State Comptroller Bob Bullock said
Friday that his office sent check totaling $\$ 83.2$ million in local sale tax rebates to cities and counties in Texas.
Bogata received $\$ 1,496.85$ for a
$2.15 \%$ increase while Clarksville received $\$ 12,311.85$ for a $9.16 \%$ decrease over last year's payment.
Detroit received no payment for this period. Pleasant received $\$ 86,730$.
Mt. for a $4.58 \%$ increase and Talco received $\$ 1,182.14$ for a $5.80 \%$ decrease from last year
This month's checks include taxes
collected on April sales and reported in May by businesses filing monthly tax returns.
Merchants collect the sales taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state
keeps its $6 \%$ share and each month sends cities and counties their portion of the sales tax.
