

# Talco-Bogata Board Adopts Policies

The Talco-Bogata School Board held its regular meeting March 18 at Rivercrest. The board approved the minutes of the last meeting.

The following actions were taken by the board:

A school use policy was accepted as recommended with the exception of

political use. Political use would have to be in the form of a forum with other candidates present to discuss the issues.

They adopted the textbooks for the coming year.

They accepted the media contract with Region VIII Educational Service Center. They supply the school with

the film material used in the classroom.

The purchase of a school bus was approved.

The board announced the East Texas State University School Board Workshop April 22 in Commerce.

The board accepted the resignations of Nadine Caldwell and Danny

Buchanan to be effective at the end of the current school year. Mrs. Harold Cowley was employed as the new librarian for next year.

They adopted the 1986-87 school calendar.

Personnel contracts were renewed with the exception of three due to a reduction in force.

State funding to the school system dropped and will directly affect our school system.

The board paid the bills, approved budget changes, discussed the Chapter 1 program, requested more information on the roof problems on the Talco campus approved the cafeteria bills and report and tax of-

fice report and adjustments and cast their ballots for the Region VIII Board of Directors.

Transfer students into the school district will be discussed more at the next meeting.

The board didn't have enough information to grant the request of an ex-student for a diploma.

## Bogata Firemen Drill With Equipment

The Bogata Volunteer Fire Department saw a demonstration of rescue tools presented by James Vaughn and Paul Bryant and assistants, from the Clarksville Fire Department.

The van and equipment used as the county rescue unit consists of a generator for lights and a hydraulic power plant to operate tools.

The rescue cutter weighs 31 pounds and has nine tons of cutting force. The spreader weighs 44 pounds with six

tons of power.

The equipment was purchased for the county from donations and various fund raisers.

James Vaughn stated that it was important for the county fire departments to be familiar with the equipment since the rescue unit is operated by volunteers and three or four men are needed to operate the equipment properly. The unit is available 24 hours a day.

The rescue unit is made up of three teams, consisting of eight men. Because it is made up of volunteers, sometimes an entire team might not be available, and the fire departments are needed as back up.

Fire Chief Berney Huddleston thanked the team for the demonstration and extended a special thanks to Bogata Paint and Body Shop, which donated a car and pickup to be used during the training session.

A special emphasis will be on each evening service and a covered dish luncheon in the Fellowship Hall April 6 at noon.

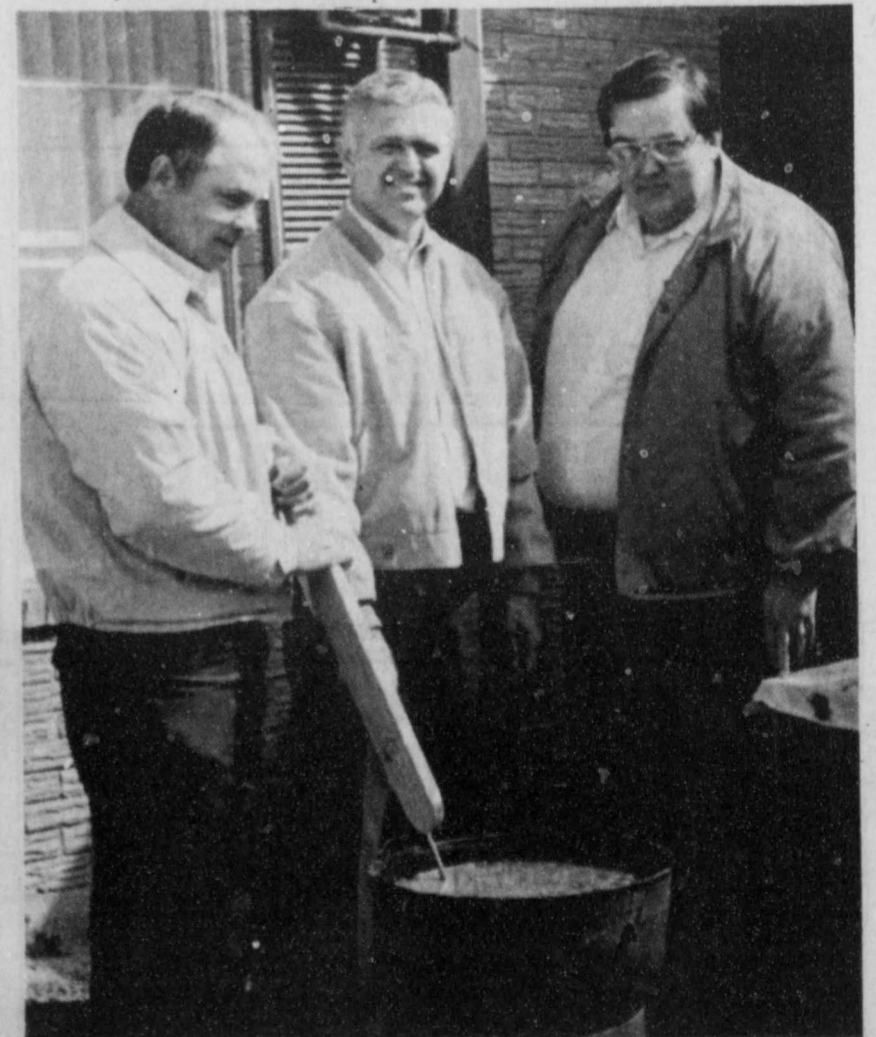

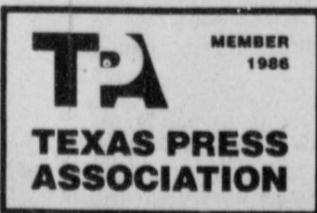

received special training in human relations.

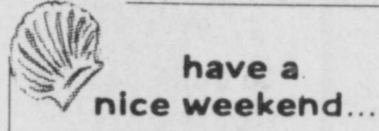
In addition, airmen who complete basic training earn credits toward an associate degree through the Community College of the Air Force.

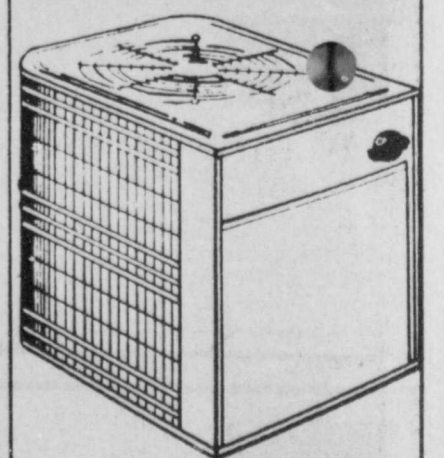
