**Pesek Revokes Probation On Hurt, Polk**

On Monday, June 15, District Judge Leon Pesek of Texarkana set aside the security fraud probation of Boyd Lane Hurt, age 37, of Clarksville for thefts committed after Hurt was placed on probation and sentenced Hurt to eight years in prison.

Pesek revoked the forgery conviction of Robert Wayne Polk, age 32, of Dallas for failing to report to the Probation Officer and sentenced him to five years in prison.

Pesek sentenced Obie Earl Tut, age 32, of the DeKalb area, to ten years probation for attempted aggravated sexual assault of a Red River County woman on August 9, 1986.

Wing Ranch To Retire K-Bob On Opening Night Of Rodeo

Thursday, June 25 will officially mark the beginning of the 1987 version of the Bogata Frontier Days and Rodeo, held nightly at 8:30 p.m. at the Bogata Rodeo Arena. But this day will also mark the end for something that has given years of action and excitement to rodeo spectators, and plenty of aches and pain to many bull riders.

Thursday, June 25, marks the official retirement of the famous bull, No. 4, K-Bob, of the Wing Rodeo Company of Bogata.

At the ripe age of 15, K-Bob will receive his just reward, being turned out to pasture and not being subjected to any more diesel smoke and chute gates.

K-Bob, who was firebranded -K at an early age, was purchased by the Wing Rodeo Company in 1975. He was not singled out at the time of purchase, as he came with some 72 head of hopefuls from Son Light of Wills Point, TX. "We sort of hand-picked him after we'd had him a while at the ranch," said Jerald Smith, owner of the Wing Rodeo Company. "When we would pen the bulls, we'd always have to make another trip back to the pasture for him. He was so small that he could hide in the watergrass and we'd miss him every time." Little though he was as a three-year old, K-Bob made up for it in "wild". He was erratic in every way possible, never did the same thing twice, and was really not doing well as a potential bucking bull. So, as all those bulls who don't make the grade at the ranch, K-Bob went to the sale in the fall of 1975.

But somehow the little red, droop-horned bull found his way back to the ranch in 1976, through another sale, and he must have decided that was where he wanted to be, because his whole attitude had changed and he began showing real promise as a future champion.

"We did everything with him that we could," Smith related. "We bucked him, we even sent him to Huntsville (Prison Rodeo) and used him

for Money The Hard Way. After the prison rodeo was over we sent him to James Neighbors in Arkansas for him to use and that's where he slowed down long enough to find out how he wanted to buck."

Since then, it's just a matter of record, as K-Bob has proven himself over and over again that he is indeed a champion. He has been featured at every major rodeo in the southwest and was even featured at the Houston Astrodome as the wildest wreck in the bull riding. From the first time K-Bob went on the pro circuit to Houston, San Angelo, San Antonio, Denver and etc., he has never been qualified on. He has been seen many times on national television, from the Astrodome to the Professional Team Rodeo games which were held across the southwest and won the K-Bob Challenge, where a bounty was placed on him at every rodeo, and K-Bob won it two years in a row.

"We don't have a shelf in our house that doesn't have at least one award that he (K-Bob) won," Smith said. And awards he has won, he is the holder of the Bucking Bull of the Finals in the Central Rodeo Association and has received numerous awards from the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association, being the 1981 and 1982 Bucking Bull of the Year and the 1982 Bucking Bull of the Finals.

The tremendous popularity of this little bull made him so easy to promote that you didn't have to say anything else about a specific rodeo, other than answer the first question of "Will K-Bob be here?"

In his adult life, we at the Wing Rodeo Company, can remember him being qualified on four times, with 40 to 60 outs a year. He was ridden by Gary Hiner at Paris, TX in 1981; David Wesson at Shawnee, OK in 1983; Steve Gann at Durant, OK in 1983; and Damon Holmes at Tyler in 1984. They all won firsts on him and they all agreed they were really glad to hear the whistle.

Rod Breech, former bull riding and saddle bronc riding champion from Erie, KS related, "I had drawn him

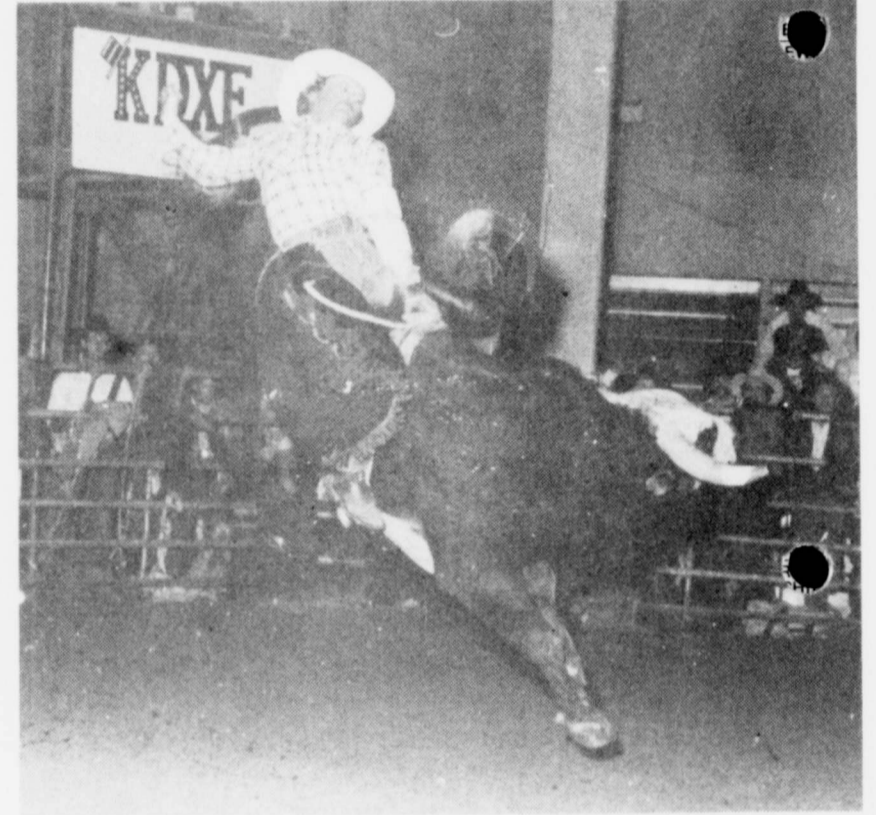
in competition and this guy asked me what strategy I intended to use to try and ride him. I told him I didn't know of anything I could do on a bull upside down!" Junior Gullo of Oklahoma City, OK the 1983 CRRA Bull Riding Rookie of the Year said of K-Bob, "I had him twice. I took advice from Steve Gann before I got on. He was really good the first time, but he hit me in the face when he rolled and knocked me off. I had him the second time at Mt. Pleasant, TX in 1986 and basically tried the same thing and rode him to the whistle. He threw me off both times, and he made me like it!"

Thursday night at the rodeo will be the last time K-Bob will be loaded into a bucking chute, though he won't be in the draw for competition. He's earned his keep and deserves his reward.

"He's the star of our outfit", Smith concluded, "and the best bull we've ever owned."

The moment may be a little sad for those of us who have been so close to the little bull for so many years, but somehow I have a feeling that K-Bob's star will shine for many more years, long after the arena lights have been dimmed and the people have gone home.

The first 100 children with a paid ticket coming to the Bogata rodeo on Thursday night will receive a free picture of K-Bob and will have the opportunity to have it autographed by David Wesson of Delaware, OK, the 1985-86 Bull Riding Champion and the 1986 All Around Champion of the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association and one of four men to qualify on him and by Bobby Delvecchio, world champion bull rider from the Bronx, NY.



K-BOB, famous bull of the Wing Rodeo Company of Bogata, will be retired in a special ceremony during the opening performance of the Bogata Rodeo on Thursday, June



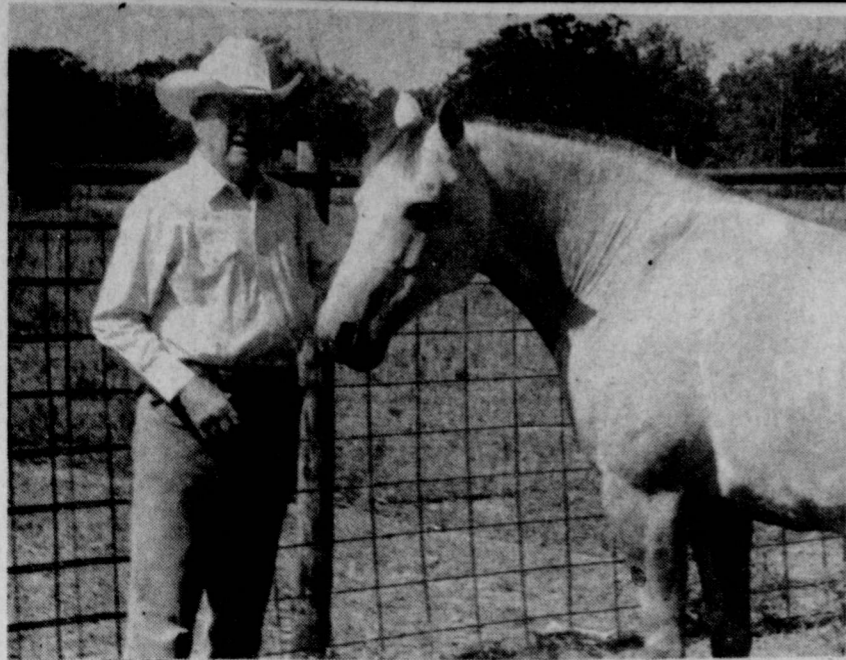

### Steve Biggerstaff, Involved With Rodeo Since The Beginning

Although he's been retired for several years now, Steve Biggerstaff, a cowboy from way back when, still gets the urge to ride when the rodeo comes to town. And with the Bogata Rodeo getting underway, Steve feels an even greater yen to be "back in the saddle" because his connection with the Bogata Rodeo goes back to its very beginning.

Steve recalls that in the late '40's, he had started building a rodeo arena in the Hagansport area. Several men from Bogata including Peck Hudson, Red Hudson, William Rozell, Alvin Wood and Lewis Clark came to him and offered to buy all the materials being used for that arena and wanted to hire him to build an arena at Bogata. Steve agreed, and before long the Bogata Rodeo Arena was built. Lumber for the chutes was bought from Lee Roach and sons, M.E. and Murl. They had a sawmill in the Hagansport area at that time, and cut the timber from land near Sulphur River. Steve was one of the first pickup men to work the Bogata rodeos.

Steve's cowboy days date back to his youth when he rode bareback horses, bulls, saddle broncs and anything else that could be ridden at Sulphur Bluff, Hagansport, Kinseng, Cunningham, Minter, Charleston, Bogata, Talco, Sugar Hill, Mt. Vernon, Mt. Pleasant or wherever there was a rodeo. While bull riding in 1932, a bull hit Steve with his head, breaking his cheekbone and knocking out several teeth.

In 1937, he went to Pierce Ranch, Ltd. in Bay City where he hired out to break horses for \$4.00 a head. The contract read that he must break 12 head before he was paid. In 1945 he returned to Franklin County and worked on the J.B. Ranch for Eric Bagwell of Sulphur Springs. In 1951, while on vacation, Steve visited Pierce Ranch, Ltd. and was hired by the manager, Sam T. Cutbirth, as foreman of Cow Camp at the Ranch headquarters. Pierce Ranch was founded in the early 1800's by A.H. "Shanghai" Pierce, one of the most colorful cattlemen in early Texas history. The ranch consisted of over 80,000 acres at the time Steve was hired, four different ranches in Wharton and Matagorda County. In 1956 the Pierce Ranch was divided among living granddaughters and one of them, Lacy Armour, personally hired Steve while the division was pending. He was the only employee personally asked by Mrs. Armour to remain with the Armour division. IN 1961, he

became cattle supervisor and remained so until he retired in 1978 and returned to Franklin County. At Mrs. Armour's death, a thank you card from her son to Steve stated that "you were Lacy's favorite foreman", a compliment that is still dear to Steve's heart.

Several Bogata men worked for Steve on the Pierce Ranch. Some of those were J.C. Smith, Pete Smith, Jerald Smith, Don Smith, Doyle Brooks, Herschal Brooks, Dolar Mankins, Cecil Patton, C.R. Williams, James Dickey and Pete Belcher. Steve says he was offered the chance to go back to work at the Pierce Ranch just a short time ago, but he turned it down. "In some ways I'd like to go back," he says, "but I know things wouldn't be quite the same now."

Steve now spends much of his time doing saddle work and still does a little "wheeling and dealing" in the horse business. When asked if he thought the rodeos have changed much through the years, Steve replied, "Yep, they sure have...they've changed a lot. Seems like the performances aren't as tough as they used to be. However," he added, "Jerald Smith has some good performances like the old days."

Steve and his wife, Helen, have a son, Bill Biggerstaff, and a daughter, Sue Street. Bill and his wife, Jean, have two sons, Billy Jack and Mark. Bill took Steve's place at the Pierce Ranch when he retired. Their daughter, Sue and husband, Artie, have two sons, Jim and Jody. She is the rural carrier for the Talco post office and they live in Franklin County.

Steve Biggerstaff's bronc riding days may be all in the past, but he's still one hundred percent cowboy at heart and is planning to be "sittin' tall in the saddle" during the Grand Entry of the Bogata Rodeo.

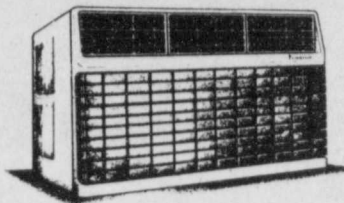
