2 cups sugar 1/2 cup crisco

1/2 cup oleo

2 cups flour

1 tsp. soda 1 cup buttermilk

5 eggs, separated 2 cups coconut 1 cup chopped pecans

1 tsp. vanilla Combine soda and buttermilk adn set aside. Cream together sugar, crisco and oleo. Add eggs, 1 at a time, and add buttermilk soda mixture alternately with flour. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold into batter. Gently fold in coconut and pecans. Bake at 325. Let cool then ice layers and sides. Makes 3-9 inch layers.

Cream Cheese Icing 1 8oz. pkg. Cream Cheese

1/2 cup oleo 1 box powdered sugar

1 tsp. vanilla Cream all ingredients together.

Strawberry Cheesecake 1/2 box vanilla wafers 1/2 cup butter, melted 1-8 oz. cream cheese softened

1 cup sugar + 5 tablespoons

2 eggs slightly beaten 1 tsp. vanilla extract

2 cups sour cream

1 box frozen sliced strawberries, thawed 2 T. cornstarch

Crush vanilla wafers; mix with butter. Press mixture into 8x10x2 baking dish. combine cream cheese, sugar, eggs and vanilla; mix until creamy. Pour into crust. Bake in preheated 350 oven for 20 minutes or until set. Let cool. Combine sour cream and 5 tablespoons sugar; beat with electric mixer for 2 minutes. Pour over cream cheese filling. Bake in preheated 450 degree oven for 5 minutes. Let cool. Drain strawberries; reserve juice. Combine 1/2 cup sugar, cornstarch and reserved juice in saucepan; cook until thick, stirring constantly. Let cool. Stir in strawberries, spread over cheesecake. Chill until ready to

Green Enchiladas 1 lb. lean ground beef 1/4 tsp. minced garlic 3/4 cup evaporated milk 1 pkg. green onion dip mix

1 sm. can chopped green chilies

1/2 lb. grated longhorn cheese

1 tsp. salt

1 cup sour cream

l can cream of chicken soup 1/2 lb. grated American cheese

1 sm. can chopped pimentos 1 cup chopped onion

1 dozen tortillas

1/2 cup corn oil

Preheat oven to 350. Add salt and garlic to beef and brown slightly. Heat soup, milk and American cheese and sour cream in top of double boiler, until cheese melts. Add green chilies, onion dip and pimentos. Stir and remove from heat. Add longhorn cheese and onion to the meat and mix well. Soften tortillas in hot corn oil, drain thoroughly and fill each tortilla with meat mixture. Roll lightly and place in an 8x10x2 baking dish. Pour cheese over top, cover with aluminum foil and bake at 350 for 30 minutes. Makes 12 enchiladas.

Creole Gumbo

2 tsp. flour 1 cup chopped onions 1/4 cup chopped parsley

2 cloves garlic 1 No. 2 can tomatoes

1 can okra

2 lbs. shrimp (deveined)

1 cup crab meat

3 cups chicken stock 4 bay leaves

Pinch of thyme

salt and pepper to taste 1 cup cooked chicken

2 tsp. gumbo file

Brown flour in 2 tsp. fat in skillet until dark; add onion, parsley and garlic. Saute onion mixture until tender; pour into deep kettle. Simmer tomatoes and okra together for several minutes; add to onion mixture. Add shrimp, crab meat, chicken stock, bay leaves and thyme; season with salt and pepper. Simmer gumbo for 1 hour and 30 minutes. Stir in chicken and simmer 15 minutes longer. Add gumbo file. Serve over cooked rice.

Guacamole Salad

1 head lettuce 1/2 onion

2 tomatoes

2 avocados

salt and pepper to taste 1/4 cup Picante sauce

Cut lettuce and tomatoes and onions and avocadoes together. Salt and pepper. Add Picante sauce right before serving and mix well.

Andrews RoCo Bulls Honored At 1990 NFR

bucking bulls and one bareback horse were selected by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association to compete at the 1990 National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas, Nevada, December Nov. 30-Dec. 9.

Of the five head of livestock selected for competition, two bulls were recognized for their outstanding performances.

Sammy Andrews, owner of the Andrews Rodeo Company, was presented a trophy buckle for his bull

Representing the Andrews Rodeo #77, Hardrock Copenhagen, having Company of Addielou, TX, four a go-round won during the NFR. Tuff Hedeman of Bowie, TX, former PRCA Bull Riding Champion, had drawn the bull and won the go-round. Andrews was presented the buckle at a special awards ceremony held after each performance of the rodeo at the Gold Coast Hotel and Casino.

Bull #363, Skoal's Outlaw Willie, was named as Runner-up to the Bucking Bull of the Finals by the Top 15 bull riders qualifying for the NFR, and Andrews was presented a cash award during the awards ceremony following the final performance of the NFR. "Willie" was drawn by Clint

Branger of Canada in the final goround of the NFR, and threw Branger off prior to the 8-second whistle.

Only two of the Andrews bulls were successfully qualified on during the 10-performance rodeo, alongwith #77, bull #H53 was ridden by Ty Murray, the 1990 All Around Champion, to win a third in a go-round during the week's competition.

Bareback horse #UPS was ridden to a fourth place finish in a go-round by Dave Appleton of Dallas, TX, former PRCA Bareback Riding Champion, in UPS' one out in competition.

Winning the Bucking Bull of the Finals award was the David Bailey Rodeo Company of Tahlequah, OK, and winning third place in the Bucking Bull of the Finals category was a bull from the Dell Hall Rodeo Compay, also of Tahlequah, OK. Both these bulls were sired by the same bucking bull, Snoopy, owned by David Bailey.

This year marks the third year for the Andrews Rodeo Company to be a PRCA stock contracting company, and this is the second consecutive year that Andrews livestock has been selected to attend the NFR.
