Italian Hero Loaf 3 1/4 cups flour, divided

1 tablespoon sugar

teaspoon salt

packae of Rapid Rise Yeast cup hot water (125 to 130 degrees)

1 tablespoon softened butter

8 oz. sliced cooked ham

4 oz. sliced Provolone cheese 4 oz. sliced salami

1/2 cup drained pitted ripe olives 1 egg white, beaten

Creamy Italian dressing (optional) Set aside 1 cup of flour. In food processor, combine flour, sugar, salt and yeast. Stir in hot water and margarine. Mix in only enough reserved flour to make soft dough. Knead dough for approximately 4 minutes after mixed. On a greased cookie sheet, roll dough into 14x10 inch rectangle. 

Any tickets written before December 1st for travel after the 1st will be eight per cent. Any tickets written after the first will be ten per cent.


