

# Rebels Take District Title From Harleton

The Rivercrest Rebels defeated Harleton 51-41 last week to capture the district title. This will be the third year in a row for the Rebels to be in the bi-district contest. The game will be in the Sulphur Springs gym Friday at 7:30 p.m. They will play Hawkins. The Rebs have had good experience in the Sulphur

Springs gym winning their past two bi-district games there.  
Hawkins, 20AA district champs, beat Edgewood for their district title. Hawkins has a lot of good height and experience.  
The Rebels handed Harleton the ten point defeat last week in Hughes Springs. The Rebs trailed by five at the end of the first period and

narrowed the margin to one at the half.  
Rivercrest took over in the third quarter and opened up for 20 points. Each player contributed points. The Reb defense held Harleton to twelve points in the period.  
Free throws were definite factors in the outcome of the game. Harleton hit two in the final period but James

Anderson hit five and Tony Jasso two. Bobby Thomas and Russell Rozell each hit one. The Rebs scored a total of 15 in the final period to Harleton's 12.  
Scoring for the Rebels were Tony Jasso with 12, James Anderson with nine, Anthony Brown with eight, Russell Rozell with seven, Brad Anderson with six, Bobby Thomas with five and Charley Martin with

four.  
According to Coach Wake Wood, the Rebel starting lineup for the Hawkins game will probably be Anthony Brown, Tony Jasso, James Anderson, Bobby Thomas and Russell Rozell. Brown has been averaging twenty-two points per game, Jasso twelve points and Anderson 10.5 points. Thomas and Rozell average five points each. The

Rebs will expect help from the bench in the form of Charley Martin and Brad Anderson. Both players played well against Harleton.  
"We have an excellent chance to win. Our defense has developed over the last few weeks. The players are positive and confident but not overconfident," said Coach Wood.

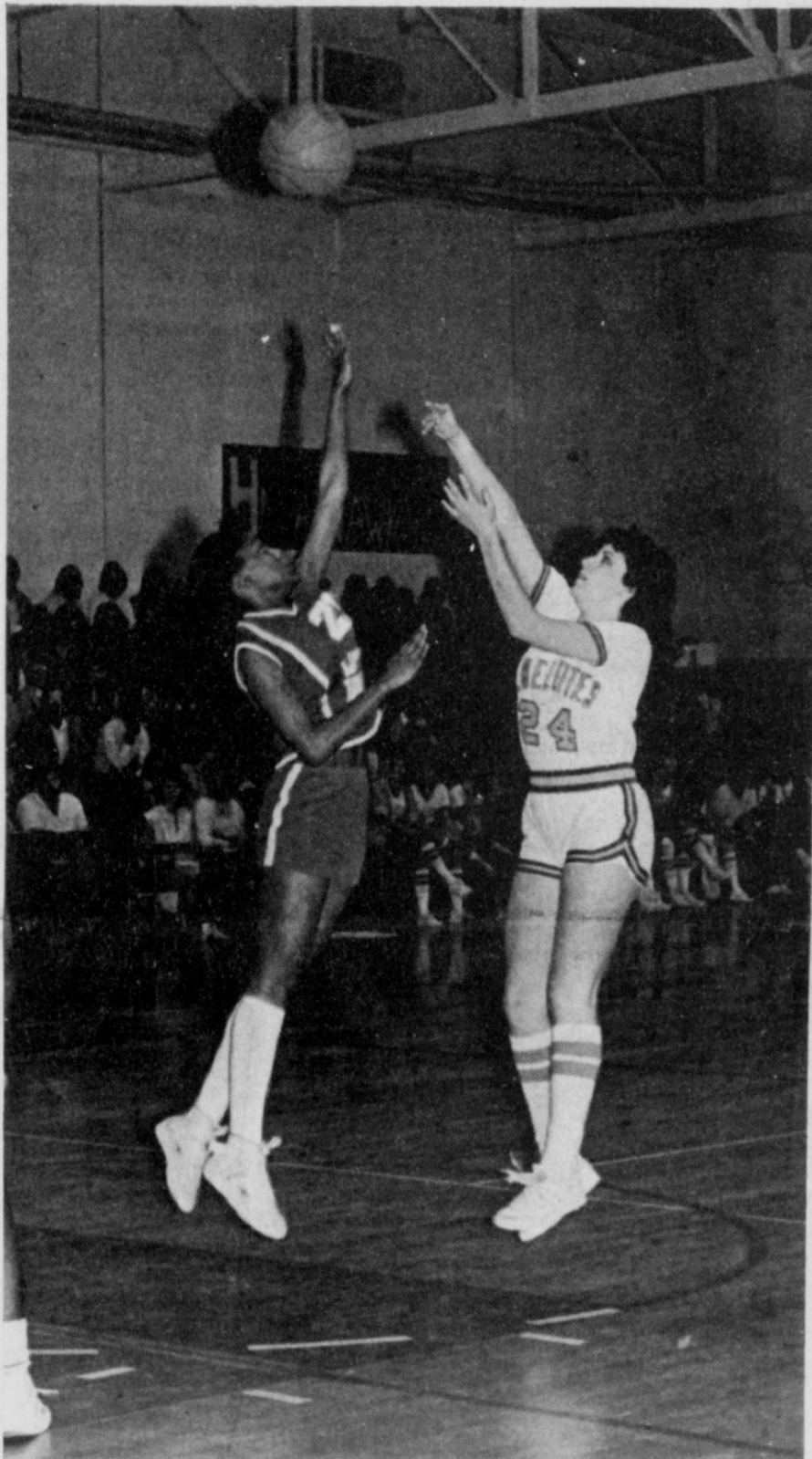

## Red River Co. Hospital "Better Than Image"

The Red River General Hospital is far better than its local image. "It is insufficiently appreciated by the people of the county", James Roeder of Hamilton Associates, a consulting firm, told the Commissioner's Court Monday. "Red River General is efficiently run, well maintained and offers quality care in a range of services unusually broad for a hospital of its size," Roeder said.

To assure its future as the going concern is today, Red River General must keep up its patient census in the face of challenges from its big neighbors in adjacent counties. Roder's presentation to the court, which followed an earlier report to

the hospital board, suggested steps that could be considered to increase utilization of the hospital. The more the hospital is used, he said, the more economical its operation becomes.

One way to increase use of the hospital would be to attract additional physicians to the county. We already have enough family practitioners. Roeder said a top priority might be an internist, ideally one with a sub-specialty in cardiology or pediatrics. Such a physician would not compete with family practitioners already here, but would be a back up resource who could reduce the number of local citizens seeking

care out of county.

According to Roeder, Red River County also has sufficient population to support a pediatrician and an orthopedist. For lack of a local orthopedist, local accident victims are often transferred to out of county hospitals after being stabilized at Red River General.

Arrangements need to be made to extend services to such communities as Detroit and Annona. Avery, Roeder found. If this is not done, institutions in nearby counties might establish part time clinics that would tend to funnel patients needing hospital care away from Red River General.

Other possibilities for outreach by Red River General lie in the fields of hospice and home care. A hospice is a facility in which patients having length and probably terminal illness can receive both medical care and other support. Both are encouraged by the federal government as cheaper than full in hospital care.

"I know some people will be disappointed," Roeder said, "but we cannot recommend that Red River General seek to establish an obstetrical facility." One reason for this position was the growing threat of mal practice suits, which makes insurance so expensive that the field is attractive only in settings unlike those at Red River General, he said.

Last we forget, the Growl (the Bogata High School school paper, voice of the Bulldogs) was the The staff consisted of an editor,

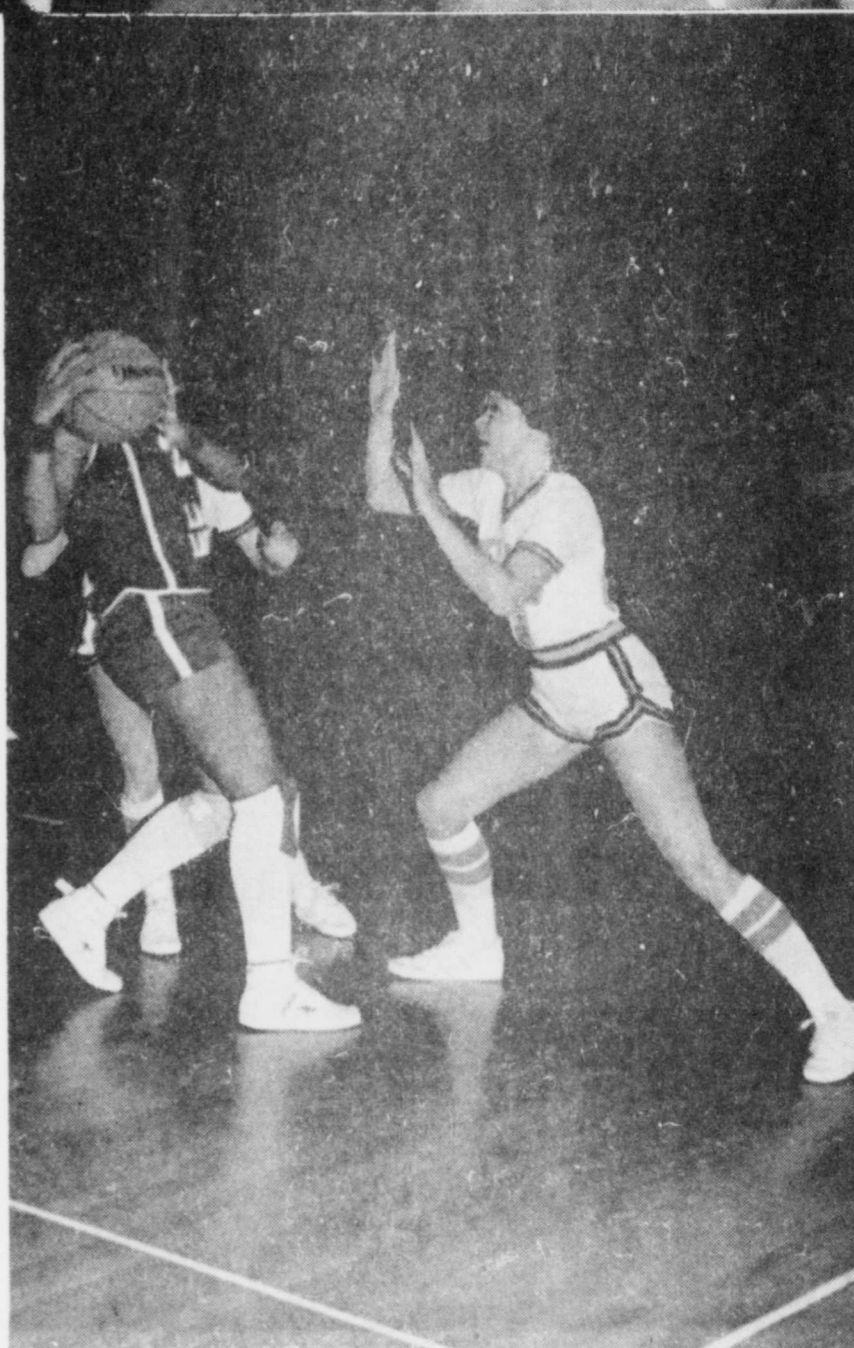

**ORDINANCE NO: 1985-10**  
An ordinance regulating water rates; setting a minimum monthly water service rate; providing for an emergency; and providing for an effective date.

WHEREAS, the rate at which the City of Deport purchases its water has increased; and

WHEREAS, the present minimum water service rate is insufficient to cover such increase;

NOW, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Deport, Texas:

1. That Ordinance shall hereafter read as follows:  
B. Water Rate  
That there shall be and is hereby adopted and fixed for the fiscal year 1985 a minimum monthly water service rate of \$8.00 for the first 1500 gallons of water used and an additional rate of \$1.75 for each 1,000 gallons of water used in excess of the first 1500 gallons.

11. WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent requiring that all laws requiring more than one reading or prohibiting the passage of an Ordinance introduced and the taking effect on the day of introduction and passage, shall be suspended; such Ordinance shall be passed and effective as an emergency measure and be in full force and effect from and after the 1st day of February, 1985.

The effective date of this Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after February 1, 1985.

IT IS SO ORDAINED.

Read, approved and passed this 11th day of February, 1985.

**ORDINANCE**  
An ordinance of the City of Bogata, Texas, prohibiting the consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places or on private property commonly used by the public; and providing for a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Bogata:

1. The consumption of any alcoholic beverage on any public street, sidewalk, park, alley or other public property, or on private property commonly used by the public, within the corporate limits of the City of Bogata, is unlawful and is prohibited. It is specifically provided, however, that this section shall not apply to consumption of alcoholic beverages on privately owned residential parking areas or on privately owned parking lots where a fee is charged for the privilege of parking or storing a motor vehicle. The throwing of any opened container of the type generally used for alcoholic beverages from or out of any vehicle shall be prima facie evidence that the occupance thereof were then and there drinking alcoholic beverages in violation of this section.

2. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance, or who allows, on premises covered by any license issued by the City of Bogata, any person to do the things prohibited by this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). Each day such violation continues shall be a separate offense.

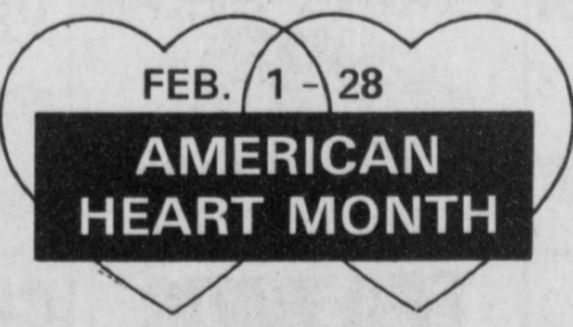

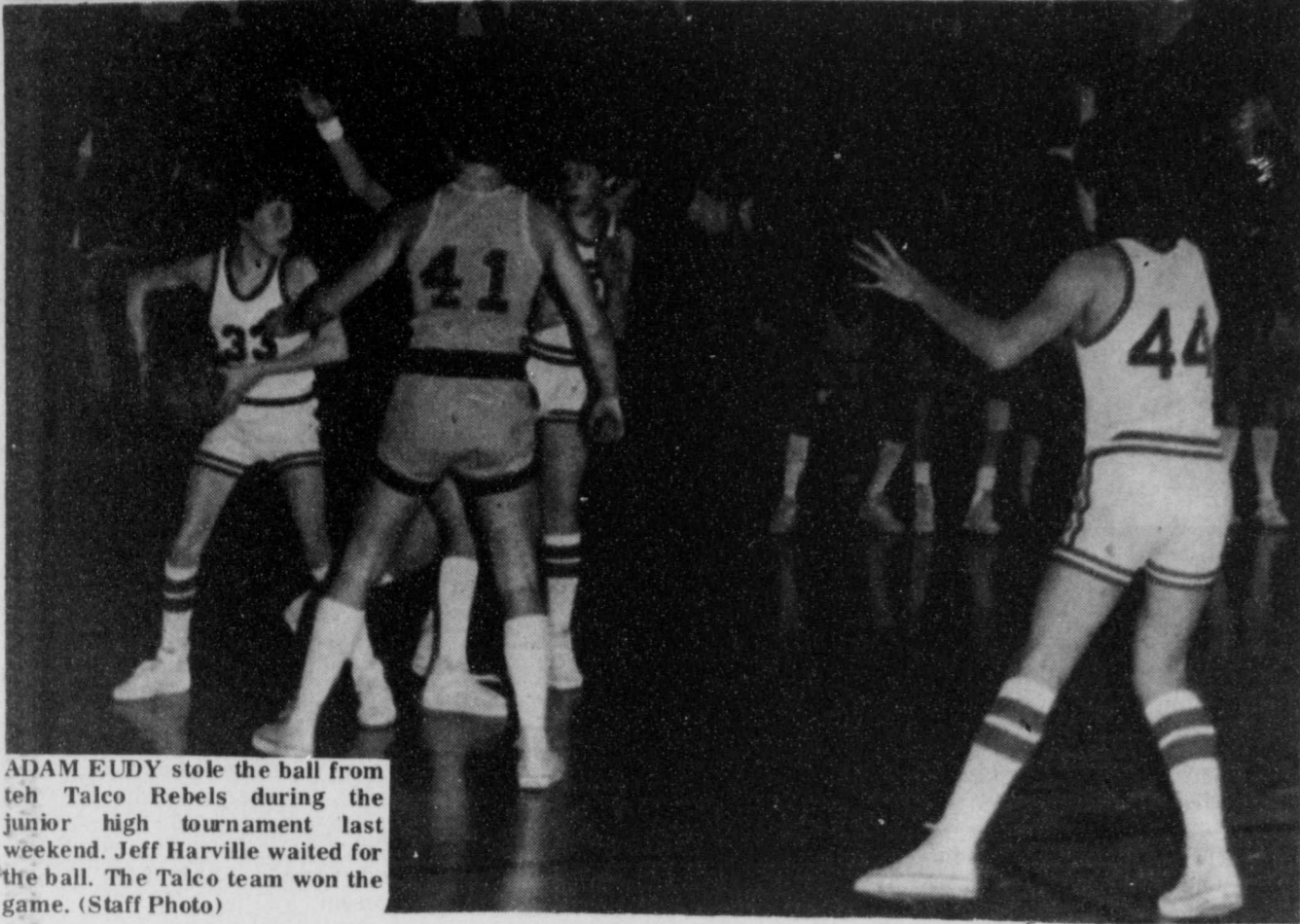

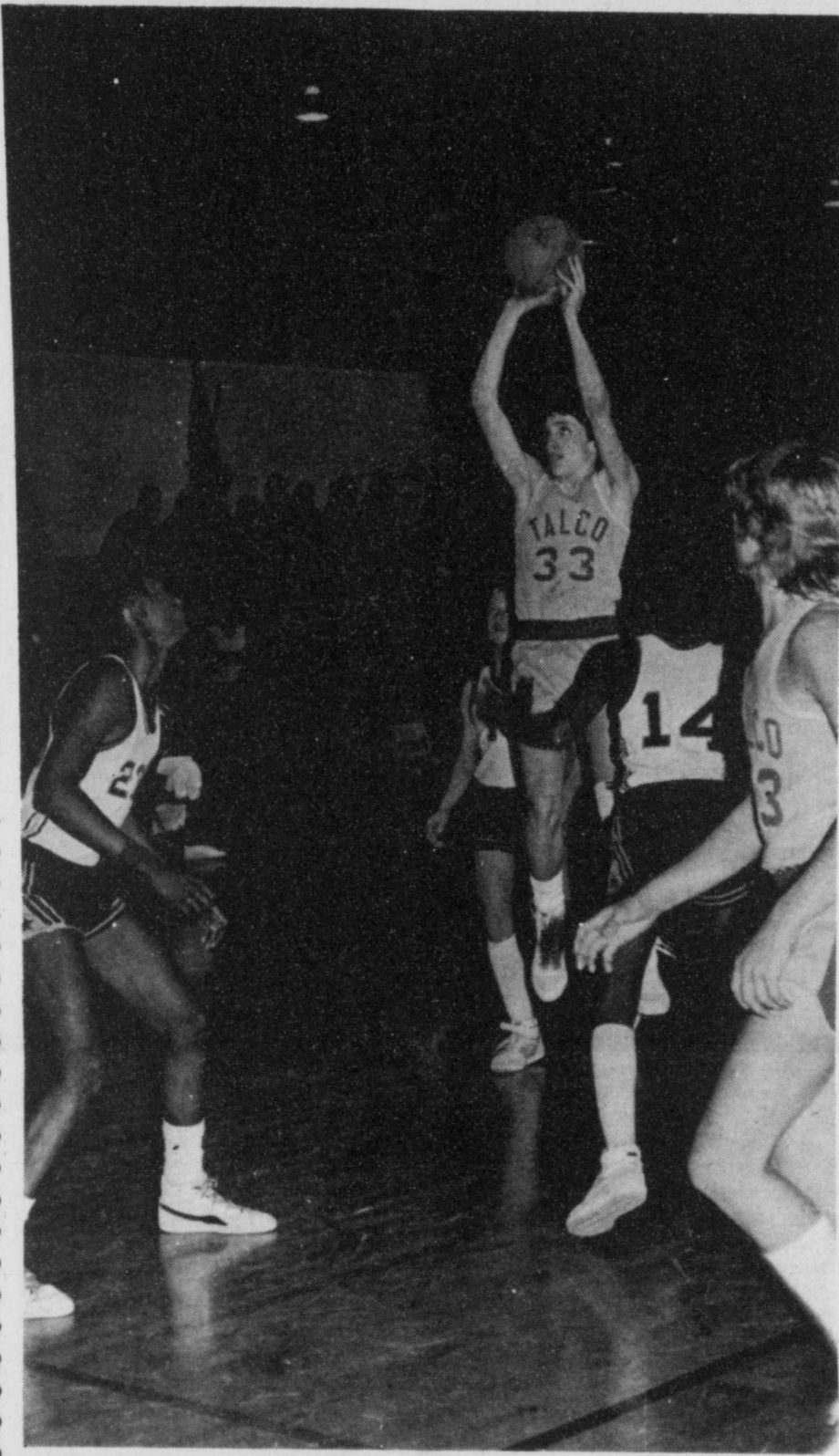
