Talco-Bogata Students Have Best Academic Test Scores In Area

Students of Talco-Bogata I.S.D. schools have the best academic test scores in the area, and among the best in Texas.

U.S. President George Bush has declared that American schools must improve if our country is to stay competitive. Talco-Bogata schools are one jump ahead of him, and aiming to stay that way.

In "TEAMS tests" taken by students of this year's twelfth and ninth grades, Rivercrest students scored better than students at any other school in this area, and among the very highest in Texas. TEAMS tests are "Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills" examinations to determine whether Texas schools are meeting the academic goals sought by the state legislature.

One hundred percent of this year's twelfth graders met the state's standards in mathematics and 97% met standards in language arts.

This year's ninth graders also excelled: 88% met standards in mathematics, 91% met standards in reading, and 89% passed the writing tests.

Also taking TEAMS tests last spring were students then in the first, third, fifth and seventh grades at Talco and Bogata, they also excelled in all areas. The following table shows

Talco elementary students' performance improved by 38% over the previous year, with 92% of regular students passing. Bogata elementary students improved slightly, to 83.8%.

At all levels, the district's students outperformed those in every other school and school district in the area, even those in affluent districts with

larger tax bases. Speaking of the two high school classes tested, Rivercrest Principal Dr. James Smith said the district's performance reflected the combined efforts of students and parents, teachers and administrators. "Even in the best schools, you only get results like ours when students are motivated to succeed and are encouraged by their parents."

Superintendent Harold Cowley agrees, emphasizing the role of skilled and highly motivated faculty members. "If the faculty is excited about the effort to improve, students and parents share in the excitement," he says.

"Our community supports academics," Cowley feels. "Whoever heard of a pep rally in support of entrants in UIL competition? Last year we had one, just as enthusiastic as any sports pep rally you ever saw."

Cowley and Smith note that one Rivercrest faculty member, math teacher Larann Denison, had been selected by the state to help design the TEAMS mathematics test to be used statewide next year. "Her well-deserved selection is an honor to her and an honor to Rivercrest," says Smith.

Superintendent Cowley emphasizes that the district's results were not the result of a single burst of effort, but reflect the cumulative results of several years' work. Noting that in future years high school students will also be tested in science and social science, Cowley recognizes that competition will get tougher as schools throughout Texas strive to meet national goals.

"We are ready to compete," Cowley says. "Our faculties are strong and well-motivated. We now have good library services, first-rate science laboratories, and a wealth of learning materials."

Council Approves 911 Number

The Bogata City Council approved the 911 emergency system during the regular meeting held Monday night, September 11.

In other business, Council discussed boiler insurance with Texas Municipal League which would cover accidental breakdown on machinery at the sewer plant and water wells. Cost of the insurance is \$180 per year

with a \$2,500 deductible. Motion was made and approved to table the item until the next meeting.

The budget for the next fiscal year was adopted and council set the tax rate at .131/\$100 evaluation. This is an increase of .0351/\$100 evaluation over last year.

Council discussed the purchase of a truck with money in CD. No action

was taken and prices of 4-speed manual transmission, 1/2 ton trucks are to be presented at the next meeting.

The City Judge reported: three failure to show proof of liability insurance; one ran stop sign; two speeding; one exhibit of acceleration; one barking dog complaint; and one disorderly conduct.

"We Have A Right To Brag A Little"

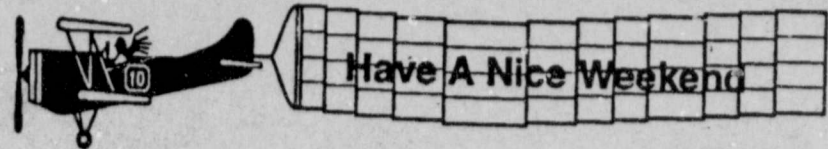
On the outskirts of Paris they have billboards praising local schools' championship sports teams of recent years. At Mt. Vernon, the praise is for UIL successes.

Rebels Scare Purple Tigers

"Up the field, down the field, take the ball and score." The cheerleaders' exhortation from the sidelines was executed without reservation by the players on the Rebel Stadium turf last week.

The result was an entertaining donnybrook in which the decidedly underdog Rivercrest Rebels forgot they were playing one of the area's offensive powerhouses, the Mt. Vernon Purple Tigers. Before falling 41-21 behind two Purple Tig touchdowns in the final six minutes. The ground game of the Purple Tigers proved too potent for the outmanned Rebel defense, as the Purple Tigers garnered 408 yards overland. The Tiger tandem of Noel Dunlap and Steve Gadlin combined for more than 300 yards, while Junio Tyler Banister added another 70 yards.

But the fact that the Rivercrest rebounded in the second half, after falling behind 21-0 midway in the third period, impressed Rebel mentor Terry Giddens. "We wanted to come through this game on a positive note," said Giddens. "I am well satisfied with the performance of the Rebels, as they faced a very good Mt. Vernon squad, one which will probably win their district," he continued, "of course, we would like to have won the contest, but the size and talent of Mt. Vernon was no match for our small squad." The coach concluded his evaluation by saying "We are on a roll now, and I am confident we are going to fare well the remainder of the year."

The adjustments made by Rebel coaching staff enabled the offense to get on track in the third period. "We began to cross our backs," said Giddens. Indeed, the Rebel backfield found gaping holes created by down linemen Jesse Woods, Chad Ingram, Kevin Binion, Russell Ward, Stacy Horton and Joey Webb.

The Rebels gained only 120 yards on the ground, but made most of that yardage in the second half. Marcus Savage ran for a total of 63 yards, while Tidwell added 55. Down 21-0, Clint Tidwell scored on a 33-yard sprint midway in the third quarter. Sophomore Josh Abshier then gave the Rebels their first extra point of the season and secured himself a new position as place kicker as he booted the first of three points-after-touchdowns for the Rebels.

With only 50 seconds elapsed in the fourth quarter, the Rebels made it interesting as they drove nearly 60 yards for a score that brought them within a touchdown of the perhaps overconfident Tigers. Quarterback

Shane Beers who continues to show improvement each week at the slot, scored from two yards out.

The Tigers responded with an eight play, 68-yard drive capped by Banister's 19-yard run. James Street added the point after, his fourth of the night to make the score 28-14 at the 6:39 mark.

The next 30 seconds of play provided plenty of excitement. On the second play, Beers found Tidwell on a short pass in the flat, which Tidwell went low to scoop. Appearing to be stopped by the swarming Tiger defense, Tidwell eluded the pursers and found his way into the Tiger endzone to complete the Rebel scoring for the night. The play covered 67 yards. Score was now 28-21.

After the Rebel kick off, Gadlin ran a sweep around right end, good for 71 yards to rebuild the Tiger advantage to 14 points. The big play parade continued as wingback Jeremy Abshier tried to repeat his touchdown-producing kickoff return from last year's contest by going 60 yards to the Tiger 10-yard line. However, the Rebels could not capitalize on the play as Beers suffered his second interception of the night from Tiger safety Monty Holloway to end the Rebel rebellion.

Beers passed for 84 yards on only three completions. He was sacked twice.

The Rebel defensive unit played an admirable game in spite of the score. Forced to play nearly the entire first half, the unit led by linemen Woods, Binion and Eric Cabell and supported by linebackers Joe Dellis and Beers and free safety Ronald Simmons, slowed the Tiger march in the second half.

"The Rebels deserve a lot of credit," commented Tiger Coach Wylie Rotten.

The Rebels will continue their homestead this week as they face the Maud Cardinals in their homecoming.

Hunter Safety Course Offered AT PJC

A hunter safety course will be offered next week through the continuing education department at Paris Junior College.

According to Robbie White, continuing education director, those persons successfully completing the course will receive certification which will allow them to hunt in Texas.

Failure to have proper certification while hunting may result in a Class C Parks & Wildlife code misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of between \$25 and \$500.

Effective Sept. 1, 1989, those born between September 2, 1971 and August 31, 1973, must have successfully completed the course in order to hunt in Texas. After September 1,

1990, those persons born between September 2, 1971 and August 31, 1974, are required to complete the course before hunting in Texas. Hunters with a birth date on or before September 1, 1971 are exempt.

The course will be conducted from 6:30 to 9:50 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, Sept. 25-27, for a fee of \$5. Instructor is Grady Dobbs, a certified instructor with the park service.





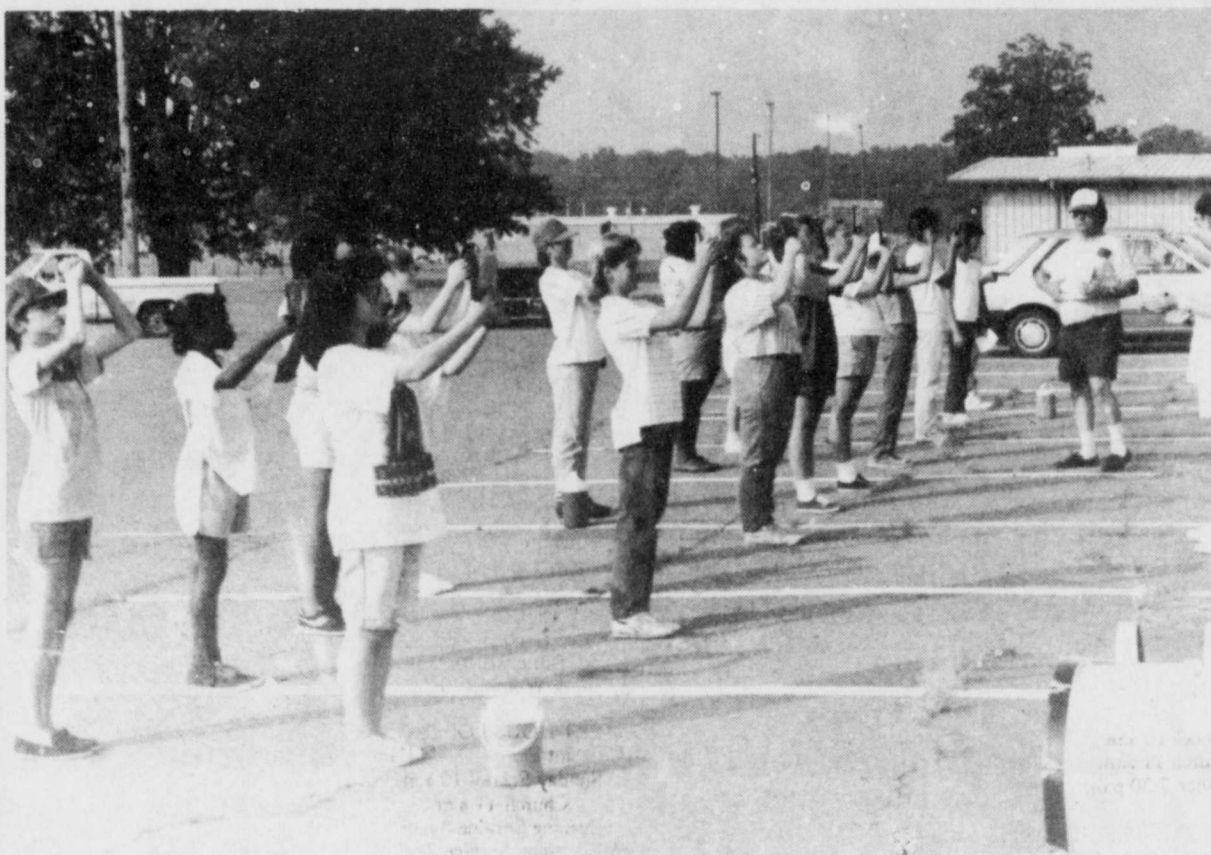

Water Board...Continued From Last Week

The cities of Annona, Avery, Bogata, Detroit and the 410 Water Supply Corp. receive water from other sources, and have told board members they have no need for water from Dimple Reservoir, Cole said.

The reservoir's initial customers probably would be the city of Clarksville and the Red River County Water Supply Corp., he said.

A feasibility study conducted late last year indicated that the city of Clarksville would use about 43 percent of the water from the reservoir, and the Red River County Water Supply Corp. would use about 20 percent of the water.

A proposal was presented to each jurisdiction asking them for a commitment to buy the designated amounts of water at undetermined prices.

Neither the city nor the corporation ever entered into an agreement with the water district, Cole said.

"We contacted them (Clarksville and the RRCWSC) about going in and then paying for a certain percentage of the water," Board member D.D. Edrington said. "We have not had anybody express interest in buying any water."

Jack Holt, RRCWSC general manager said he is "very disappointed" with the board's decision to call for its dissolution.

"Being a resident of Red River County, I think it would help the county," he said.

Holt said the water corporation currently gets its water from wells, Lamar County and Texarkana Water Utilities.

"One problem with Texarkana or Lamar County is that the pipelines are not large enough" to handle a large increase in customers, he said, adding the water lines may have to be widened in the future. "The cost of that may cost as much as a reservoir."

Holt said he was not surprised with the board's decision because "the

majority of the people on that board are dead set" against the reservoir. "The gist of the whole thing is they just don't want to pay taxes."

Cole said he is opposed to the tax because he doesn't think it's fair for everyone in the county to foot the bill.

"Not everybody in the county would have equal benefit for tax dollars," Cole said.

During a special meeting of the Clarksville City Council on August 29, council members appointed a three-member committee to negotiate with water district members to try to reach a compromise, Clarksville Mayor Gavin Watson said.

"We hope to open things up. We're in a little bit of a squeeze," Watson said, noting the county has been chosen as the site for a multimillion dollar pre-release prison.

The prison will cause a 20 percent increase in demand on city water and sewer lines, Watson said.

"We're putting a pretty good load on the system", Watson said. However, Langford Lake, one source of water for the city, is full and Watson is confident the city can handle it.

Watson said the committee was chosen at the request of a group of residents at the meeting. Another member to be appointed by the Red River County Water Supply Corp. has yet to be named.

"We could tell there was no communication (between the city and the water district board)," said J.P. Harvey, a member of the three-person committee appointed by the city.

Harvey said the committee is acting only as an intermediary between the two entities to keep communication lines open.

"I think everybody knows everybody needs the lake for the future," Harvey said, adding that the water board's decision disappointed him.

A tentative meeting has been set, but Cole said he is unsure an agreement could be reached.

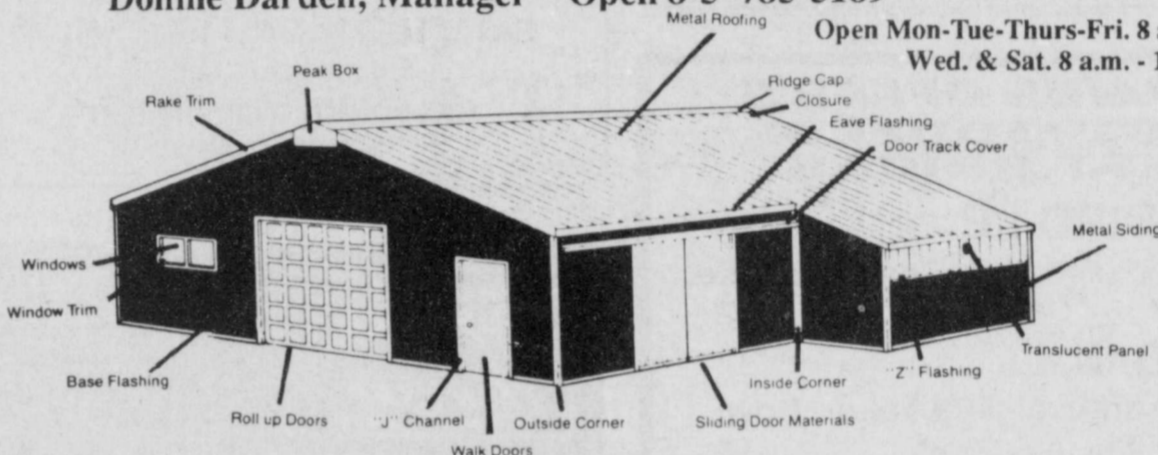

Because of all these things, we think this is a serious matter and that the community should be aware of and acknowledge the presence of vandalism that goes on in our town.

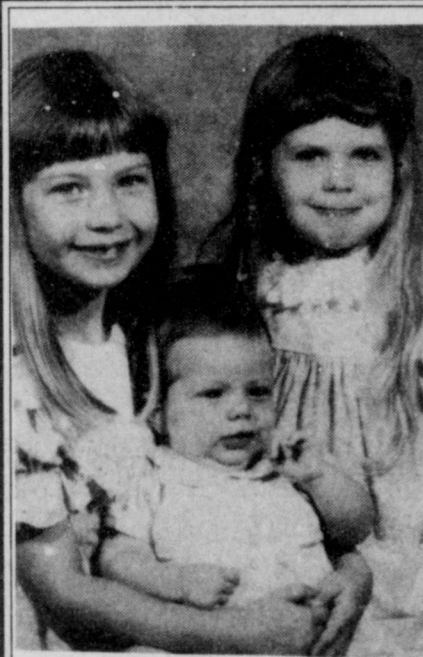
