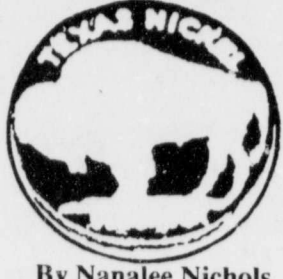


**Nichols

Bogata Rodeo Begins Thursday

The Bogata Rodeo Association and Wing Rodeo Company have teamed up to produce another action-packed three nights of rodeo performances on June 27-28-29 in Bogata.

This year's rodeo is sanctioned by the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association and is co-sanctioned by the Central Rodeo Association.

The Wing Rodeo Company, owned by Jerald and Joan Smith of Bogata, will be bringing award-winning style and great bucking bulls and horses for the crowds to thrill at each performance of the 1991 rodeo.

The Wing Rodeo Company is the reigning Stock Contractor of the Year in the C.R.R.A., as well as receiving the Bucking Bull of the Year and Saddle Bronc of the Year awards for their livestock. This feat speaks for itself, as these and other top quality animals will be performing each night, trying their best to unseat top

riders from the two sanctioning associations.

Performing this year, other than the many cowboys and cowgirls, are bullfighters Rodney Hayes of Linden, TX and Brother and Vicki Taylor of Wimberly. Vicki is a trick rider and Brother has dog acts and horse and mule tricks. This duo has been performing together for 12 years.

To kick off the festivities, there will be a parade at 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, featuring Kennedy's Sausage Hitch and the local faces of the people we all know. Another parade will be Saturday at 5:00 p.m.

Each night the rodeo begins at 8:30 with a "Grand Entry" of cowboys, cowgirls, friends and family. Later in the program each night there will be a calf scramble for the youngsters with a prize of \$10 nightly.

Thursday night is dedicated to Hub

Whiteman and there will be a drawing for a \$100 savings bond given in memory of Hub by Mrs. Whiteman.

There is \$2,800.00 in added money to the seven championship events this year at the Bogata rodeo and a belt buckle will be given to the All Around Champion Cowboy.

Tickets to the rodeo are available at Huddleston's Grocery, Peoples National Bank, The Movie Shoppe and Buckman Drug Store in Bogata. Prices are \$3.50 advance for adults, \$4.00 at the gate. Children 6-12 tickets are \$3.00.

Next Saturday night will mean one more year until our local rodeo will be back in town. So everyone take out your hats and polish your boots and come on down to the Bogata Rodeo for a great time and to see those familiar faces you haven't seen since last year.

The Bogata Rodeo and Frontier Day are fast approaching and the Bogata Lions Club has been working extra hours to make this the best Frontier Day ever.

Festivities of the 1991 Frontier Days commences at 7 a.m. sharp on Saturday, June 29 at the Community Center in Bogata with a free pancake breakfast, cooked by none other than the Contel phone boys.

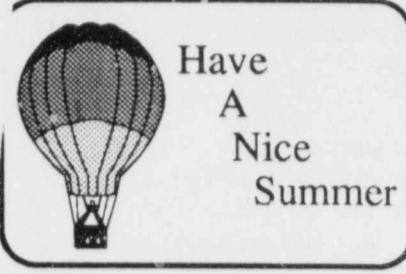

June Sales Tax Rebates Increase Locally

"The Texas economy is no longer stalled, but has shifted into drive," Comptroller Jim Sharp said today as he sent city and county governments more than \$240.8 million in local sales tax rebates--or almost 13% more than last June. In the first six months of 1991, the state has rebated a total of \$981.7 million to city and county governments, an 11% increase over the first half of last year.

"Not only are local sales taxes up--but there's a sizable increase in the number of Texas business locations collecting the tax," Sharp said.

ity of the sales tax applications filed during the first months of 1991. These figures are derived by comparing applications for sales tax permits with out of business notices sent to the Comptroller.

By comparison, during those same months in 1989-90, the net rise in businesses collecting the sales tax was 13,213 and in 1988-89 the net gain was 4,014.

Seemingly, J.N. Lee has done too much for the Bogata area; everywhere from passing city ordinances, repairing the city's water systems, to supplying his special friends with fresh vegetables from his garden.

J.N. is no stranger to hard work. Being the oldest of ten children, he learned to take responsibility at an early age. He can remember plowing the fields with a mule when he was as young as eight, and he hasn't stopped yet. Even now at the age of 78, he is in the meadows maring hay.

In 1940, he married the former Maudie Buster and together they had their son, Jim Ed. Today they are the proud grandparents of three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

For years, J.N. worked as a farmer in the Rugby area, where he was raised, and at one time he worked in an airplane company in Ft. Worth, returning home on weekends. He also worked in Michigan in a factory that manufactured airplane and car parts. But the need for a new road near his house prompted J.N. to run for County Commissioner in 1952; an election that he lost receiving only a few votes. But in 1954 his luck changed, and on January 1, 1955, J.N. Lee began his career as County Commissioner.

During his years as Commissioner, J.N. accomplished a great deal. The county had many troubles during his first year of office, but with J.N.'s help a great deal of those problems were eliminated. Having served for 22 years, J.N. left office in 1976, leaving his Precinct with a cash balance of \$20,029.97, with numerous amounts of much needed equipment paid and several important roads improved or newly developed. As J.N. says, "we did the best we could with the little we had."

After retiring from his political career, J.N. returned to his first love, farming. But it wasn't long before the political bug bit again. In 1978, J.N. was serving on the Bogata City Council when the need arose for a Water Superintendent, and J.N. was recommended for the job by his fellow council members. Thus began his 8 1/2 year stretch of many long and thankless hours as he served from 1978 to 1984.

J.N. has made it hard for anyone to fill his shoes. Even today he still plays a major role as a member of the Lions Club, a Mason, and as a deacon of the First Baptist Church. J.N.'s dedication and determination forgetting the job done under any circumstances will always be unforgettable.
