

# Rebels, Rebelettes In Leonard Tourney

The Rebels met Whitewright in their third and final match of the tournament. The Whitewright boys proved to be a very strong team and took the win by five points 63-58. Rivercrest had two players with high marks. Tony Jasso hit for 24 and Anthony Brown for 22.

The Rivercrest boys will travel to New Diana Friday night for a very important district game.

The current district standings are Ore City and Maud tied for first with

a 2-0 record. New Diana, Rivercrest, Harmony and Harleton are tied for third with a 1-1 record. Karnack and Redwater are 0-2. Another important district game Friday night will be Ore City against Maud.

The Rivercrest Rebelettes also traveled to Leonard for the holiday tournament. The girls met Howe in their first round and were defeated 46-41.

Rivercrest hit six points in the first period. Howe took the early lead with 12 points. Becky Brooks scored four for the Rebelettes and Staci Griffin two.

Howe held a three point lead at the half 23-20. Becky Brooks, Donna Sessums, Kelly Anschutz and Staci Griffin all contributed scores in the second period.

The contest continued to be a close one throughout. The Rebelettes scored seven more in the third quarter to their opponent's nine for a quarter score of 32-27. Howe continued to hold the lead by five.

The Rivercrest girls racked up 14 points in the final period but Howe met their challenge with 14 of their own to claim the victory 46-41.

Scoring for the Rebelettes were Donna Sessums with 13; Becky

Brooks with 12; Staci Griffin with 8; and Kelly Anschutz and Mary Jane Savage each with four.

The Rebelettes dropped their second round game to Sam Rayburn by a close two points, 44-42.

The Rivercrest girls trailed at the end of the first quarter 18-8. The girls added nine more in the second period of Sam Rayburn's 12. The score at the halfway mark read 30-17. Sam Rayburn.

The Rebelettes offensive and defensive squads picked up the pace in the second half. The girls racked up 14 points in the third period and defensively held Sam Rayburn to six.

Mary Jane Savage scored six, Tricia Duffer four and Becky Brooks and Kelly Anschutz two each. The Rebelettes trailed by five at the end of the period, 36-31.

Rivercrest hit the basket for eleven more in the final period but came up short as Sam Rayburn added eight for the two point win 44-42.

Scoring for Rivercrest were Tricia Duffer and Mary Jane Savage each with 11; Becky Brooks with 9; Kelly Anschutz with six; Staci Griffin with four; and Donna Sessums with one.

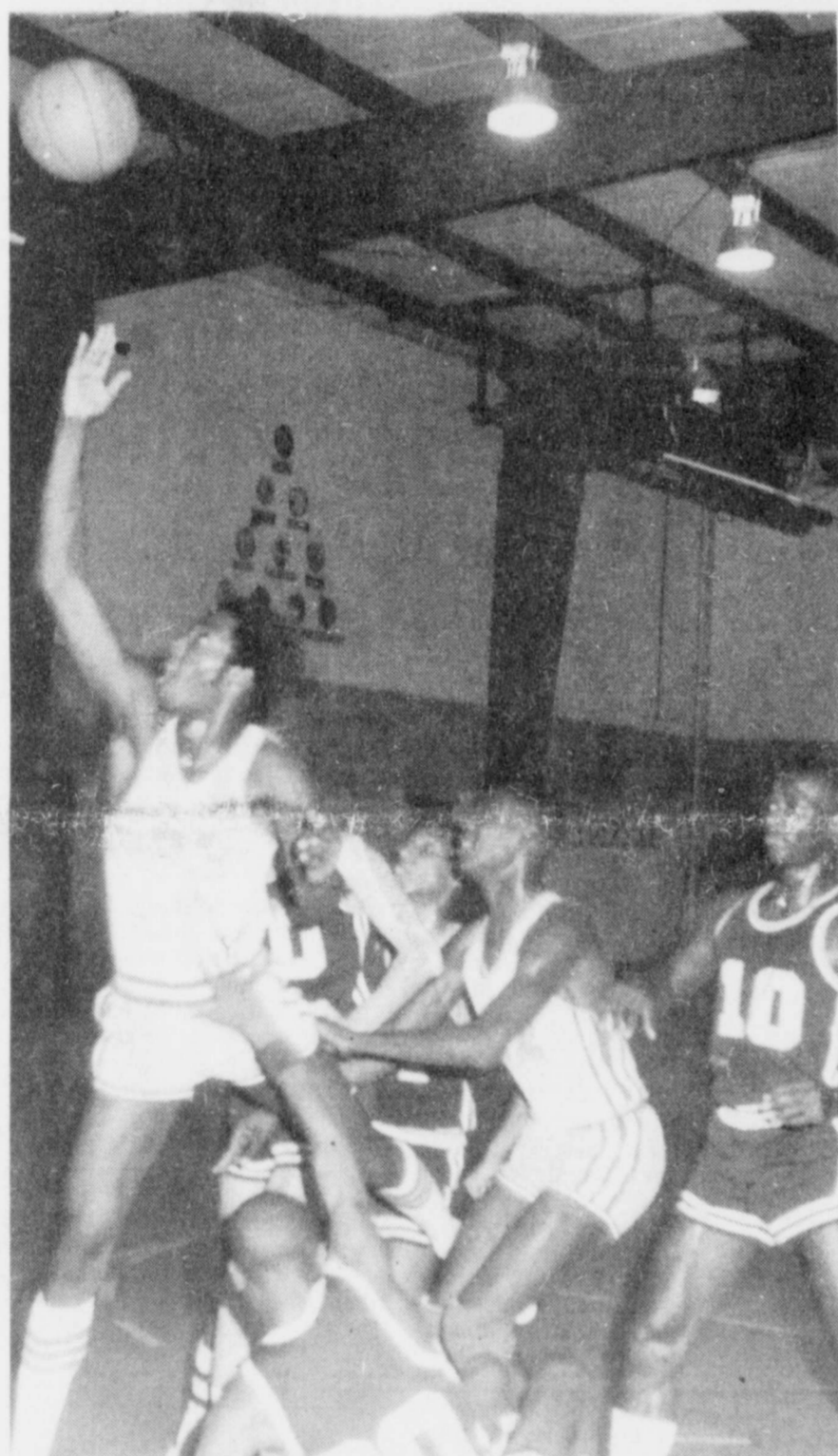

Lions members distributed toys and fruit donated by the Church of Christ and one pair of glasses to a student of the Bogata schools.

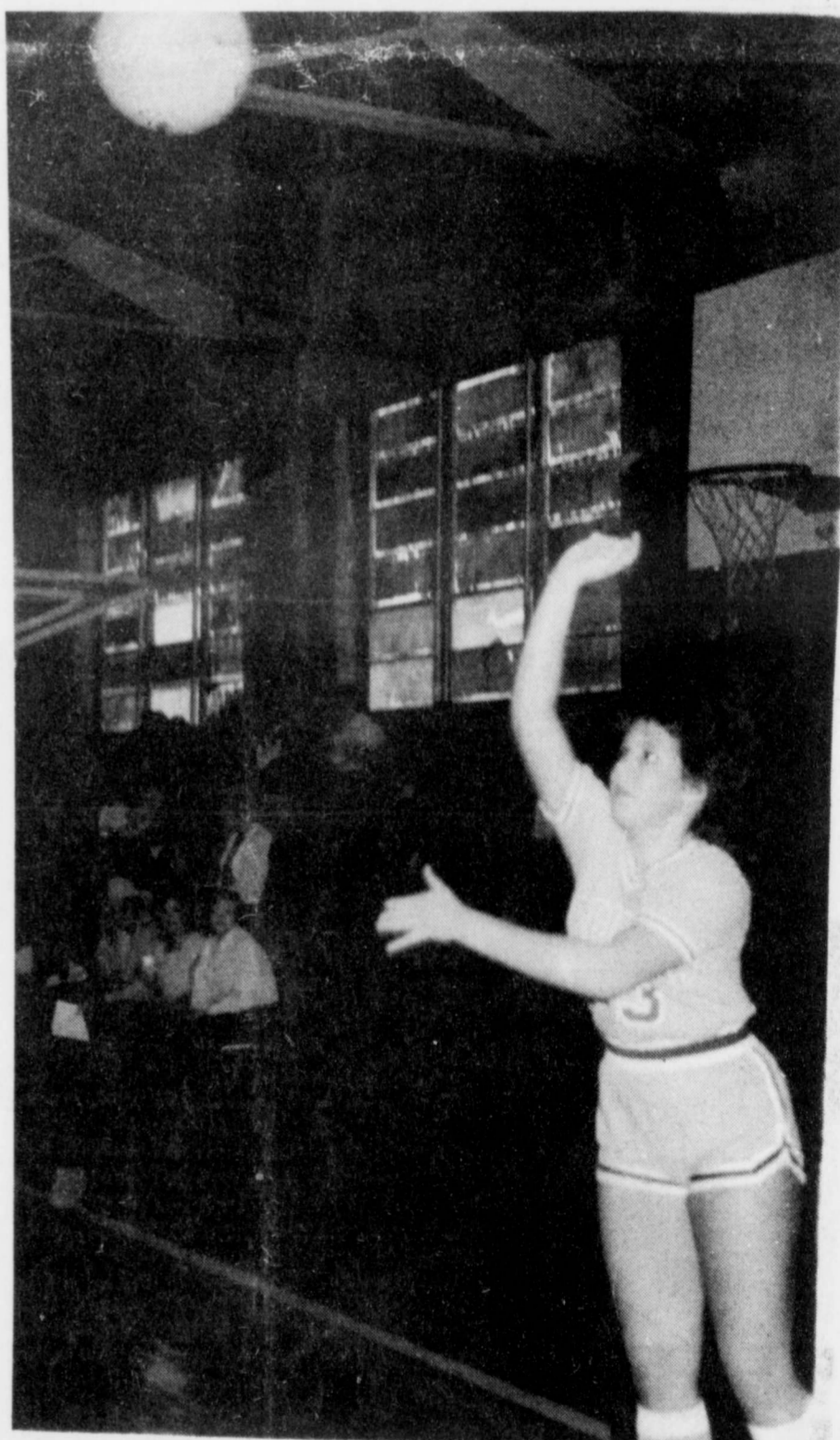

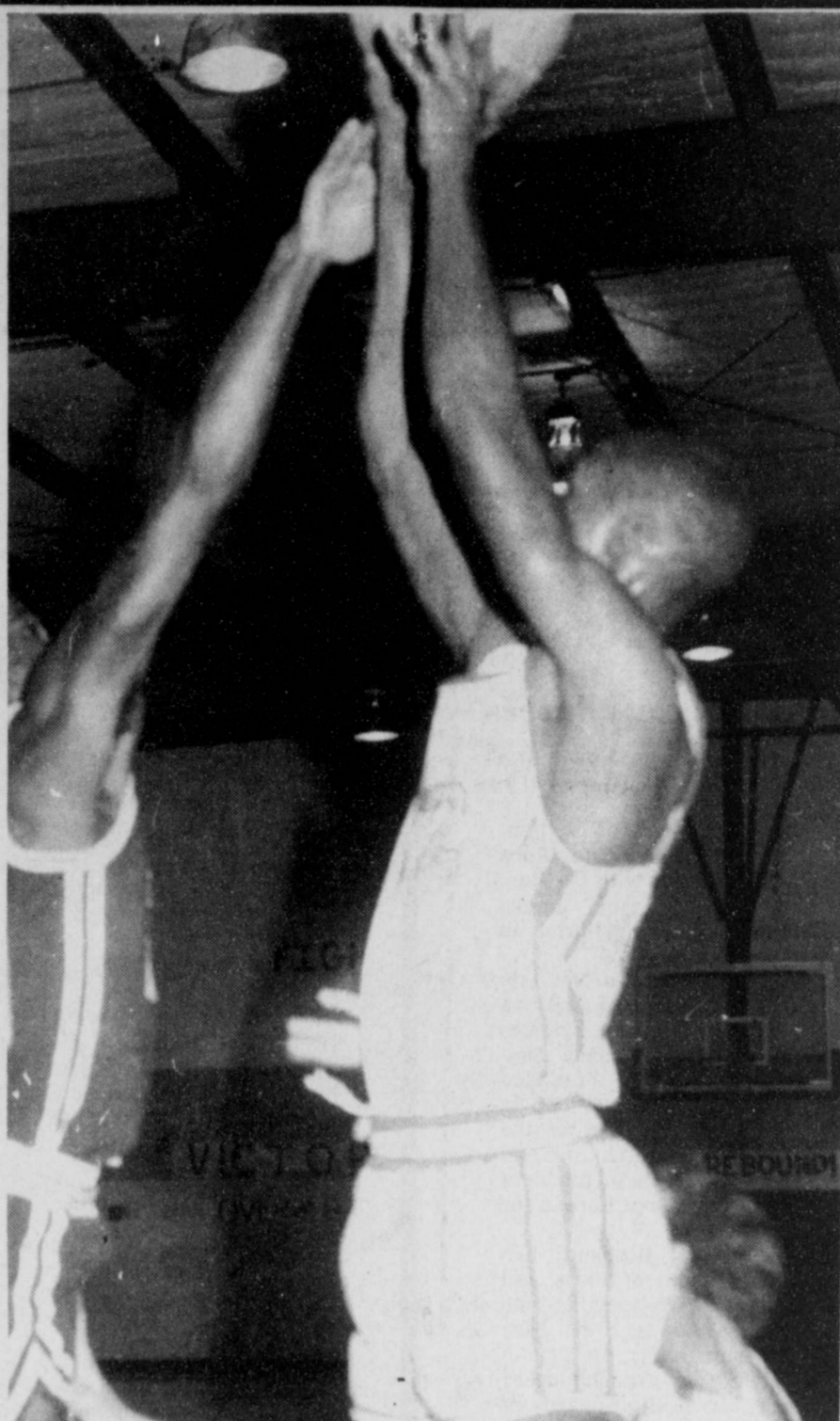
