## Manhunt Searches For Burglary Suspect Three Arrested, One Still At Large

Three men are under arrest, while one remained the object of a massive manhunt in Red River County near Bogata Wednesday morning, in what appears to be related incidents that are part of a larger theft ring.

The series of events began in Hopkins county when two Mexican men, Jose Antonio Delgado and Armando Vallejo Canijalez, were spotted burglarizing a house near Winnsboro.

Law enforcement officials chased the van the pair was in into Franklin County, where the vehicle was wrecked and the fugitives fled on foot. A massive manhunt involving between 50 and 75 law enforcement officials began at 10 a.m. that morning and didn't conclude until the TDC dogs were brought in at approximately 8:00 p.m. Within 30 minutes the two suspects were apprehended.

According to reports from Hopkins County, the two suspects told O.C. Rupe, with the Criminal Investigation Division of Hopkins County, that they had been in the country for about three weeks and were recruited by a man in downtown Dallas to commit burglaries in a 100 mile radius of Dallas. The van they were driving was reported stolen in Ft. Worth. The two men were arraigned on Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle and Burglary of A Habitation and returned from Franklin County to Sulphur Springs in Hopkins County.

The second incident began after two more Mexican men burglarized a house belonging to Dale Mills of Sulphur Bluff.

A Dallas County Deputy, B. W. Little, spotted the van the pair was driving as it turned north off of Hwy. 271 in Bogata onto Hwy. 37 N. Little was en route to Red River County Jail to pick up a prisoner there. He began a pursuit of the van, which turned off on a gravel road north of the Fulbright cutoff. The road, which turns east, is just past what was for years Massey's BBQ. The van wrecked on a curve a short distance down the road, and the officer apprehended one suspect then. Rafael Delgado, the suspect in custody, is believed to be a brother to the Delgado arrested the day before in Franklin County. A console Television and a pulsar watch was found in the van.

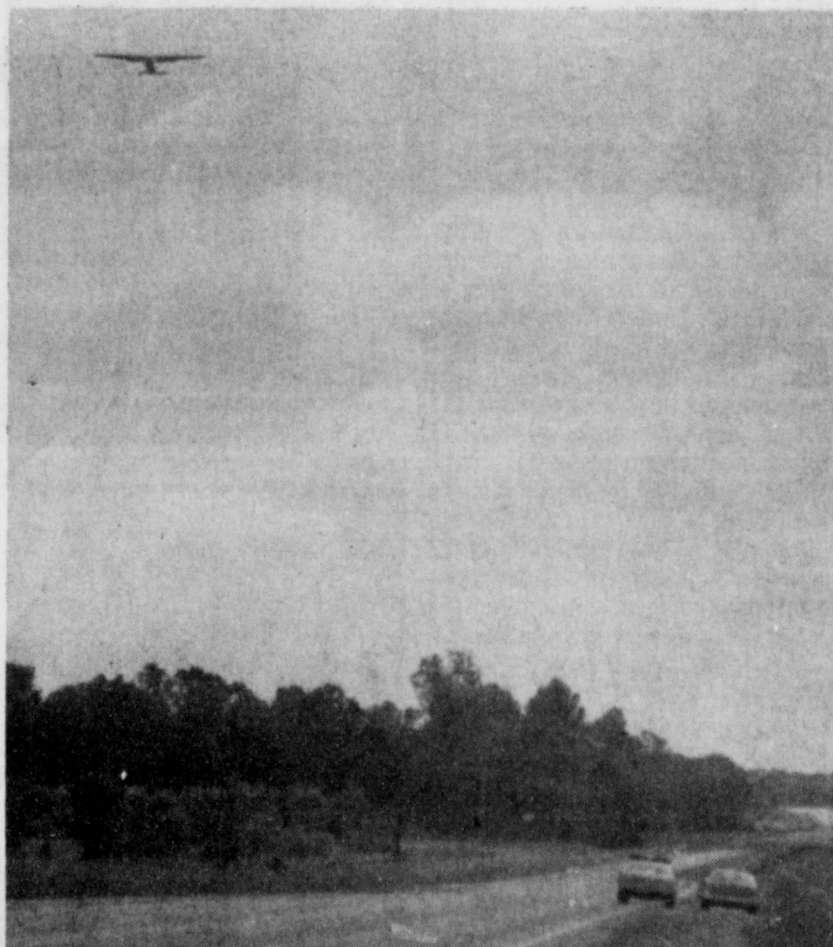
The other suspect fled into dense brush and woods on foot. At about 9:30 Tuesday morning the call went out and the Red River County search was launched.

Throughout a hot, humid day search teams attempted to seal off a perimeter and searched from Hwy. 37 all the way to FM 909 in the Cuthand Area. Over 100 officers and volunteers have been involved in the search.

Volunteers on horseback, air search and TDC dogs have all been utilized in the chase.

Sometime during the night the suspect apparently stole a truck in the Cuthand area from Alvin Baker. The vehicle was found on FM 909 wrecked Wednesday morning.

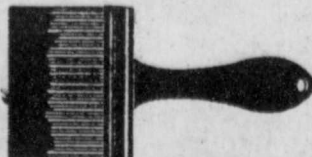
At press time, in spite of heavy rains law enforcement and volunteers were still looking for the suspect.

**Locals On PJC Honor Lists**

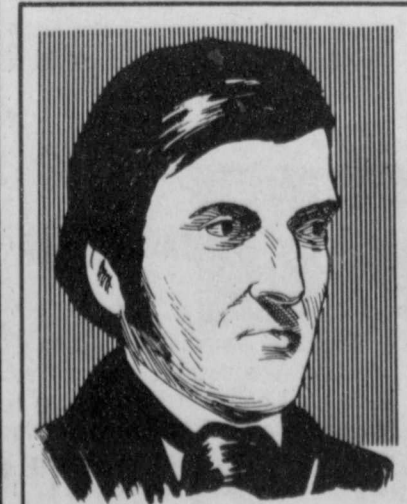
The president's and vice-president's honors lists for academic achievement during the spring semester at Paris Junior College have been announced by Mary Griffith, vice-president for instructional affairs.

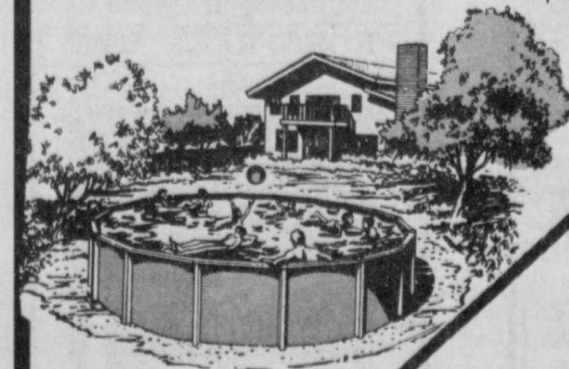

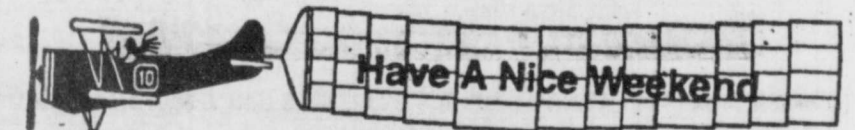
## Hiram Kennedy-Sarah Jane Deweese Reunion Scheduled

Registration will begin at 6 p.m. Friday, June 16 at the Holiday Inn in Paris with a "Meet Your Kin" session to share records and memorabilia. On Saturday, June 17, descendants and friends will meet at Red River Valley Fair Assoc. Bldg. at fairgrounds in Paris at 11 a.m. with each family bringing a picnic lunch. Drinks will be furnished. A short business meeting will follow. An optional tour to Cunningham and Halesboro cemeteries will be conducted.

Hiram T. Kennedy, born May 6, 1811 in Cumberland County, Kentucky was orphaned at an early age and little is known about him until about 1833 when he married Sarah Jane Deweese born December 2, 1813 to Jesse Deweese and Mary "Polly" Sowder. The couple moved to Butler County, Kentucky before 1840. Five children were born in Kentucky: Lucinda Elizabeth born 1835, married Madison Shepherd; Person Miller, born 1837, married Louisa Wilcox; Jim Newton, born 1839, married Eliza Fields; William born 1840, died in Civil War unmarried; Benjamin Franklin, born 1845 mar-

ried Mary Jane Wilcox. This pioneer to the Republic of Texas in mid-1840's soon established himself in Harrison County, Texas as a landowner, Justice of the Peace and a minister of the gospel of the Disciples of Christ. Four more children were born in Texas: Sarah Jane, born 1847, married (1) Joseph Owens, (2) Alonzo Ditto; Mary Ellen, born 1850 married Vince Loffin; Cassandra, born 1853, married James Howard Bell; George Washington, born 1856, married Mary David Decker. In 1857, Hiram purchased land in Lamar County, Texas and moved his family there. The land is registered in the State Land Office as the Hiram Kennedy Headright Survey. He lived there until his death September 8, 1878. He and Sarah Jane are buried in nearby Halesboro Cemetery.

When the conflict between the states began he was past the age for war service but on July 20, 1862, he enlisted in Company C, 29th Texas Calvary where he preached to his comrades on Sunday and made a good soldier during week days.

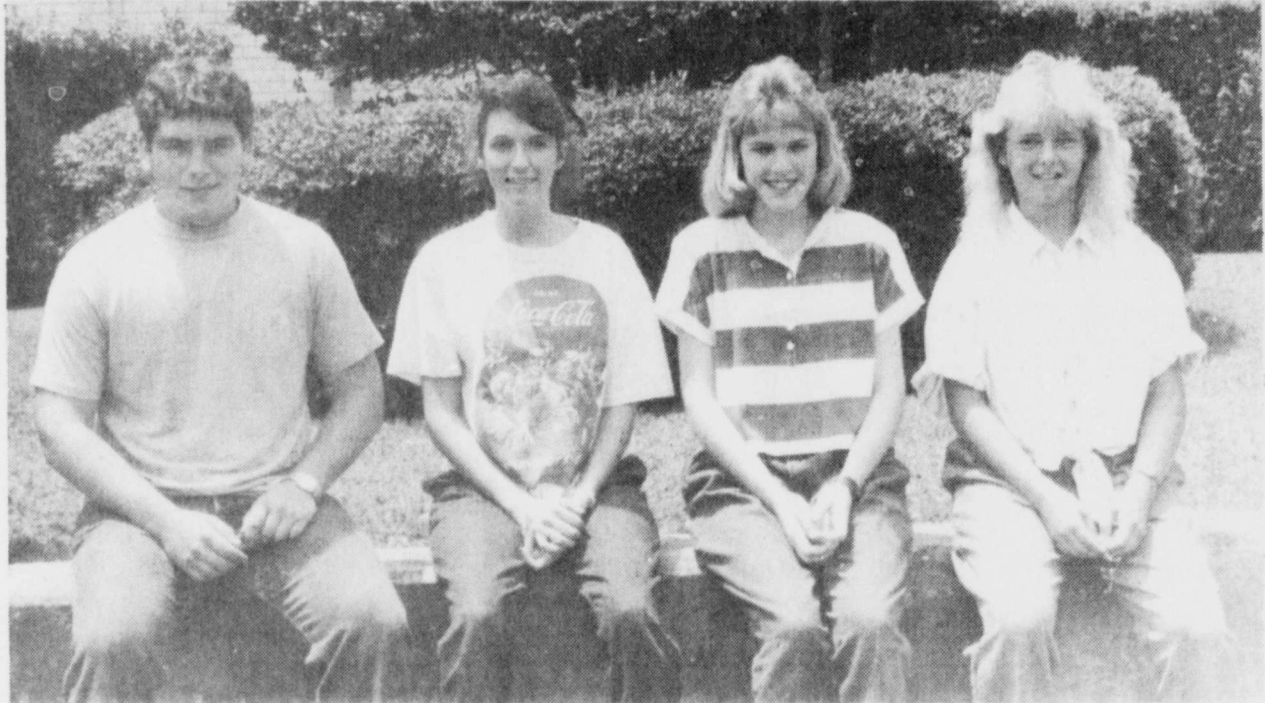

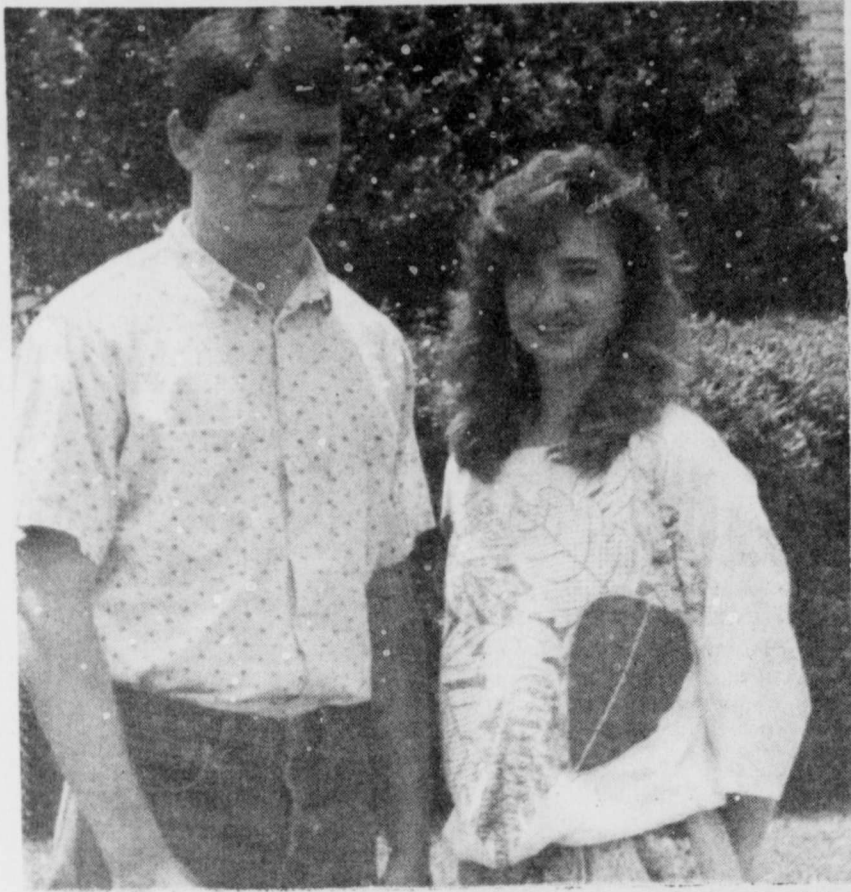

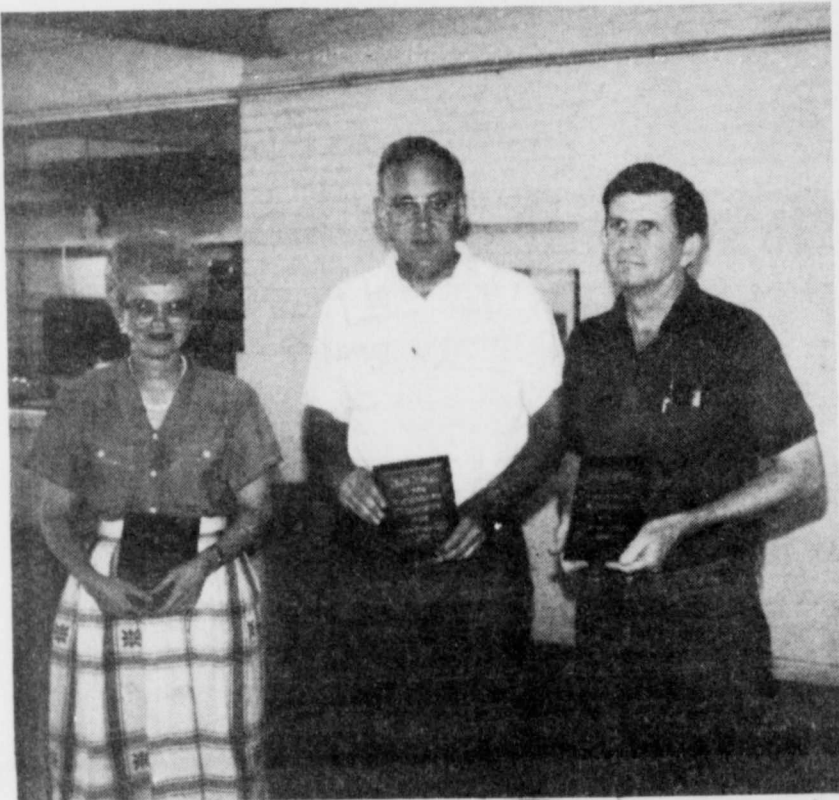
