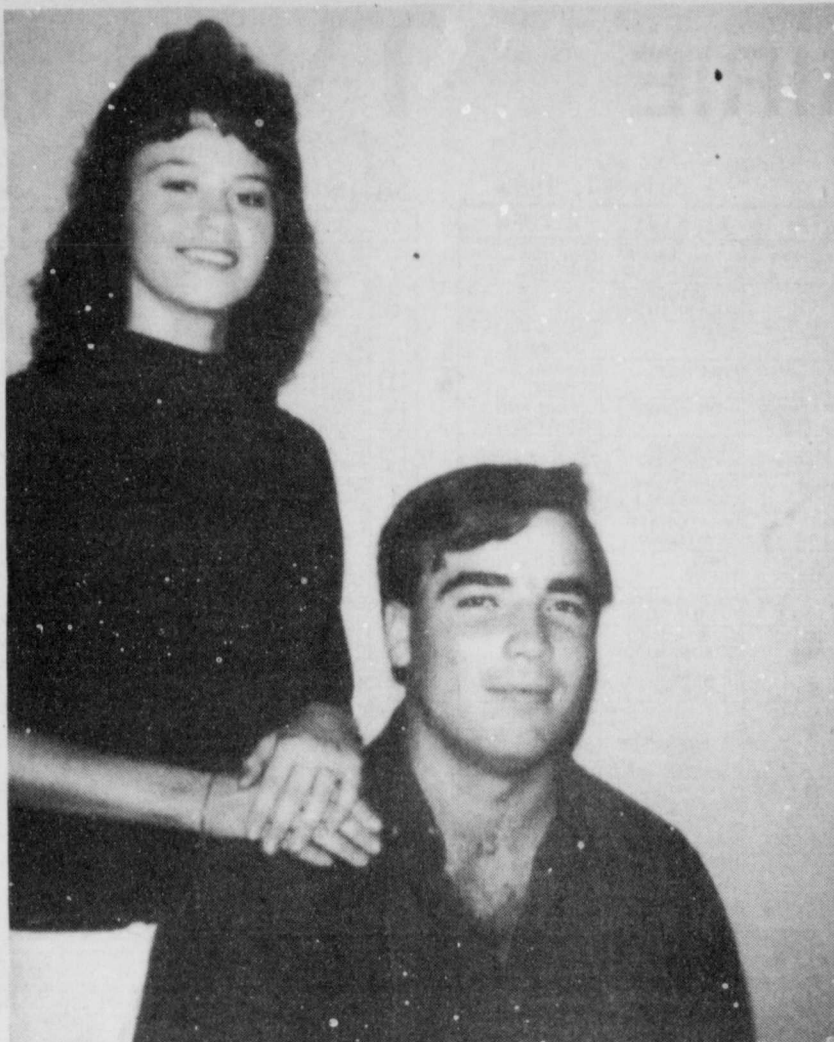

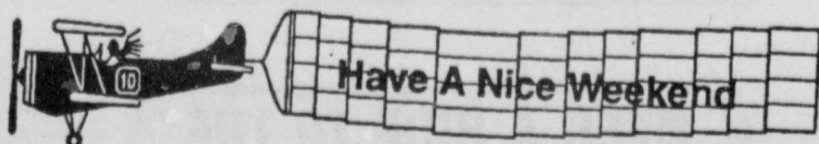
Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Allen were hosts to a catered barbeque meal with all the trimmings, including dessert and drinks.

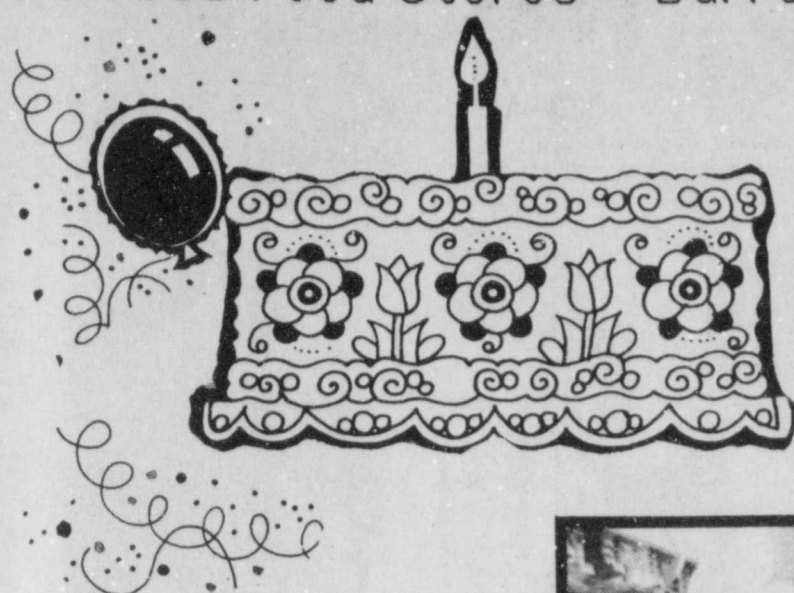

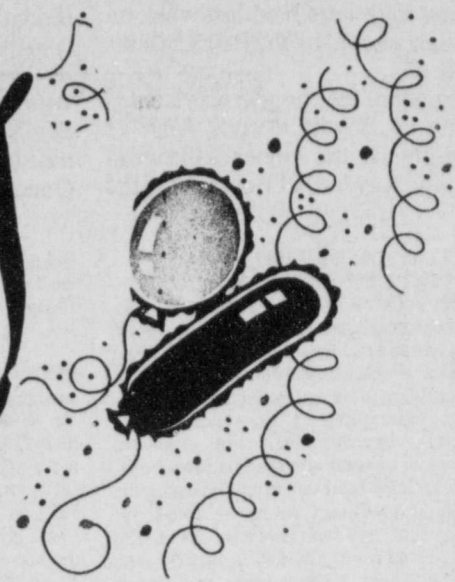

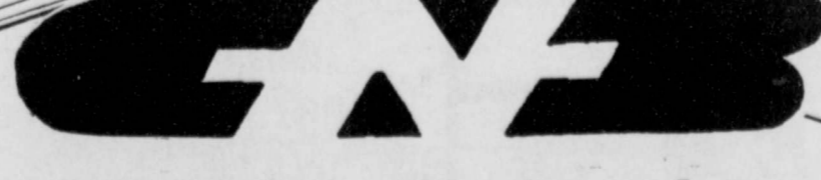

Emergency Farm Loan Applications Being Accepted

Applications for Emergency farm loans for losses caused by tornadoes, flooding and severe storms which began May 4, 1989 are being accepted at the Farmers Home Administration office in Clarksville, Frank B. Stroud said today.

Red River County is one of 29 in Texas recently named by Secretary of Agriculture Richard E. Lyng as eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the tornadoes, flooding and severe storms.

Stroud said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business or \$500,000, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 4.5%.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30% loss of production to be eligible for an FmHA Emergency Loan, Stroud said. Farm-

ers participating in the PIK or Federal Crop Insurance programs will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until February 15, 1990, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Stroud said.

FmHA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority interest.

The FmHA office in Clarksville is open from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

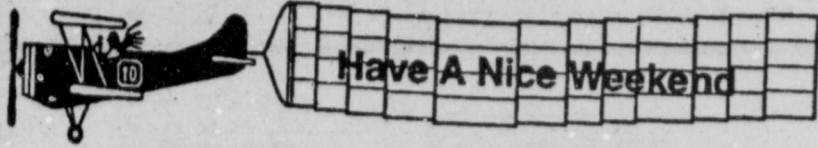

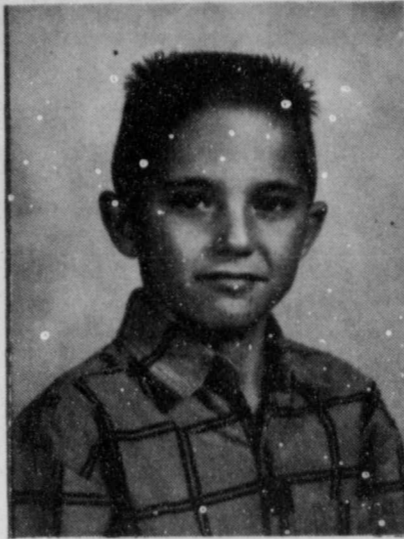
