A future Vice-president of the
United States studied history, mathematics and literature here for at least one term. John Nance Garner, born
near Detroit was sent near Detroit, was sent to Bogata at Captain William L. Rice.
Garner, Vice-president from 1933 to 1941, would probably have been elected President had not Franklin D.
Roosevelt decided to run for an unprecedented third term.
His school was a forty by sixty foot frame building on the site of today's Community Center. The building was
used for church services and oher used for church services and other
community activities, as well a sfor classes.
Young Garner was a high-spirited boy, intelligent but unruly. He gave
lasting offense to the family of Wil. lasting offense to the family of Wil-
liam P. Clatterbuck, donor of the schoolground, by "disrespectful" remarks to Clatterbuck's daughter. (Garner was later characterized by his politican enemies a sa "poker-
playing, whiskey-drinking, evil old man," and by hi admirers as a man of political principle and absolute integrity. Perhaps both were right.)

school taught by Jesse Cheek in the school taught by Jesse Cheek in the
1840's and another staffed by localr esidents during the Civil War period. The decline and eventual demise of the famous Mackenzie College south
of Clarksville left room for a number of Clarksville left room for a number
of schools in the area. of schools in the area.
Two other factors attractive to families without schools in their home communities. One was the fact that the Bogata precinct prompty took advantage of the "local
option" provisions of the Texas Constitution of 1876 to outlaw alcoholic beverages. Bogatans bragged
