In spite of the high figures against the proposed reservoir in the Bogata area, the majority prevailed and the issues were passed.

The reservoir has been a very controversial subject for some time, and both sides had worked hard to get the vote out and see that their "side"

It is to be hoped that now that the democratic process is finished, people can leave behind any hard feelings that resulted from the election campaign and continue to work together on other issues to make the county a better place to work and live.


