## Trash Pick-Up And Water Rates Must Be Increased

The City of Bogata, in regular meeting Monday night, took the necessary steps to raise trash pick-up rates and minimum water bills.

They are passing along increases that have been handed down to them by providers.

Mayor W.T. (Bill) Harbison said "We haven't had a rate increase in the four years I've served as Mayor, but the time has come."

The proposed rate for trash pick-

up will be \$4.00 plus tax. It is currently \$2.25 plus tax.

The proposed water rate will be \$8.00 for 2,000 gallons, while the current rate is \$6.00 for 2,000 gallons.

Minimum water bill is now \$16.42.

and the proposed minimum bill will be \$20.30.

These rates will be effective on the August 1, 1990 bills.

To compare Bogata's services to other area towns, these figures were released.

There were new rates adopted for trash and water, which will be effective August 1, 1990.

Judge Mildred Eudy reported acting on several chicken and dog complaints.

The meeting adjourned.

## Local Sales Tax Figures

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday that his office sent checks totaling \$83.3 million in local sales tax rebates to cities and counties in Texas.

Bogata received \$1,496.85 for a 2.15% increase while Clarksville received \$12,311.85 for a 9.16% decrease over last year's payment. Detroit received no payment for this period.

Mt. Pleasant received \$86,730.47 for a 4.58% increase and Talco received \$1,182.14 for a 5.80% decrease from last year.

This month's checks include taxes collected on April sales and reported in May by businesses filing monthly tax returns.

Merchants collect the sales taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state keeps its 6% share and each month sends cities and counties their portion of the sales tax.

## Eighty-Four Year Old Couple Continues Gardening Tradition

Clyde and Thelma Bankhead live in Cunningham in a small, pleasant house, deep shade sheltering their front porch.

Visitors during the summer months will frequently find the couple, both eighty-four years old, sitting in a porch swing under that shade.

But, even more often, the couple can be found in their beautiful vegetable garden, bending over rows of peas, cabbage, onions, beans and all the other garden "truck" that can be grown in this area.

This year they have tried something new. Thelma purchased a couple of climbing tomato vines. They filled an old tractor tire next to the house with decayed cotton burs, and their son, Clyde Elmer, built a wire frame for the tomatoes to climb on.

Then, they sat back to watch as the tomatoes began to grow. And grow. And then grow some more!

The vine is now over seven feet tall, and loaded with beautiful tomatoes, promising a full crop of the delicious red globes!

They bought the plants at market square, and have never tried them before.

Of course, their garden is still loaded with lovely tomato plants.

Mrs. Bankhead brought out a jar of her beet pickles, put up this season.

The deep, ruby tones of the pickles sparkled in the sunlight, and a little pride sparkled in her face too, as well it should!

They were in the process of making kraut from the spring cabbage.

They make it the "old-fashioned" way, letting it sit for nine days before canning.

"We're going to have to start slowing down on this gardening" they claim, but they do so with a hearty laugh.

Acknowledging that it isn't really the gardening that is the real work, but the canning, they still prefer home canned food.

The Bankheads went back to that pleasant, shady porch after the interview, taking a little time to rest before going on about their daily chores. Those chores are as age-old as civilization...hoeing, staking, feeding and tending those vegetables that make up such a healthy lifestyle.

A life time on those homegrown, home preserved foods may very well have had something to do with the couple's vigor and health at an age when many people are confined to a wheelchair!

It's a pleasant sight, the couple, sitting there, waving goodbye. And those beet pickles they sent home are mighty good too! For, again in an age-old tradition, it's rare for a visitor to leave the Bankhead's home without some token of their generosity.

Sometimes it seems harder and to find people who know the secrets of growing a flourishing vegetable garden, then putting it up.

But, as long as there are people who love the soil and love to garden, there will be couples like the Bankheads. And the world is by far a richer place for them.

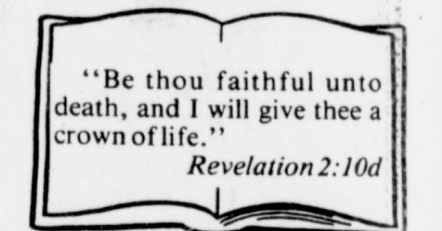

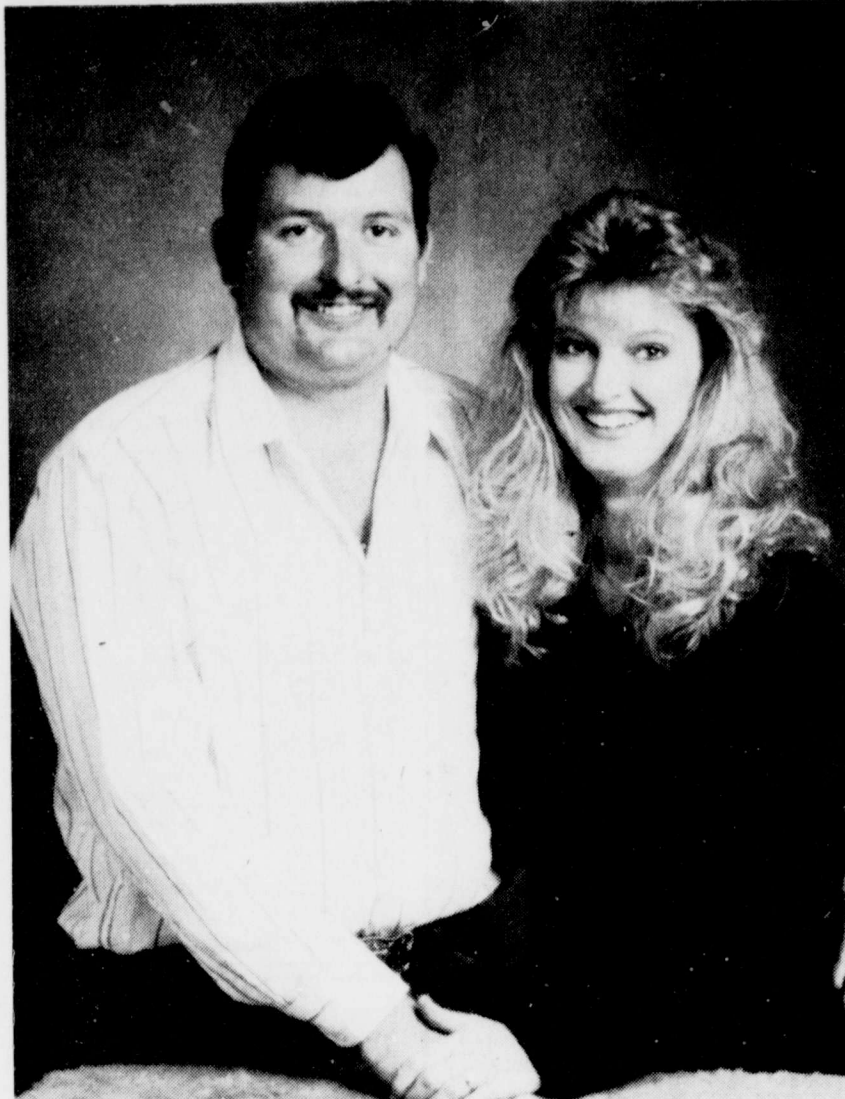

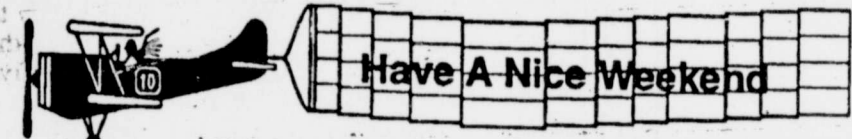

Have you ever given much thought to those children in school who are not popular, clean, or well behaved? Perhaps we all should. Everyone knows that in every school or class there are those children who are dirty, poorly dressed and misbehaved. These children never get their name on honor rolls, selected as class favorites or given other recognition. Most likely they are only noted when they do something wrong. Many just "drift" through their school years, neither enjoying them nor profiting from them, either. But give a little thought to why.
