## Search Made For Possible Suicide

Volunteers from area fire departments, the Red River County Sheriff's Department and other concerned citizens gathered in the Lone Star community to search for Clifton Cooper, a possible suicide victim, Friday evening through Saturday, May 8 and 9.

Cooper, a resident of Grand Esther Cooper in Lone Star. According to the County Sheriff's report, a

note indicating possible suicide was written by Cooper and found by his mother. The Sheriff's Department was contacted and a search of the wooded area behind the Cooper home began. The official search for Cooper has stopped. The County Sheriff's Department received a report that Cooper was seen in the Lone Star community Sunday afternoon, but they have been unable to verify the report.
