Instantly he attached himself to MY leg, burying his face against my hip and saying, in genuine horror "I'm SCARED".

I put my arms around him and assured him that all was well...it was just make believe.

From then on he kept one sweaty little hand firmly in mine, and we bravely forged onward.

As we went further into the maze everyone made it fine, in spite of "spider webs" tunnel "monsters" and the like.

At the very end there was a low cardboard corridor made from cardboard boxes and floored with semi-inflated air mattresses.

I was making it just fine until the last section. My young friend, still with a tight grip on my hand, was startled by a boar's head lurching out into the tunnel and squealing loudly.

My friend left...I mean to tell you, he bolted.

The only thing was, he forgot to let go of my hand. As tiny as he was he jerked me off my feet and literally dragged me clear of the tunnel!

I don't know where his strength came from. The three youngsters left the haunted house with winged feet, already laughing and boasting about the terrors they had faced. They didn't need us anymore.

Thomas and I, and the adults in the haunted house, were laughing so hard that for a few moments we were helpless.

Finally I picked myself up off the floor and we left too.

We haven't enjoyed anything so much in years!

But, aside from the pleasure, it was touching the automatic trust these kids were willing to place in us. I suppose parents are used to that responsibility and pleasure.

It was a delightful new experience for us, and insight into a child's world.

## Two-Vehicle Accident Sends Cunningham Resident To Hospital

A grinding two vehicle accident at the intersection of Highway 37 and FM 71 in Hagansport Monday afternoon, October 19, sent Wayne Crafton of Cunningham to East Texas Medical Center in Mt. Vernon.

Crafton was in stable condition Tuesday morning at East Texas Medical Center in Tyler, and had been scheduled for surgery. Medical authorities said that he had a broken leg, dislocated jaw, numerous lacerations and undetermined internal injuries.

The accident occurred as Crafton pulled out of B&E Grocery onto Highway 37. A Hart Lumber Company truck from Shreveport, LA was headed north on Hwy. 37. The bumper

of the 18-wheeler hit the right front door of the Chrysler, crushing the inside compartment of the vehicle to 26 1/2 inches wide before the two were pulled apart.

Crafton was pinned in the vehicle and had to be freed by the Mt. Vernon Volunteer Fire Department Rescue Unit with the Jaws of Life.

The North Franklin Volunteer Fire Department was on the scene almost immediately and was attempting to remove the door from Crafton's car so that medical personnel could start working on the victim when the ambulance arrived. Other North Franklin firemen stood by in case there was a fire.

Due to the serious condition of

Crafton, a CareFlite helicopter from East Texas Medical Center in Tyler was enroute before the ambulance reached the hospital in Mt. Vernon.

The driver of the truck said "he just pulled out in the road in front of me and I couldn't get it stopped before we hit". The truck skidded some 155 feet after impact and before coming to rest on the north side of FM 71 and on the east side of Hwy. 37. The intersection of Hwy. 37 and FM 71 was partially blocked for several hours before Department of Public Safety Trooper Scott Lee completed his investigation.

The driver of the truck was not injured in the accident.

## License Renewals Will Require Social Security Cards

Beginning November 1, Texas applying for a driver's license and persons renewing their license or seeking a duplicate will need to show their Social Security card, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Social Security numbers already are required for Commercial Driver's Licenses, which the DPS began issuing in September, 1990.

Only Social Security cards issued by the federal Social Security Administration will be accepted, License

Inspector John Hall said. Applicants for DPS Identification Cards also will be asked for a Social Security card, but it is not a requirement for the ID card, Hall said.

The Inspector said Social Security numbers would not be printed on driver's licenses and were for DPS internal use only.

Signs explaining the new policy will be posted in DPS Driver's License offices across the state, he added.

### Taco Salad

2 lbs. extra lean ground beef  
1/2 teaspoon garlic chips  
2 teaspoons chili powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon cumin  
1/2 teaspoon black pepper

Add ingredients as meat is browning. Then add meat, chips, lettuce, and tomatoes to desired taste. For enchiladas: use meat and spice from above. Take corn tortilla shells 8-12, fill and roll them up. Place in a row in bottom of pyrex dish. Place remaining meat on top. Cover top with grated cheese, cook at 325 until cheese is melted.

### Peanut Butter Ice Cream

3-6 eggs  
1 can Eagle Brand Milk  
1 large can Pet Milk  
2 cups sugar  
1 tablespoon vanilla  
1 cup crunchy peanut butter

Beat eggs until blended, but not foamy. Add sugar, Eagle Brand and peanut butter until blended. On low speed, blend in Pet milk and vanilla. Pour into freezer and fill to line with whole milk. Freeze. Use mixer instead of blender as blender will chip up peanuts.

### Microwave Peanut Patties

2 1/2 cups sugar  
dash of salt  
2/3 cup Karo  
1/3 cup water  
2 cups peanuts  
2 tablespoons butter  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
3-5 drops red food coloring

Begin starting, roast peanuts for 3 minutes in microwave on high. Mix sugar, water and syrup and cook on high for 4 1/2 minutes. Add peanuts, stir and cook for 7 minutes on high. Remove from heat, add butter, vanilla and coloring. Stir until mixture is dull. Spoon into muffin tins coated with Pam or butter. Makes about 30 patties.

### Microwave Peanut Brittle

1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup white corn syrup

Mix in 1 1/2 qt. casserole and cook in microwave on high for 4 minutes. Add 1 cup peanuts roasted and salted. Stir into syrup mixture and microwave at high for 3-5 minutes, until light

brown.

Add 1 teaspoon butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Stir into syrup mixture and microwave at high for 1-2 minutes.

Add 1 teaspoon baking soda.

Stir into syrup mixture until light and foamy. Pour mixture onto lightly greased cookie sheet or unbuttered non-stick coated cookie sheet. Let cool, break into small pieces and store in airtight container.

### Old Fashioned Coconut Pie

1 cup coconut  
1 cup milk  
1 pinch flour  
3 eggs, beaten  
1 cup sugar  
1 pinch salt  
1/2 stick butter, browned

Mix above ingredients in order and pour into uncooked pie shell. Dust nutmeg over top if desired. Bake at 350 until set, about 30 minutes.

### Watergate

1 small can crushed pineapple  
1 pkg. Pistachio Jello instant pudding and pie filling  
2 cups small marshmallows  
1 large carton Cool Whip  
1 cup chopped pecans

Mix together and refrigerate.

### Strawberry Congealed Salad

1 small can crushed pineapple  
1 pkg. Strawberry jello

Heat and dissolve jello and let cool. Add:  
1 carton cottage cheese  
1 carton Cool Whip  
1 cup chopped pecans

Refrigerate. You can substitute with:  
1 small can mandarin oranges and 1 pkg. orange jello.

### Chicken and Spaghetti

1 stewed chicken  
1 lb. spaghetti  
1 #2 can tomatoes  
2 oz. pimientos  
1 onion, chopped  
1/4 to 1/2 lb. Velveeta cheese  
1 can mushroom soup

Remove cooked chicken from liquid, cool and bone. Add spaghetti pimientos and onion to liquid and cook until tender. Add more water if needed. Add tomatoes and chicken, when warm add sliced cheese and heat until thoroughly warmed. Add mushroom soup.

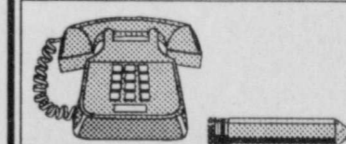
### Velma Parker Dies October 16

Coach Charles Swann said that "I'm proud of these kids, they never quit trying, they gave one hundred percent".

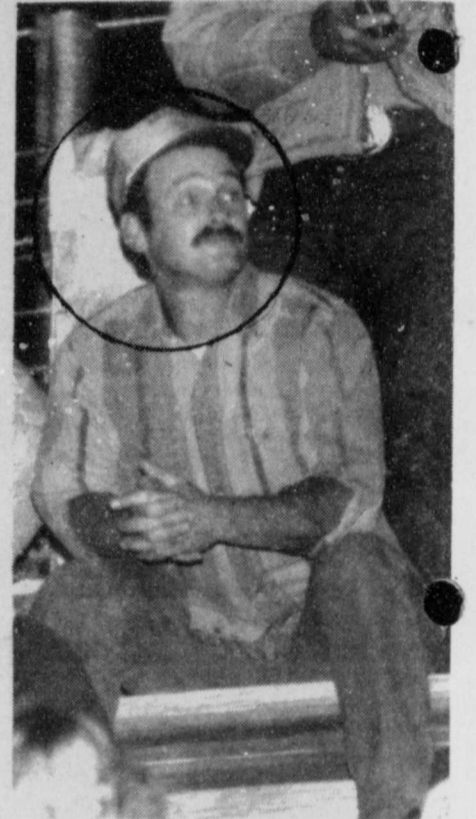

The clinic will be conducted October 26 from 9-11:30 and 1-2:30 at 1300 Highway 37 North, Clarksville, Texas.

Future clinic dates will be announced. Parents may call the clinic for an appointment for their child, (903)572-9877, or arrive on a walk-in basis.

The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children who meet the family income guidelines, beginning at two months of age. Immunizations offered include Measles/Mumps/Rubella, Oral Polio, Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis and Tetanus/diphtheria. The Haemophilus Influenzae type b vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 2 months and 60 months. The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should the parent or legal guardian have questions, please contact the above noted field office staff.

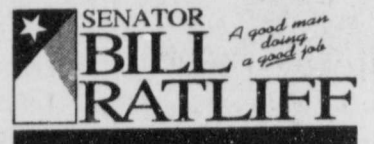
