It doesn't matter what you try ... but do try it. Mini-geological expeditions are fascinating, interesting, informative, and the weather is just right.

It may seem an odd sort of past time..but it's inexpensive, fun, and there really IS a lot to be learned about the past in those fossils.

Don't think I'm too crazy ... take a look at those rocks. I'll guarantee that more people will be interested than won't be.


Dies March 19
