
Madge C. Rodgers Dies At Age 85



Oleum Incorporated was merged into Diamond Shamrock Corporation and Pirtle became selfin the oil and gas business and ranching. While living in Longview for 25 years, Pirtle maintained a home in Johntown and returned every weekend to live in the community and operate his cattle

Pirtle and his wife, Tommie Joy, are active members of the Johntown Missionary Baptist Church where he serves as music director, Sunday school teacher, treasurer and deacon. They have two children, a daughtger, Lana age 11, and a son, Clay, age 10.

He is active in the community and has served four years on the Talco-Bogata School Board, is president of the local baseball association, a past director of the Red River Valley Girl Scouts and has served on the Sulphur River Basin Planning Advisory Committee of the Ark-Tex Council of Governments. He is a director of the First National Bank of Deport.

In making his announcement as candidate for commissioner, Pirtle stated that he thinks he is the best qualified candidate to serve the people of Precinct 1. 



TO THE VOTERS OF RED RIVER COUNTY

After much thought and consideration, I have decided to seek re-election as County Judge of Red River County.

I feel that I have accomplished much for the good of the county in the three years that I have been County Judge. In December, 1982 the county was forced to borrow \$40,000 to meet county obligations. At the end of the budget year of 1985, the county had approximately \$900,000 on hand. This has been accomplished with two tax increases (one of which I voted against).


