Suspects Apprehended In Possible "Scam" Operation

An elderly Cunningham couple might have been the victim of a "scam" Monday, if it had not been for the intercession of neighbors.

According to reports, three men appeared at their door and handed them a bill for \$300 for "adjusting lightning rods". They called a neighbor, who warned them not to pay the bill. The neighbor called the Lamar County Sheriff's department and then dispatched some Cunningham men to

the couple's home.

The men who had presented them with the bill drove off, however, they were intercepted by Lamar County law enforcement officials.

The incident is currently under investigation, and people are warned to be very sure what they may be purchasing, or paying for before giving money to anyone they do not know as it is reported that a number of "scams" are currently underway.

Local Sales Tax Figures Released

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday that sales taxes collected in July, August and September of this year of this year showed a steady increase over last year's collections.

"These rebates are right in line with our projections and show healthy economic growth in Texas," Bullock said.

The Comptroller's office today sent \$140 million in sales tax rebate checks to cities and counties throughout Texas.

Payments to cities totaled \$128 million for an 8% increase over last year's total payments at this time.

Blossom received \$2,846.97 for a

4.22% decrease over last year's payment.

Deport received \$2,455.65 for a 6.08% decrease over the payment in 1989.

Paris received \$313,317.78 for a 12.55% increase.

Bogata received \$4,313.89 for a

2.64% decrease while Clarksville received \$24,895.512 for a 2.30% increase.

Detroit received \$2,214.92 for a 10.40% increase over last year's payment.

Mt. Pleasant received \$127,193.23 for a 3.76% increase over last year's

payment.

Talco received \$2,922.10 for a 10.03% decrease.

Merchants collect the state and local sales taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state keeps its share and sends cities and counties the local portion of the sales tax each month.

All local sales must be approved by area voters and may be used for any legal city or county expenses. Most areas put the money in their General Fund and use it for operations like fire fighting, maintaining roads and law enforcement.

The Talco-Bogata CISD Board held its regular meeting on November 13 at Rivercrest High School.

Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting was the first item on the meeting's agenda, followed by the payment of bills and budget changes.

The tax office report and adjustment were presented. The board adopted the records management policy and accepted the bid by Capps Insurance Agency for the school.

The Bogata Elementary School's

roof had no repair bids turned in, and the job will be let for bids again.

There were several reports read. Transportation by Freddy Wade, D-Fy-It Program by Ray Miller, TAAS Testing and Gifted and Talented Program by Mrs. Kay Kennedy.

The board accepted the annual performance report and adopted a policy on District-wide Educational Improvement Council and discussed and took the necessary action concerning the salary schedule.

Dodd-Thornsberry To Wed

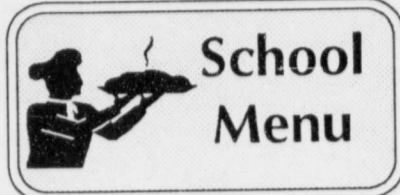

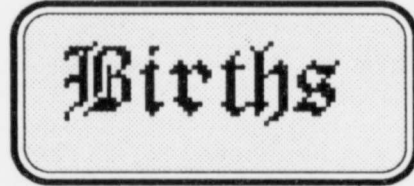

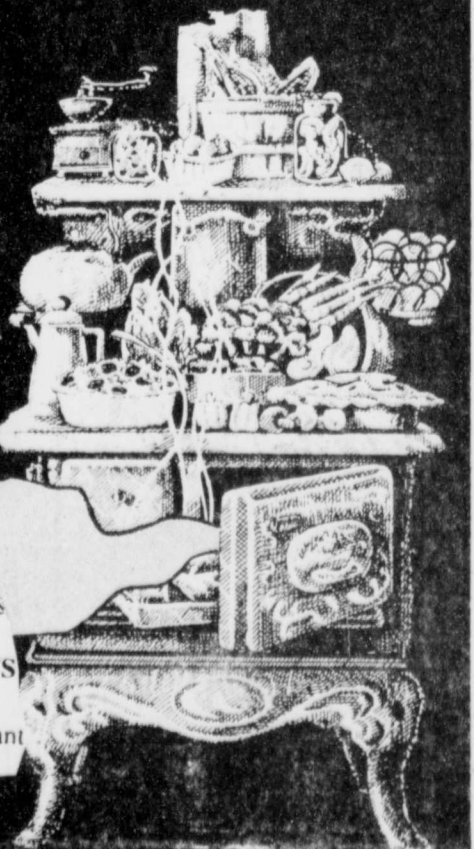

enteen fouls in the first half. Three of the Lady Rebels were in double digits with Patches Raines 13, Katy Ross 12 and B.J. Thompson, 10.

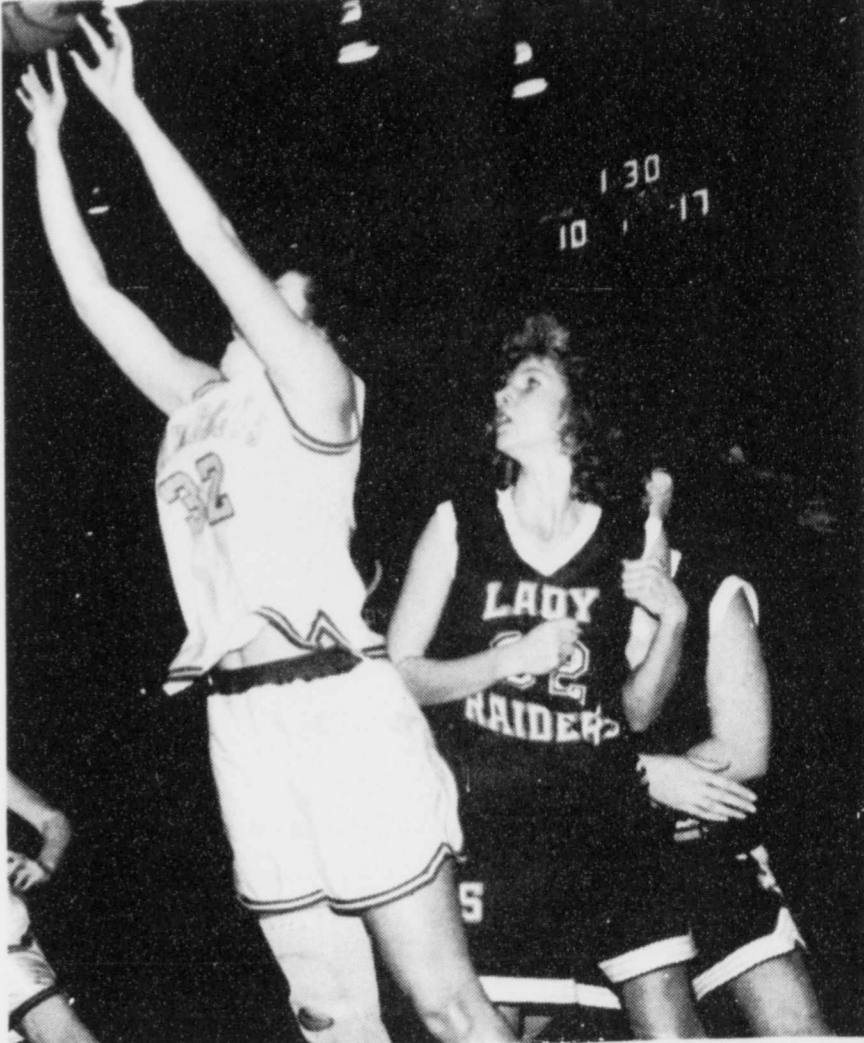
Second period of play belonged to the Red Raiders when they took control and scored 13 unanswered points. The Raiders emerged victoriously 70-56.

The evening classes will generally be offered one night per week and most evening classes will begin at 6 p.m.


