Two Incidents Leave Three Dead

Two separate incidents, one a shooting which left one dead and the other a case of two bodies being hidden in woods left residents of the north eastern Lamar County-North Western Red River County area shocked and dismayed.

Wednesday, November 18 forty-five year old Richardson man, Dennis Dale Morrison was killed with a single gunshot to the chest after an argument with a neighbor near Post Oak Community.

A thirty-two year old Dallas man was taken into custody, but released without being charged as it appears that the shooting was in self defense. The case will go before the Grand Jury soon.

The incident began in mid-afternoon when Morrison, who has a cabin on property north-east of Post Oak, began burning off land to discourage deer hunting, according to Lamar County Sheriff's Department.

His neighbor and two others, were in a cabin about 100 yards into the woods, came out to see what was burning.

Reports indicate that the neigh-

bors have had "words in the past" and apparently both men came out armed with pistols.

Morrison, according to Chief Deputy Bob Carico, then threatened the other man and an argument occurred. Reports indicated that Morrison reached to where his gun was holstered at his back and was then shot by the neighbor.

The body was taken to the Southwestern Institute of Forensic Science at Dallas for autopsy.

In a much more bizarre incident two bodies were discovered Thursday afternoon, November 19 in the woods in Red River, northwest of Detroit.

Two Marion County residents have been charged with one count of capital murder each and are being held without bond in Marion County Jail in relation to the crime.

The two murders appear to be part of a drug deal gone sour.

Authorities have been looking for twenty-seven year old Charles Edward Warlaw since his parents reported him missing. He was last seen leaving the home of his girlfriend on

the 13th.

The other dead man was Cedric Darryl Baker, age twenty-nine of Daingerfield.

Texas Ranger Howard Dunham of Texarkana received a tip where the bodies could be found.

He contacted Ranger Eddie Almond.

Red River County Sheriff Bob Storey, Deputy John Penny and Ranger Almond went to a road about a mile and a half from Detroit. The bodies were in the woods, with leaves on the body and a small amount of brush cut and put over the bodies, according to Almond.

Early investigation indicates the two were killed on Lake O' the Pines at a private nightclub, and the bodies disposed of near Detroit.

Warlaw apparently had multiple gunshot wounds to the abdomen and Baker a single gunshot wound to the head.

The bodies were sent to Southwestern Institute of Forensic Science of Forensic Science in Dallas for autopsies.

When I arrived, four year old Julie was watching her Saturday morning cartoons. Mary's grandparents, who live in Tucson, AZ, had just left for home. They have been visiting for a number of days and Mary expressed how much she had enjoyed their visit.

She has two sisters and a brother in Colorado and a younger sister in Missouri. Her father is also in Missouri. During their visit, she learned that her brother and one of her sisters would be moving to Dallas soon. She was pleased that they will now be closer.

Mary enjoys baking pies. She says that their favorite meals are Mexican food, and meals centered around roast beef. Dave enjoys beef, and he likes her pies.

I was really pleased to see the pie crust recipe, especially after I learned that it made six crusts and it could be frozen in the pie plates until needed.

Mary says that she enjoys working with crafts, but she also very much enjoys anything that takes her outside. She and Dave enjoy camping, and just going sightseeing.

The family attends the First Assembly of God Church in Clarksville, where Mary plays the bass guitar and sings. She said that Dave taught her to play the guitar when they first married.

Sour Creme Lemon Pie By Mary Pirtle

1 cup sugar
5 T. cornstarch
4 egg yolks
1 cup milk
1/4 cup lemon juice
1 T. grated lemon rind
1/4 cup margarine
1 cup sour cream

In double boiler, combine sugar, cornstarch, yolks, milk, juice and rind in that order. Stir frequently until thick, add margarine and sour cream, pour in baked pie shell and top with beaten egg whites.

Pumpkin Bread

16 oz. can pumpkin
1 cup oil
4 eggs
2/3 cups water
1 cup nuts
2 3/4 cups flour
2 t. soda
2 t. cinnamon
1/2 t. cloves
3 cups sugar
2 t. nutmeg
1 1/2 t. salt
1 t. allspice

Add pumpkin mix to dry, mix until well blended. Bake in bundt pan of 350 for one hour.

Pie Crust

4 cups flour
1 T. salt
1 t. baking powder
2 T. sugar

Stir with fingers well!! Add 2 cups Crisco to dry mixture and make it mealy. In another cup, measure and mix together:
1/2 cup water
1 egg

Work into the dry mixture and roll out dough, place in pie plates. It makes six crusts. I put wax paper between each crust and stack in the freezer in pie plates. When I'm in a hurry, all that's left to do is the filling!

Mexican Chicken

Boil 4 chicken breasts until tender and de-bone. In another pan, saute in 2 T. butter an onion, green pepper. Add: 1 can mushroom soup
1 8 oz. jar picante sauce
1 can diced rotel tomatoes
2 t. chili powder
chicken breasts

Simmer until it comes to a boil. Layer a 9x12 baking dish with corn tortillas, cut in quarters. Pour half of the meat mixture, add another layer of tortillas, then the remaining meat mixture. Layer with cheese, cover and place in 400 oven for 20 minutes.

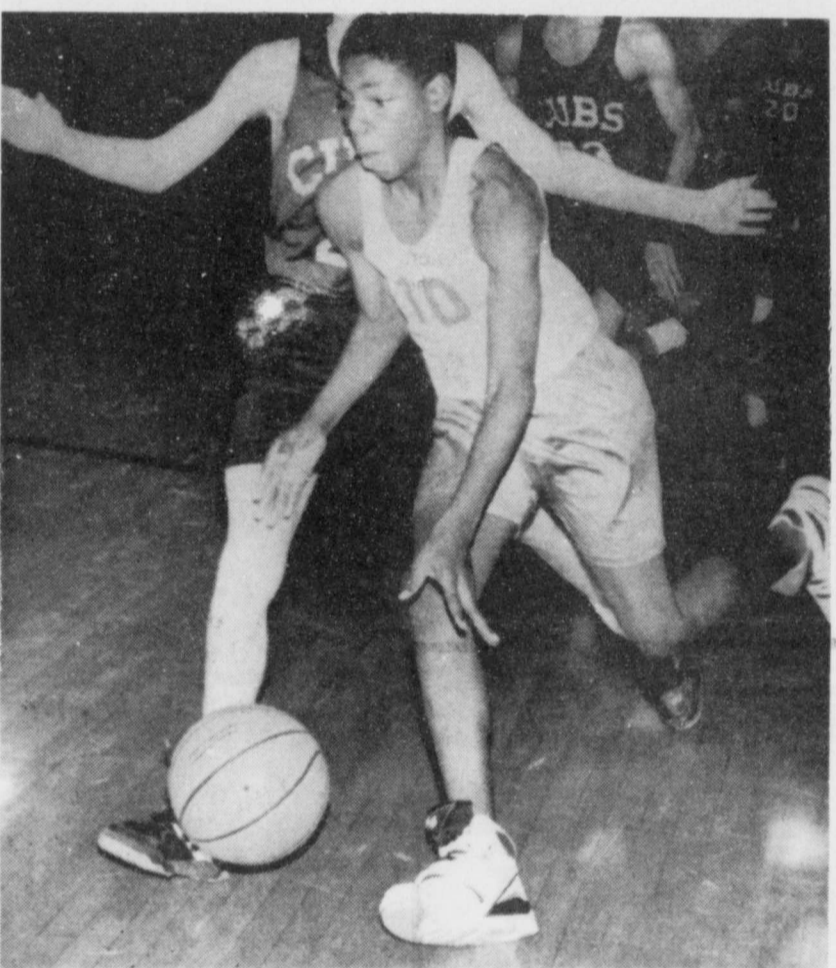

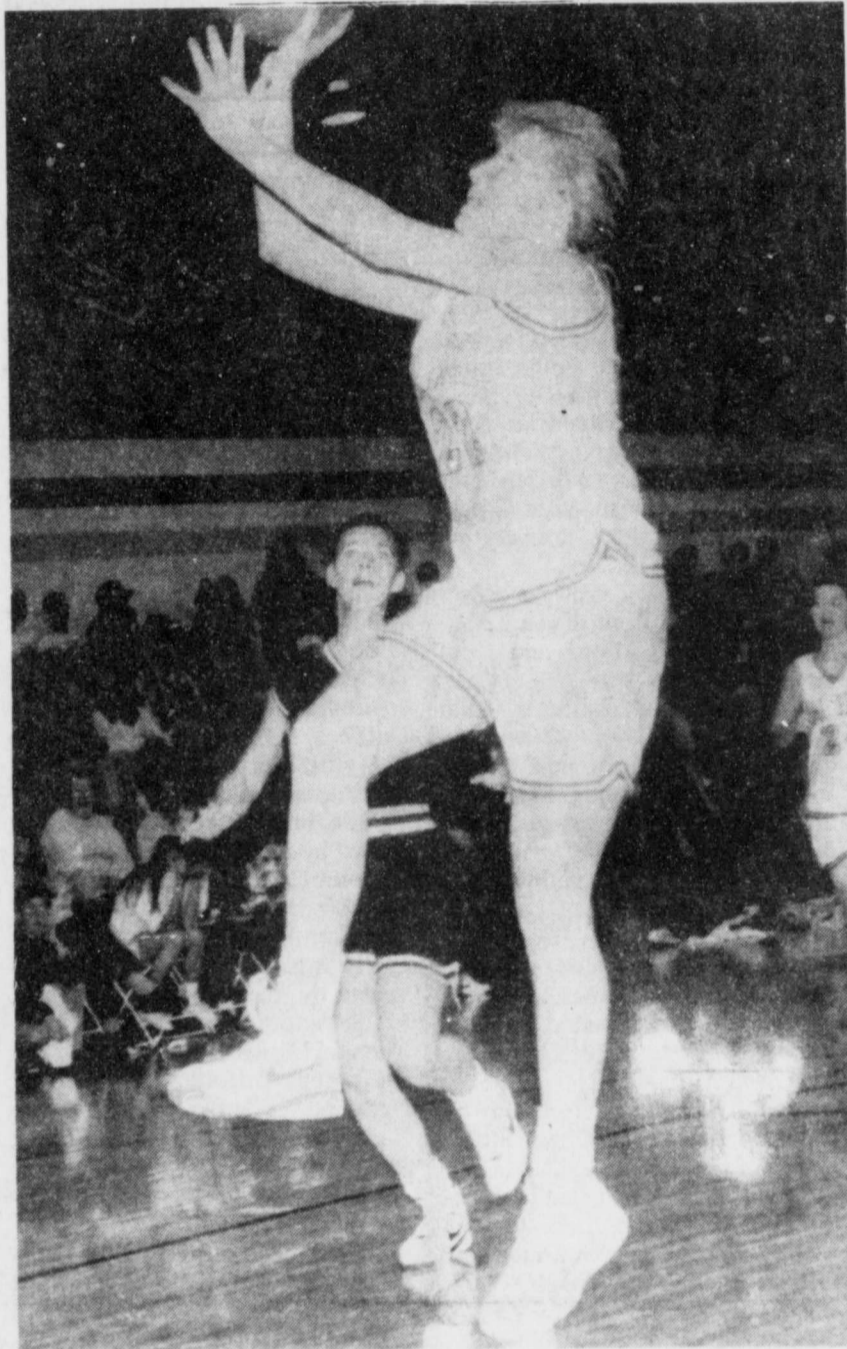
On Friday, the Rivercrest JV girls, Varsity girls and Varsity boys traveled to Mt. Vernon.
