Bogata At Top Of List For Water Grant

in Community Development Block Grants from the Texas Department of Commerce, the Northeast Texas Regional Review Committee ranked the City of Deport first with a water project in the amount of \$140,000. Second ranked was the City of Bogata for a sewer project (\$227,800); third was the City of Clarksville for a water project (\$172,000). The City of Detroit requested funding for a water project (\$143,500) while Red River County presented a street project for consideration (\$158,250), and the City of DeKalb requested monies for a sewer project (\$177,000).

All projects met the general requirement sof benefitting at least 51% of low to moderate income persons/ families with a priority of their impacting low income housing projects. However, this process was only the first step toward actual funding of proposed projects.

The Regional Review Committee has the first responsibility of considering each project using a specific set of criteria adopted earlier this year," said James D. Goerke, Executive Director of the Ark-Tex Council of Governments. "These scores, though, make up only 50% of the total used to award actual funding. The Texas Department of Commerce, meeting later this year, will take each project and use an additional set of criteria developed by the

With 24 cities vying for \$1,308,259 State to add to the scores of the RRC and determine the final outcome. "So," he added, "projects that rank at the top of the local level may not necessarily end up first following the state process."

Midnight Thoughts On Veterans Day

It's midnight, a Tuesday night. And we are putting the finishing touchs on our first Veteran's Day page. Outside the office all is dark.

Last week we decided to solicit photos of veterans and people currently serving in the United States Armed Forces. We actually worried about getting enough in to do a full page.

The response, however, has gone far, far beyond a mere twenty or thirty pictures. Instead, we have over a hundred pictures, total between the four papers.

And, more than the photos, we have gone through an experience.

As the pictures have been brought in we have heard stories to move the heart, to warm the soul, and to bring a tear to the eye.

Unfortunately, we didn't have room to list all the medals and ribbons, places stationed and promotions for each service person, perhaps next year we cando a more complete job. We were simply unprepared for the enormous response to this.

But we have listened and read in fascination.

One family brought in pictures of a military tradition dating back to the Civil War.

Another told of how their husband nearly starved as a Prisoner of War in World War II.

Some sent maps and newspapers, like the one sent in by James E. Pratt's family. He had a copy of

"Blizzard" magazine, published by bring in their picture. They were too and for the men of the 10th Mountain shy, or too afraid of "showing off" to Division in Europe. do so.

The well-preserved publication has day by day accounts of the 10ths part in a major push, and cutting a Nazi Escape. Moving letters from Italians, battlefield notebooks, even ads for "Keep the money but please return pictures and cards in leather wallet lost between Cassone and Riva" bring World War Two into prespective.

Purple hearts, victory ribbons, Distinguished Flying Crosses, Bronze and Silver Stars, the awards that chronicle valor through World Wars I and II, Korea, Vietnam and yes, even through the current Middle Eastern Crisis make a lengthy list.

Cherished Discharge papers or commendations were submitted.

Elderly men and widowed women smiled at the youthful faces that looked back at them from photos taken in a different era and sometimes those smiles came through tears.

Youngsters proudly brought Dad's photo in as Vietnam veterans try to explain a puzzling, frustrating period in this Nation's history.

Mothers sent us pictures of their children currently serving in the Middle East, their worries for the safety of these children apparent on their faces or in their letters to us.

World War I veterans still alive were few and far between, naturally. One man, C.G. "Bud" Nobles served in WWII, Korea and Vietnam. There were those who wouldn't




for parties and special events.

The Farmers Home Administration, an agency of the United States Department of Agriculture, has selected the Farm Safety for "Just Kids" program as its public service project for 1990-91, through its Wellness Program's Public Safety Campaign, according to Billy Curb, FmHA County Supervisor for Lamar County.

Farm Safety for "Just Kids" is a non-profit organization dedicated to education parents and children about farm injury prevention. This organization stresses raising awareness levels regarding on-farm hazards. Each year, farm accidents result in the death of 300 young people and 5,000 serious injuries. The pimary age group effected is 5 to 14 years old.



In 1988, 35.6% of farm accident victims were children ranging in age from 5 to 14 years. There are three factors today which may be aggravating the dangers for children: increased mechanization; new safety hazards, 50% of ATV accidents have involved children, and; stressful economic conditions.

"We bleieve Farmers Home Administration in Texas can make a tremendous contribution to this organization in reaching thousands of children and young adults in rural areas that would have otherwise been missed," Curb said.

New SSI Rules For Disabled Children

There have been a couple of recent changes in the Supplemental Security Income law that affect SSI payments paid to disabled children.

One of the changes allows for the continued payment of a \$30 personal needs allowance to disabled children who leave a medical institution to receive care at home. The children will then also keep their Medicaid eligibility.

Under the old law, children often became ineligible for SSI and Medicaid when they went home from an institution because of their parents' income and resources.

Another change continues eligibility for disabled children of Armed Forces personnel who live with their parents while on permanent duty assignments outside the United States. The children must be U.S. citizens and must have been eligible for SSI in the month before their parents reported for overseas duty.

This change will help Armed Forces personnel keep their families together. Prior to this, their disabled children had to remain in the U.S. or give up SSI benefits.

The SSI program pays monthly checks to people with little income and few resources who are 65 and older and to people of any age who are blind or disabled. And most people who get SSI are also eligible for Medicaid which helps pay health care expenses.

For SSI purposes, a child is under 18 and neither married or head of a household, or under 22 and a student regularly pursuing a course of study in an educational or vocational training institution expected to result in gainful employment.

If you know a blind or disabled child who may qualify for SSI, refer the child, parents or guardian to any Social Security office.







Area Code 214 Changes To 903 In Northeast Texas

On November 4, the 214 area code changes to 903 in all areas of Northeast Texas except those around Dallas south to Waxahachie. Dallas and the immediate area remains in area code 214, while the rest of Northeast Texas acquires the 903 area code, similar to the 713-409 conversion several years ago in the Houston area. The new area code was established due to an almost-exhausted supply of one numbers available in the 214

The change won't affect long-dis-

tance rates, although there may be

dialing. Also, any phone numbers programmed into the telephone such as speed calling numbers, fax numbers, PBX and PABX numbers, pay phones and cellular phones may need to be reprogrammed.

Until May, 1991, callers automatically will be switched to the correct area code and number. Beginning in May of 1991, recorded messages will remind those who dial the incorrect area code that they must use the new 903 area code when placing calls to that number. Although

some changes in the long-distance these transition periods have been established to help callers who forget to dial the 903 area code, callers should begin using the 903 number for all numbers in the new area on November 4.



plies on the farm and around the home can pay big dividends by preventing costly repairs and replacement.

"Spray systems, including the pump, lines and tank are very susceptible to freezing," said Dr. James Robinson, entomologist for the Texas gricultural Extension Service. reeze proofing equipment is a chore easily delayed. This can result in extensive losses of equipment and time.'

"All equipment water systems should be drained and adequate antifreeze added to protect the equipment below the lowest temperature expected for the particular region,"

in the system, damage can be costly." Around the home and barns, hoses should be disconnected from faucets and the faucets and above ground pipes protected from freezing. All pesticides should be properly

stored out of reach of children and to prevent freezing. Granular or powdered material should be sealed in airtight containers to protect against moisture.

Robinson says to repair or replace worn parts on quipment before the equipment is stored for the winter. If the equipment is subject to caustic materials such as fertilizer, it should be cleaned and oiled to prevent rusting and deterioration.


