Over the years I've written a number of stories about freedom and patriotism. These freedoms have been done on Memorial Day, or, as now, on the Fourth of July.

Trying to think about a new way to say things that have been expressed before, I began thinking about the generations of people who are buried both in this country and scattered all over the world.

All across this nation there are cemeteries from the American Revolution onward to the present and most recent conflicts.

They lie at rest in long, orderly rows, marked by simple white crosses in European battlefields. They lie on South Pacific Islands, and on Revolutionary War battlefields at Yorktown.

Gettysburg, Pea Ridge, Shiloh, the dead are buried from the Civil War, brothers against brother, cousins against one another, sometimes in separate graves, sometimes in common ones, re-joined at last in death.

The cemeteries are everywhere, filled with those who died for the abstract concept of freedom, and the very un-abstract life provided by democracy.

And, there are those who did not die during a battle, but perhaps went on to live a full life after the struggle. Others may have spent the remaining portion of their life crippled and maimed. They are called survivors. And they may, or may not be buried with military honors when their time comes.

Yet they are no less heroes than those who died in the conflict... their contribution is no smaller.

One by one they have passed away before time's sickle swaths.

Most did their duty, paid their dues, and went their way with no big fuss. They leave behind the legacy of genetics, the legacy of family, and a gravestone that may or may not be marked with an acknowledgment of service, is what remains.

And what of those who have no marker? Think back at the past two hundred years. How many thousands must be tucked away in lonely, unmarked graves, unknown to any living mortal. Many lie in watery silence, or never received a memorial or burial at all, only that which nature provides.

And everyone who died for freedom was not in the armed services. No, not by any stretch of the imagination.

Across this country there are the graves of thousands who laid their lives, or careers, on the line for what they perceived as right and just. They too, are unsung and unknown for the most part.

But each and every one, service man, servicewoman, quite small-town mayor or noted campaigner, or private citizen, each has been a part of the system that is America. Each is worth a tiny moment of time spent acknowledging their contributions.

And each is worth the remembrance that what they died for or fought for is worth preserving. And it is up to each of us to preserve it.

Yesterday was America's birthday...let's recall those who fought for her right to have one!

Bogata Rodeo Breaks Entry, Attendance Records

The 1990 Bogata Rodeo broke all records regarding contestant entry numbers and total prize money paid out, according to rodeo officials on Saturday evening, following the final performance.

The three-day competition saw a total of 362 contestants compete in the seven major events, with slack competition being run on Thursday and Friday evenings after the performances.

Total prize money paid out to winning contestants was \$17,442.90, which included the \$2,800.00 in added money, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, annual sponsor of the rodeo.

Winning the most money in a single event at the rodeo was Travis Harmon of Sulphur Springs, TX who collected \$974.59 for his 8:60 second run in the calf roping. Harmon com-

peted on Friday evening and his lead held through the final performance.

The team roping was the second highest paying event at the rodeo, with the hot handed team of Randy Cox and Randy Robinson, both of Bartlesville, OK, pocketing first place prize money of \$920.44 per man for their Saturday night run of 4:82 seconds. Coming into the performance on Saturday, a 4:85 second time was winning first, turned in by Jeff Lee of Vinita, OK and Brit Bockius of Dewey, OK. The team roping was tough, as a 5:55 second run won a sixth.

The barrel racers were the third highest money winners, with Paula Workman of Weatherford, TX winning that contest with her 16:00 second run. Paula received first place money of \$762.52, while Brenda Palmer of Terrell, TX won second

with a 16:10 second run. Brenda made \$571.89 for her effort. Barrel racing times went from Workman's 16:00 run to a 16:24, only .24 hundredths of a second separating first from sixth place.

Charlie Hurst of Slick, OK opened up the steer wrestling on Thursday evening with a spectacular 3:94 second run, and it withstood all other contestants, giving Hurst the championship and a check for \$709.88.

In the bareback riding event, Clayton Macom of Stigler, OK competed on Thursday evening and marked 81 points to win that event. His win paid him \$304.56.

The saddle bronc riding event was split between Bobby Buffington of Manchester, TX and Mike Fletcher of Quitman, TX, who both scored 76 points. Each man was paid \$302.68.

The bull riding event was won by

a local contestant, 18-year old Coy Allen of Clarksville, TX. Allen, who has previously only competed in high school rodeo competition, came out on top of the pack of 47 bull riders at the Bogata rodeo, and walked away with first place money, \$685.82.

Rodeo officials for the 1990 Bogata rodeo were Jim Hogan of Shawnee, OK and Micky DeLashaw of Durant, OK.

Pickup men were Bogata's Jacky Gray and Randy Franks of Clarksville. Doug Williams of Idabel, OK was the rodeo's announcer.

Rodeo spectators were entertained by the clowning antics of Huck Hano, Greg Carr and Rodney Hayes.

The Bogata rodeo was produced by the Wing Rodeo Company of Bogata, producer of the rodeo for the 23rd year.

Thursday night at the rodeo, Amanda Callahan was crowned the Bogata Rodeo Princess. Winning first runner-up was Tina Smith, daughter of Roger and Bonnie Smith of Bogata. Tina also won the horsemanship contest and received a silver tray from the William Rozell Family of Bogata, presented by Kincaid Park.

Winner of the \$100 savings bond on Thursday evening, in memory of Hub Whiteman, was Tiffany Rozell of Bogata.

The Friday evening performance was dedicated to Ronnie White, long-time member of the Bogata Rodeo Association and supporter of the Bogata rodeo. His father, Bill White, was presented a plaque in memory of Ronnie, by members of the Bogata Rodeo Association prior to the second performance of the rodeo.

Ladun Hadnot had more when it came to rolling square hay bales by winning first place and Joan Weatherall and Lucille Beakley came in first in the egg tossing contest with no egg on their faces.

Molly Hare proved that there is an art to bursting balloons by winning first place.

The came the second annual Lions Club Registered Duck Race. Hundreds of people lined the banks of the creek for the starting of the race.

The Assembly of God Gospel Singers provided enjoyable singing and music from 12 to 1 p.m.

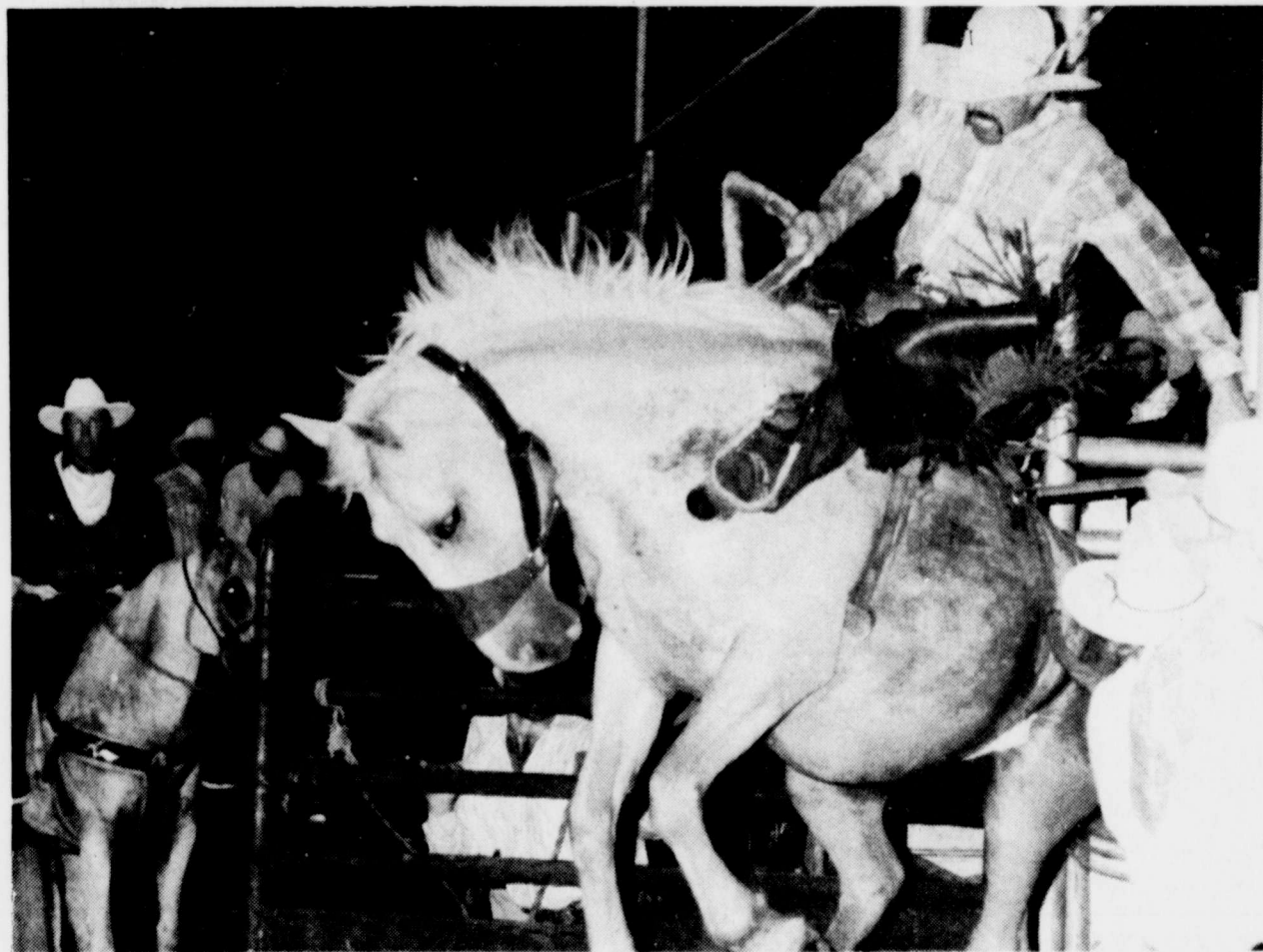
The dunking vat stayed busy all day. People took out their frustra-

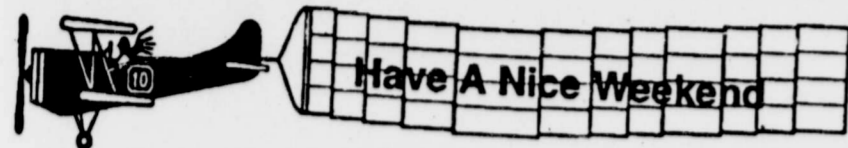

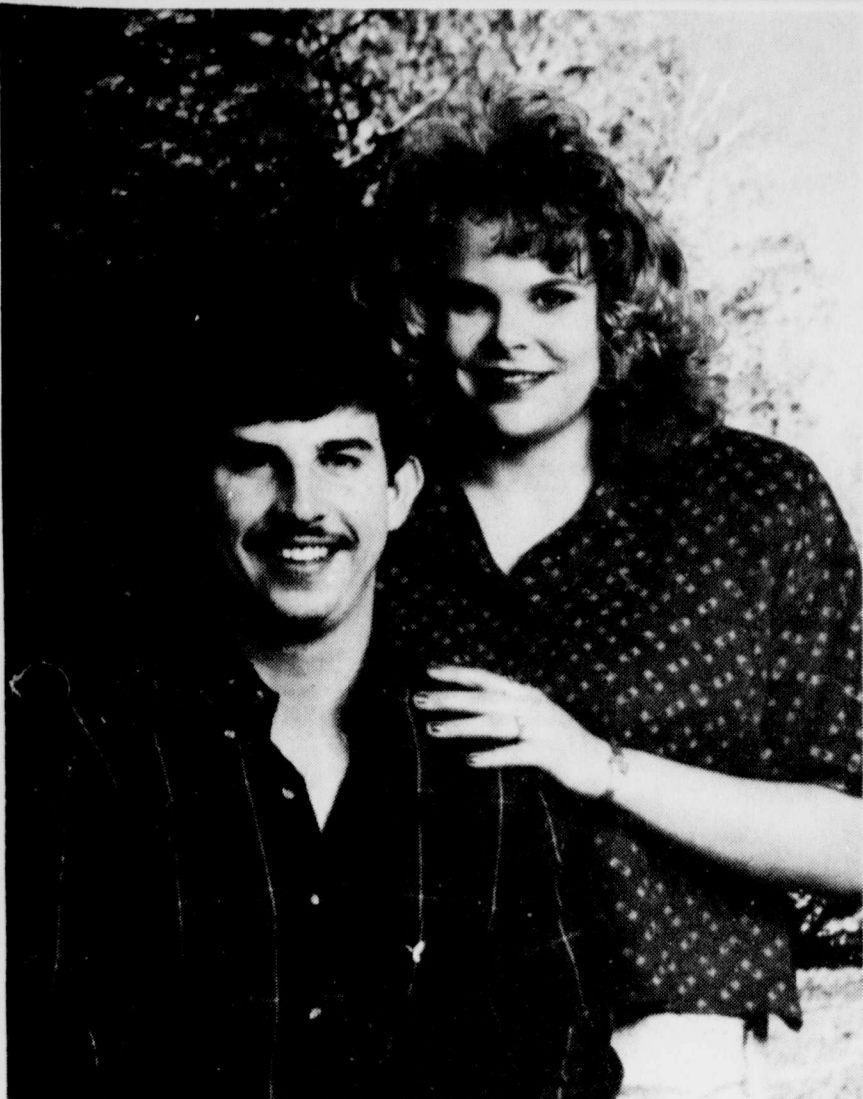

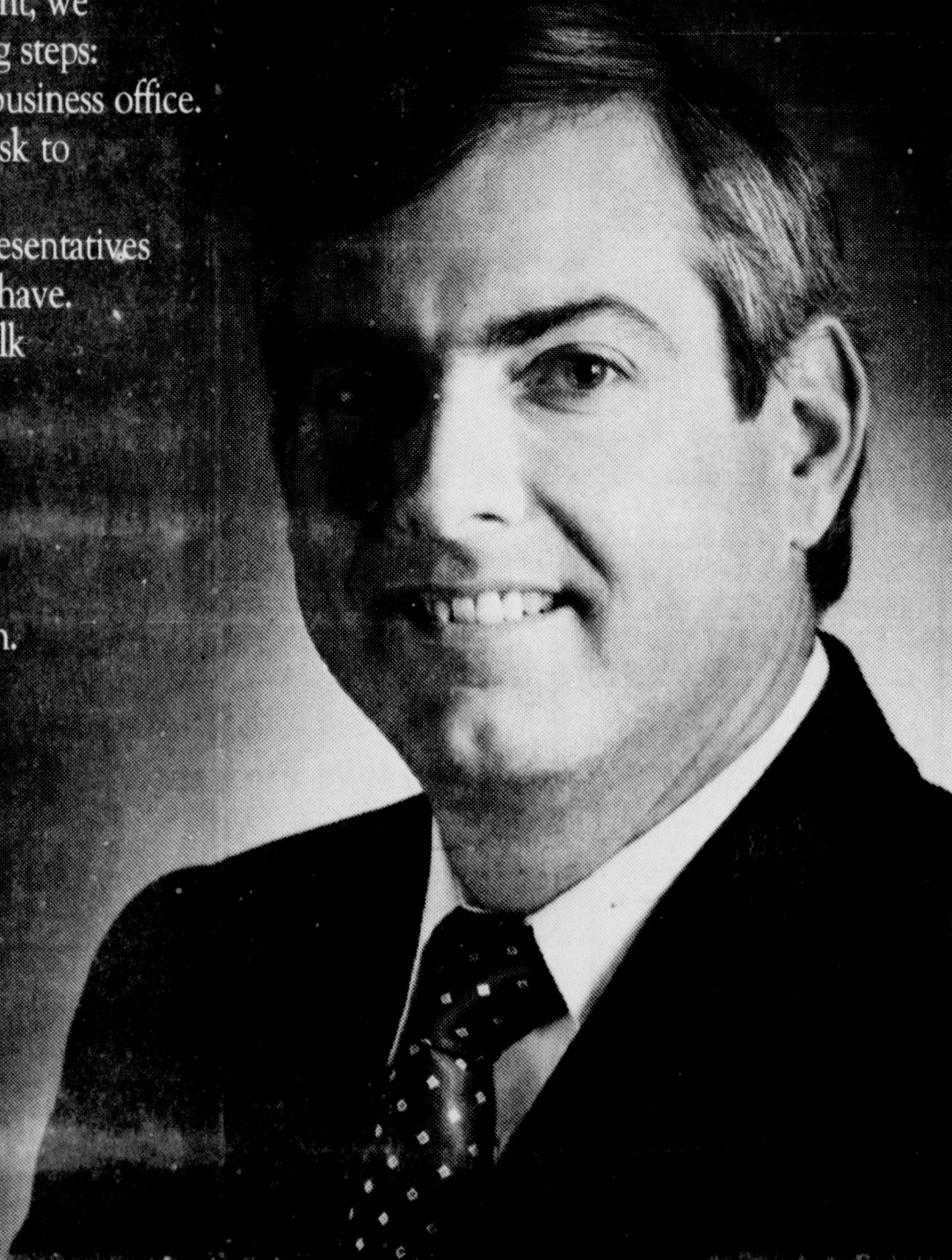

Something new has come to Johntown. Beefy's Barbeque has opened its doors to the public.

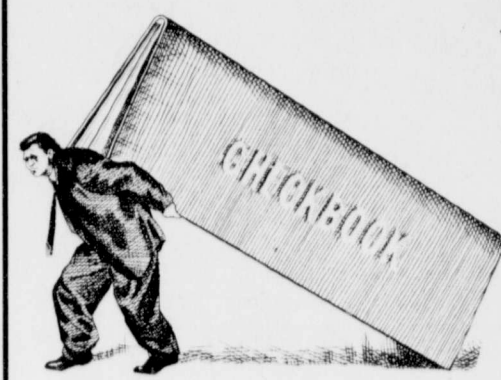
Family owned and operated, Beefy's offers a variety of meats and side dishes. They also offer a dieter's plate for those who are counting calories.

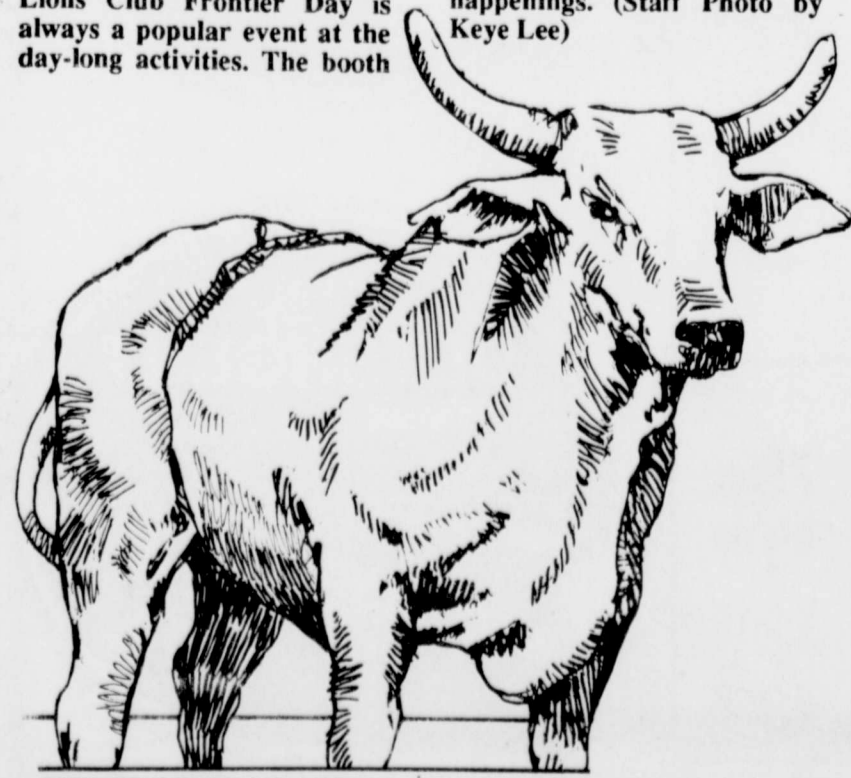

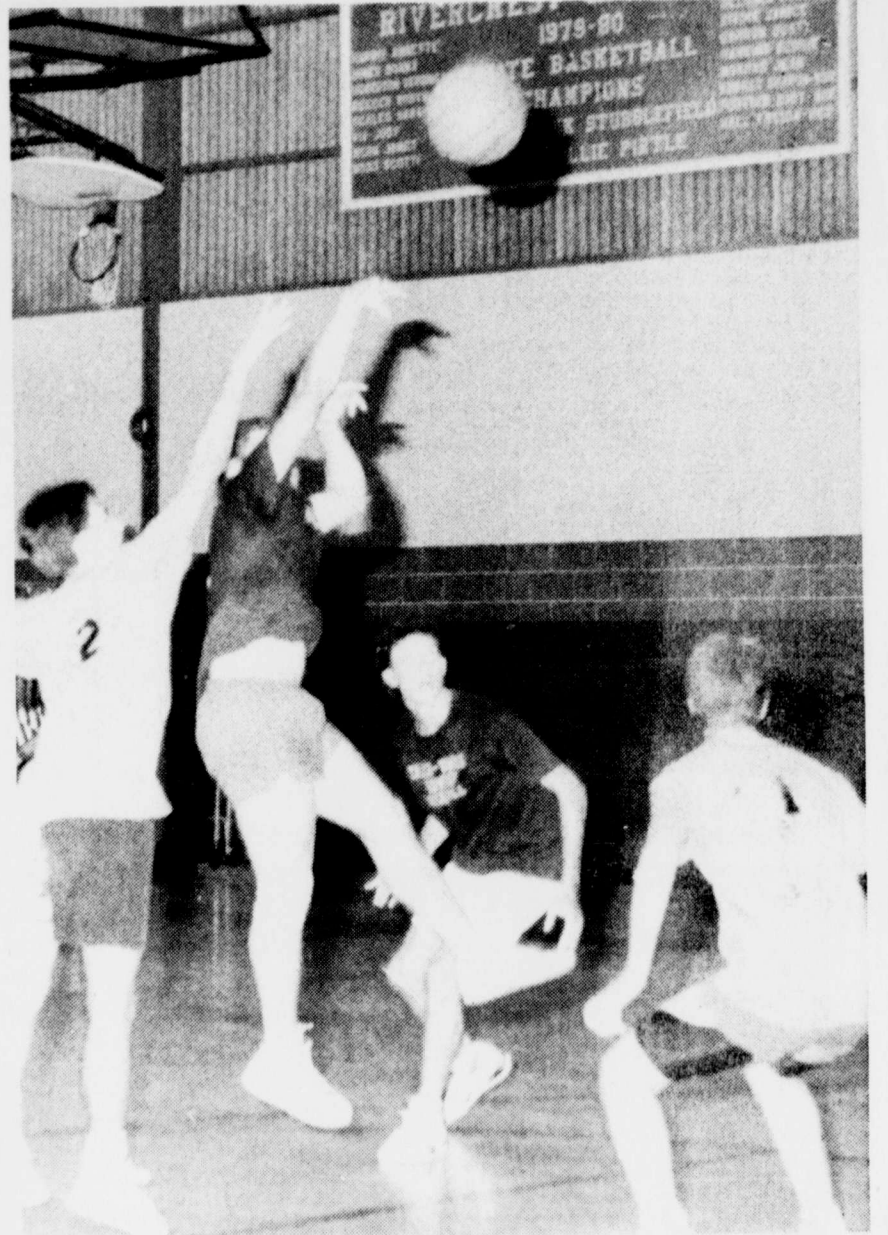

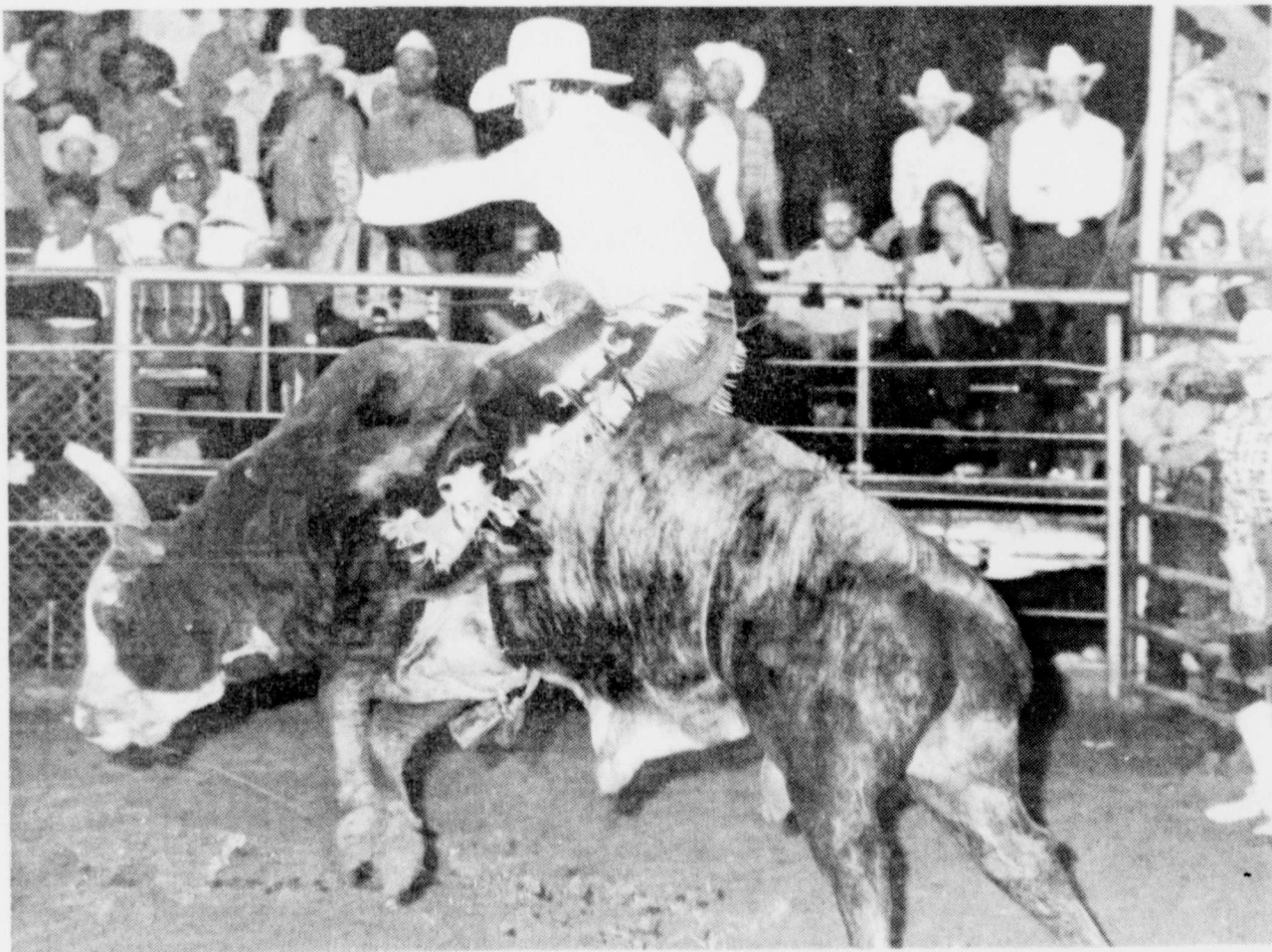

A Memorable Weekend

Carswell Air Force Base, Ft. Worth, Texas, 20th Bomb Group B52, 8th Air Force had what they called, a dining out on the 22nd and 23rd of June, the theme of which was "Remember". Honoring all Air Force men who had given their lives for our country, with emphasis on the Ploesti Oil Field raid of August 1, 1943.

Since I was a gunner flyin gon a B24 on that raid, my nephew, Lt. Col. Paul Wilkinson, got an invitation for Jean and myself to attend.

As background on the Ploesti Raid, it was the only mass, low-level mission by heavy bombers in World War II. One hundred seventy-eight B-24's, of which 158 got over the target. Our loss that day was more than 1/3 of these. Five Congressional Medals of Honor were given to men on that one air raid, along with some 1,500 Distinguished Flying Crosses and several other medals. Gen. Leon Johnson, Ret., was one of the Medal of Honor recipients.

At the Carswell festivities, Gen. Johnson, Gen. Ramsey Potts, who flew on the Ploesti Raid also, Gen. Andrew Low, who was shot down over Germany and was a POW, and Gen. Jimmy Stewart (the actor) were invited to attend. All four were present.

Gen. Low and I attended the press conference Friday night and were introduced to the Generals. We got to visit with each one for a few minutes.

Saturday, a flightline ceremony was held at Carswell at which General Low was the main speaker. As you know, the Air Force has decided

to renew the nose-art on our bombers. General Low introduced the first of our present day bomber's nose-art. It was taken from the nose of a World War II B-24, which three of the Generals had a time in. The picture on the nose was a rabbit, the name "Wham Bam".

At the noon luncheon in the Officer's Club, Gen. Potts was the speaker. He spoke on the Ploesti Raid, but didn't know why the other three were invited. Gen. Potts' reply was "As I understand it, you are to hold his horse, I am to hand him the reins, and Gen. Low is to help him mount."

Saturday night at the banquet, Jimmy Stewart was the speaker. He spoke for some fifteen minutes and did not stammer a time.

For a small monetary consideration, I will let you touch the hand that shook the hand of Jimmy Stewart.

Col. Paul Wilkinson is the grandson of the late Charlie Wilkinson and the late Jap Chesshires.

Charles Wilkinson and his wife, Jean, grew up in Bogata. He taught school in Bogata from 1952 through 1959 and Jean worked for Dr. Brooks. They are presently living in Anson, where they have made their home for the past 12 years. Before that, they lived in Abilene where he taught school for 25 years. He served in the Air Force from June, 1942 until September, 1945, in the Overseas Middle East Theatre Wars.

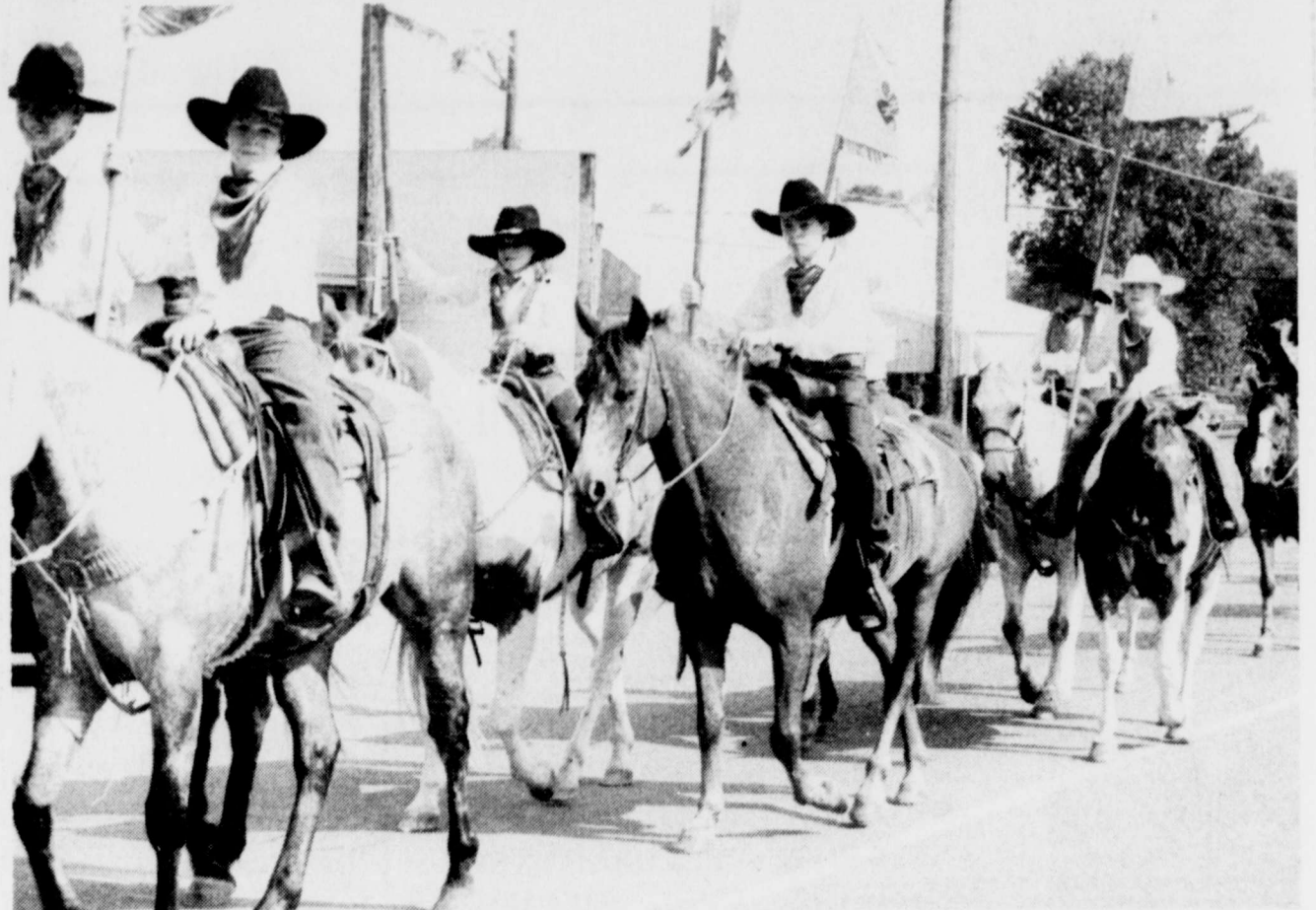
