ready in a bad mood! So, instead I sit there and the more I listen to the snapping the more irritated I get! That leaves us both aggravated


I have been known to flee a small room after five or ten minutes of smacking. I've changed theatre seats.



# Country Cooking By Gerrie Bankhead



The Country Cooking Column is coming to you this week from the kitchen of Thelma Warren of Deport. Thelma is the proud grandmother of Valerie Pierce and husband Bill and two children of White Oak and Jim Kunkel and wife Marie and three children of Houston.

She is a member of the United Methodist Church in Deport. Her career consists of being a school teacher at Deport Elementary from 1927-1943 and serving as Principal of the school for seven years. She retired in 1943 when she married the late Ben Warren. Thelma's #1 hobbies are collecting recipes and cookbooks. She says there is no telling just how many recipes she has. She also enjoys cooking, reading, shopping, watching television and playing cards with friends.

Since spring is in the air and fresh

vegetables and fruits will be more abundant, Thelma has chosen two special recipes which will include garden vegetabes. They are baked onions, the recipe coming from a cousin, Elaine Kinsey of San Angelo about a year ago and squash enchiladas, the recipe coming from one of her cookbooks she has collected about three years ago. She is also sharing her Pop-Up Bread recipe which came from a friend, Mrs. Tommy Lawler of Deport, many years ago. The Coffee Cake recipe the small Quiche recipe and the Chicken Divan all came from cookbooks and she has used

#### **Baked Onions** By Thelma Warren

Choose round, squatty onions. Peel and cut into eights. First cut in halves, then quarters, then eights. Holdit carefully as you cut, do not cut all the way through.

Place in baking dish close enough together to prop each one up. Salt and pepper to taste. Pour melted butter or margarine over onions. Add two cups water. Bake at 350 until tender. The size of onions will determine baking time. Fresh onions from garden are very good.

Squash Enchiladas 6-8 yellow squash 1 lb. hot pepper cheese 1 pkg. 10 oz. sharp cheddar cheese 1 kg. (10 count) flour tortillas

1 can cream of mushroom soup 1 carton (8 oz.) sour cream Cook squash until tender with sea-

sonings to taste of chopped onion, garlic powder, accent, salt and pepper. Soften tortillas in oil. On each tortilla, place a heaping tablespoon cooked squash, 1 piece of hot pepper cheese, and table-spoon of shredded cheddar cheese. Roll and place seam side down in slightly oiled 13x9x2 baking dish (may spray baking dish with Pam). Mix 1 can mushroom soup, 1/2 can

water and 8 oz. sour cream. Blend well. Pour over tortillas. Sprinkle more cheddar cheese on top. Bake in preheated 350 oven until bubbly.

Pop-Up Bread 1/2 cup water 1/2 cup (scant) vegetable oil 3 cups sifted all purpose flour 1 pkg. dry yeast 1/4 cup sugar l teaspoon salt

saucepan, scald milk, water and oil. Do not boil. In mixing bowl, mix 1 1/2 cups flour, yeast, sugar, salt and egg. Add heated liquid mixture and beat 2 minutes. Add remaining 1 1/2 cups flour and mix well with wooden spoon. Pour into 2 well-greased 1 lb. coffee can. Cover with lids and letrise. Remove lids when dough almost reaches the tops. Let rise uncovered until cans are full. Bake in pre-heated 350 oven for 30 minutes. Let partially cool in cans.

### Small Quiche 3 oz. cream cheese (soften)

cup flour Blend well. Chiill 1 hour. Shape in 24 balls. Press into muffin tins. Sprinkle with bacon bits.

Filling: 1/2 cup milk 2 beaten eggs l teaspoon salt

dash cayenne

1 teaspoon chopped parsley 1/2 cup grated Swiss cheese
Mix all ingredients well. Fill pastry
shells. Bake 30 minutes at 350. Chicken Divan

4 chicken breasts or thighs, cooked and 1 pkg. frozen broccoli spears, cooked

and drained 1 can cream of chicken soup 1/2 teaspoon curry powder (more if desired)

1/3 cup milk 3/4 cup grated cheese 1/2 cup buttered bread crumbs

Arrange broccoli in baking dish. Top with chicken pieces. Mix soup, milk and curry powder. Pour over chicken and broccoli. Top with grated cheese. Sprinkle buttered crumbs on top. Bake at 400 for 15-20 miniutes

This recipe doubles easily and freezes well. Yield 4 servings. Coffee Cake

cup white sugar tablespoon cinnamon

stick margarine

2 tablespoons brown sugar 1 cup finely chopped nuts Cut biscuits in half. Mix white sugar and cinnamon in bowl. Drop biscuit halves in this and coat well. Put a layer in greased bundt pan. Spoon a little of mixture of margarine, brown sugar and chopped nuts over all. Make another layer of coated biscuits. Sprinkle more of margarine, brown sugar and nut mixture over layer. Make third layer of biscuits. Sprinkle rest of margarine, sugar and nuts. Then sprinkle any sugar and cinnamon mixture left; over all. Bounce pan to settle and to let sugar sift down. Bake in 350 preheated oven for

## Spinal Screening For Bogata Students Is May 6

The Legislature passed a law in 1985 that requires all sixth and ninth graders to be screened for spinal deformities. Early detection of abnormal spinal curvature can prevent serious health problems. This is a problem that may begin during the early adolescent years with an estimated 1 in 10 adolescents having some degree of abnormal curvature. Curves that are detected early may only require periodic observation by a specialist. Moderate curves may require the wearing of a brace, which is usually supervised by an orthopedic specialist. In most cases, the need for major surgery for this deformity can be eliminated through early de-

Spinal screening for Bogata Elementary School, sixth graders, has been scheduled for Wednesday, May

Children will be screened for two types of deformities: scoliosis and kyphosis. Scoliosis is a condition in which the spine is twisted, causing misalignment of the upper body or lower back. This condition can worsen and lead to much pain, as well as complications of the heart and lungs. Kyphosis is an exaggerated rounding of the spine. Progression of these two conditions can often be arrestd if detected early.






