridges, but that was no problem for our mode of transportation as long as they were not in flood stage.

Grandma and Uncle John came out to greet us when they heard us drive up. After all the hugging and kissing was taken care of, Dad and Uncle John unhitched the horses and led them to the barn, while Mother and Grandma unloaded the buggy and carried the packages into the house. There was a big log fire in the fireplace which really felt good after driving all day in the cold.

The next morning as soon as we heard Uncle John stirring up the fire in the fireplace, we were up and retrieving our stockings. We each got fruit and nuts, and a warm pair of gloves. Gladys got a rag doll.

Christmas 1938: Dad had retired from public work and he and Mother were living on the old Leach home place at Cuthand. They were grandparents. Dumpy and I with Mary Margaret were living in Gilmer. Osie and family were living in Corpus Christi. Ed was not married and was living in the Houston area. Gladys and Dick Hatcher with their family were living in Bogata. Come Christmas time, we all began to gravitate to the Grandma's house. The roads had become mostly gravel highways. Most of the automobiles were sedans and were heated, making them comfortable for winter travel. It was no problem for any of us to get as far as Pine Branch Store on the gravel road east of Bogata, but after Pine Branch the situation was different. Travel was impossible in an automobile on the high, well drained sections of roadway, but the creek and branch bottoms were impassible. Dad had to meet us with a team of mules at the store and escort us the rest of the way. When a car got stuck, Dad with a tow chain was there. It took about as long to get everyone pulled the last five or six miles as it did to travel a hundred miles on the improved highways.

After arriving at the house, the cars were unloaded and the packages of presents were stacked around the Christmas tree. Everyone would be visiting and talking at the same time. The kids went to bed early, anticipating the following morning, but the grownups stayed up and visited and more talk till a late hour. The next morning even before Dad could get a fire going in the fireplace, the kids were all up.

Christmas 1984: The cycle will be repeated, but the roles of the characters have changed over the years. The kids of seventy years ago are the grandparents today, but the occasion is just as enjoyable. The roads have progressed from mud

passageways across the prairie and through the woods to modern paved highways. The vehicles of transportation are as comfortable for traveling as an upholstered chair in an air conditioned living room. It is possible now to travel from Houston to Cuthand in the time that was required in 1913 to travel from Deport to Cuthand. All our family, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren will be home at Grandma's for Christmas.

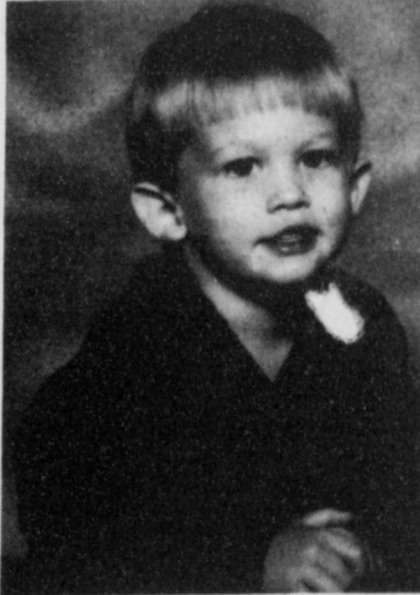
