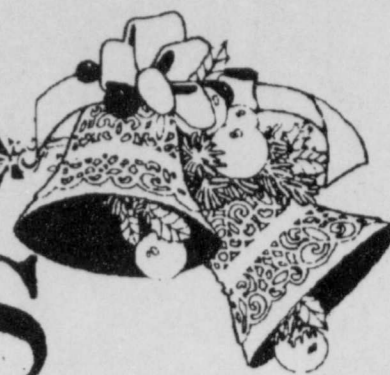

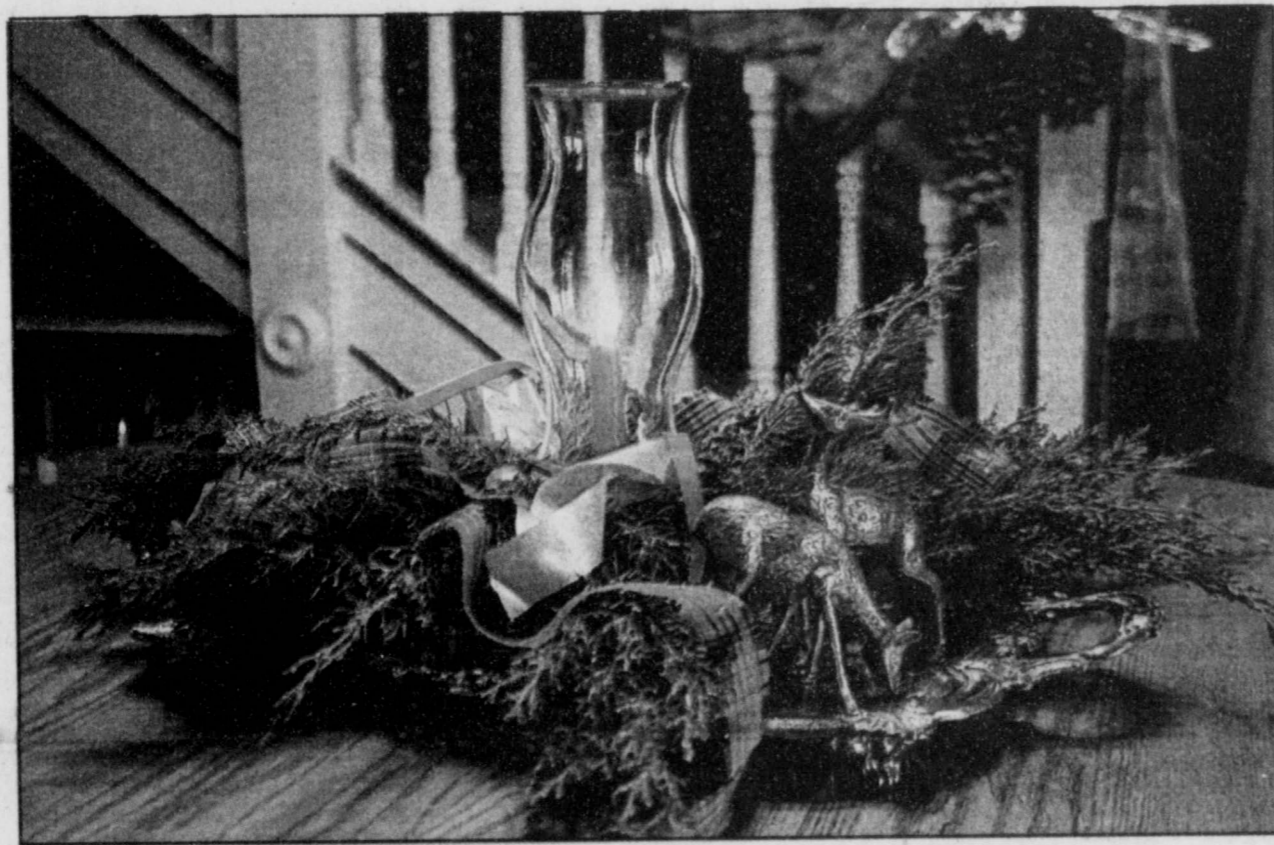

Death, Destruction Result From Firetruck Theft

The Deport Volunteer Firemen met Monday night to lay careful plans on what to do in case of a major structure fire within the city limits.

This was after the city's pumper truck was completely totalled in the early hours of last Friday, December 19, leaving one dead and an investigation ongoing.

Dead is Gaylor Courtney Frazier, age 19, of Deport, who apparently died of internal injuries suffered when he was thrown from the pumper truck after it was stolen that same night.

The vehicle was taken from the Deport Volunteer Fire Station, with the bay doors being lowered and locked behind the vehicle.

The crash occurred north of Deport on a county road, as the truck maneuvered a series of turns in heavy fog, then left the road on a straight stretch. According to DPS Trooper Don Watson the vehicle "essentially left the road to the right, striking two pine trees, causing the truck to turn over to the left". The vehicle went into a broad slide and ejected Frazier.

The fire truck came to a stop in the yard of Ken and Pam Hunt.

Investigation continues into the possibility that there may have been others involved in the incident.

The tragedy leaves the city of Deport facing several serious problems.

The pumper truck was totalled, and it is the fire truck which enables the city of Deport to meet insurance "key rates" which give a substantially lower insurance rate to home-

owners. Fortunately for the city, the new truck purchased three years ago will serve as effective fire protection until a pumper truck that will meet insurance requirements can be located and financed. The "new truck" comes very close to meeting specifications, and was purchased to serve as a back up unit to the pumper truck as well as fighting fire outside the city limits. (3/4ths of all fires Deport responds to are outside the city limits). When the department decided they needed a backup they envisioned breakdowns, not total destruction, however.

Mayor Charles Foster has contacted the Ark-Tex of Governments and officials in Austin and Washington on the possibility of obtaining grants to help finance another pumper since insurance will not cover the full cost of replacement.

The town and the firemen are shocked by the theft and death.

In addition to the destruction of the vehicle itself, several lengths of hose, extremely expensive air packs, drafting lines which had just been purchased this year, flashlights, ladders, and other expensive items were damaged or destroyed in the crash.

Although this is the first incident in over forty years of the fire station, plans are underway to provide a system that will deter theft from ever happening again.

"We've just never had this kind of problem" Fire Chief Duane Glover says sadly.

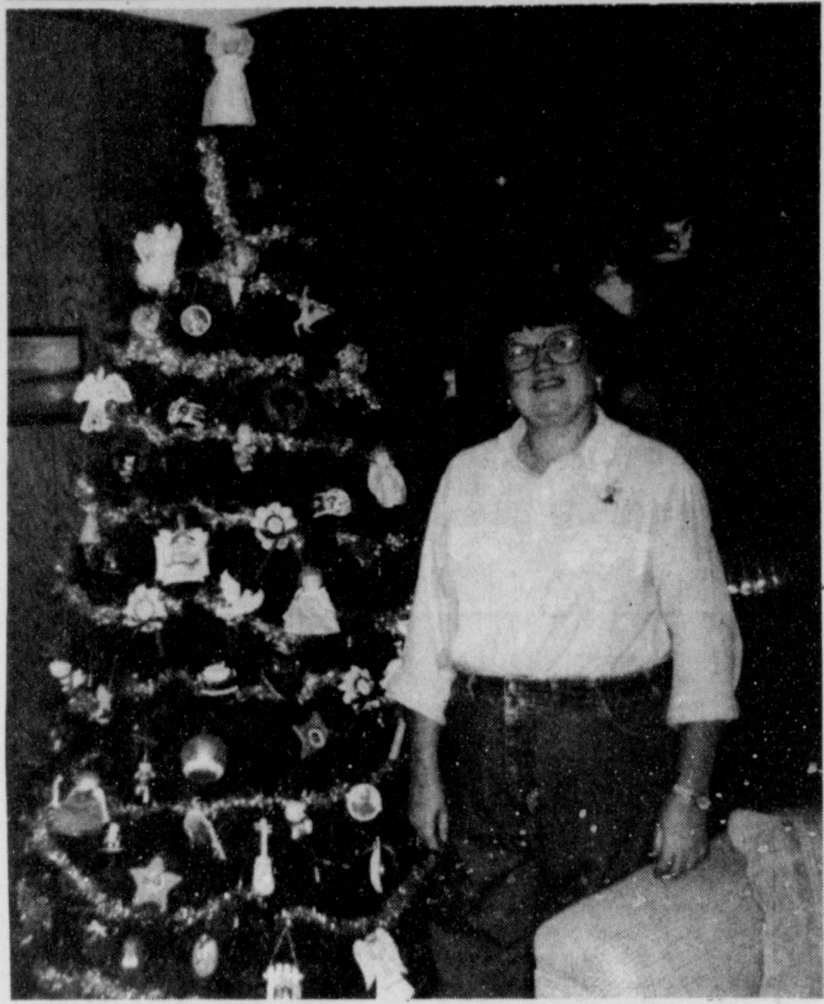

When I went to visit in the home of Gerlyn and Jerry Gray this week, it was muggy, rainy and just plain yucky outside. I went inside their home and it was just like a Christmas City.

It was so bright and warm that I couldn't have had a sour thought if I had wanted to. Gerlyn and her daughter, Jessica Hines were there. We had a nice visit. Jessica and husband Danny live in Clarksville. He is self-employed and she will soon be out of school. She is anxious to get on with the business of teaching elementary students. The Grays have two other daughters; Jennifer Reeder and husband Rusty, who live in Dallas. She is a CPA and he is in customer relations at NationsBank. Judy Holt and husband Harold live in Cuthand. She is an RN at Red River General Hospital and Harold works at UARCO.

Gerlyn works at the Elementary School in Bogata. She assists with the K-8 Special Education group. Jerry is employed at B&W.

Gerlyn is an active member of the First Baptist Church. She also goes to Red River Haven daily to visit her mother, Mrs. Clara Lowe. Jerry and Gerlyn also enjoy camping.

When I called Gerlyn to ask if I could feature her in a column, she told me that she doesn't cook. This is the answer that almost everyone I call gives me. I know that someone cooks, so I decided to investigate the subject. I asked Gerlyn what they ate if she didn't cook. She said that actu-

ally, she cans and freezes vegetables all summer. Then all they have to do is fix a roast or some other kind of meat and maybe a salad and they are ready to eat. She also cooks Mexican food, and Jerry grills outside. Jerry also does the cooking outside for fish fries. I was served a wonderful piece of coconut cake as we talked.

I have now solved the mystery of all these people who don't cook. When I ask them about their cooking, they automatically think I'm asking for something special or fancy. This is not the case. We sometime stake for granted all of these palin, tasty meals that we all cook daily. Ladies, we're not giving ourselves enough credit.

Gerlyn makes crafts like you wouldn't believe. She crochets, quilts and sews, just to name a few.

Since her father was with TP&L, and was transferred often, Gerlyn attended 13 different schools. She graduated from Mt. Pleasant High.

When I left, I had gifts. The picante sauce is delicious, and my grandchildren enjoyed the Christmas Tree cookies. I was given a recipe for the picante sauce but they wouldn't give me the cookie recipe. I begged a bite from one of the kids, and it was delicious. It's not that I don't have cookie recipes galore. It's just that it drives me crazy when someone refuses to give me a recipe. I'll never sleep again.

Picante Sauce By Gerlyn Gray

Combine:
2 quarts fresh tomatoes
2 cups chopped onions
1 3/4-2 cups chopped jalapeno peppers
2 tsp. garlic powder
1 cup vinegar
1/4 cup sugar
2 tsp. salt

Cook 1 hour over low heat, covered. Stir occasionally. Seal in hot jars. Makes 4-5 pints. Temperature of sauce depends on how hot jalapeno peppers are. Adjust to taste. Omitting 1/4 cup sugar makes it taste hotter.

Aunt Ruth's Coconut Cake

Grease and flour bundt pan or two loaf pans.
Cream 1 cup shortening and two cups sugar. Add 5 eggs, beaten; 1/2 cup milk; 2 cups all-purpose flour; 1/2 tsp. baking powder; 1/4 tsp. salt; 1 tsp. vanilla; 1 T. coconut extract.

Mix well and bake at 325 for 1 hour. Moist, delicious, freezes well. While cake is hot and in pan, poke holes in the top with the handle of a wooden spoon. Mix 1 cup sugar; 1 cup water and 1 T. coconut extract. Bring this mixture to a rolling boil. Slowly pour glaze over cake. Let cool for 10 minutes. Remove from pan and sprinkle with confectioners sugar.

Pepper Jelly

1-6 oz. pkg. Certo
1 cup hot peppers (grind and then measure)
3/4 cup bell peppers, green or red (grind and then measure)
5 1/2 cups granulated sugar
1 1/2 cups cider vinegar
Mix peppers, sugar and vinegar. Bring to a boil. Boil 3 minutes, stirring. Remove from heat, add Certo. Mix well. Fill jars, seal with lids and rings. Cool.

Brown Sugar Brownies

Beat 4 eggs. Blend with 1 box brown sugar; 1 pkg. butter-milk bisquit mix; 1 stick margarine. Add 1/2 cup chopped pecans; 1 tsp. vanilla.

Pour into 9x13" pan, greased and floured. Bake 30 minutes at 350. Cut into squares and serve warm. These are moist and chewy.

Cream Cheese Mints

1-3 oz. cream cheese (room temp) coloring and flavoring as desired
2 1/2 cups confectioners sugar granulated sugar
Blend cream cheese until softened. Add color and flavor. Gradually blend in confectioners sugar until of pie dough consistency. Pinch off small piece of dough and roll into small sized ball. Coat with granulated sugar. Press into candy mold.

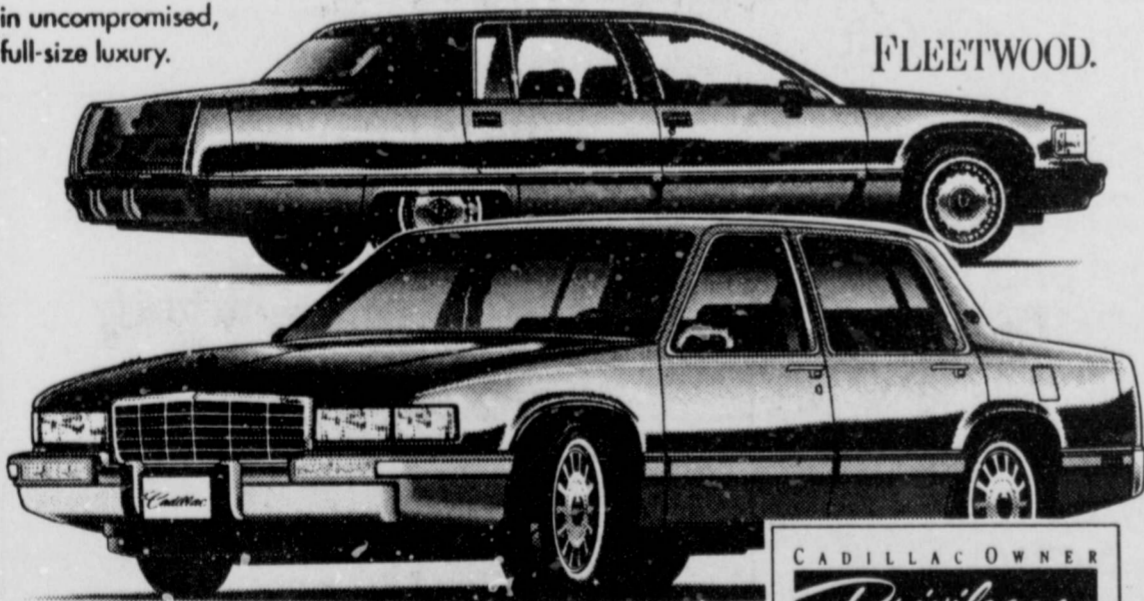

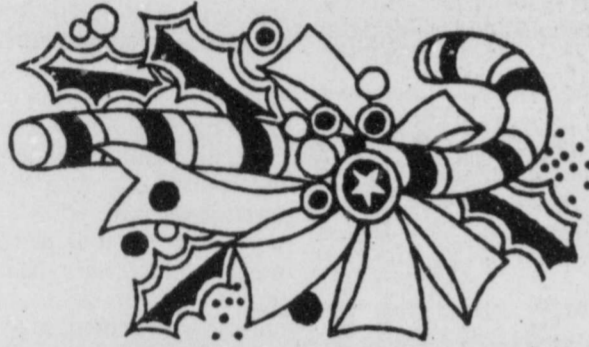
back and forth with the ladies steadily losing ground.

Social Security Notes

 Social Security Fraud... One of the main missions of the Social Security Administration is to pay the right benefit check in the right amount to the right person at the right time. Social Security accomplishes this mission, but our efforts are occasionally hindered when dishonest people attempt to commit fraud.

In Fiscal Year 1991 there were 1,066 convictions of Social Security Fraud. These convictions ranged from individuals attempting to collect the Social Security checks of beneficiaries who had died, to persons who file false claims for Social Security benefits.

Acts of fraud affect each Social Security program differently. Following are some examples:

The disability insurance program and the retirement and survivors insurance program are defrauded by claimants who make false statements and conceal work activity that affects their initial or continuing entitlement.

For example, a Wisconsin man was investigated for concealing his work earnings so he could illegally collect disability payments. Further investigation showed that the man worked under his son's Social Security Number and earned \$20,000 in wages while receiving disability benefits. After conviction for concealment, he was sentenced to 12 months in prison and ordered to pay \$72,462 in restitution.

The Supplemental Security Income Program is defrauded by persons who file false claims, conceal assets or resources, or make false statements and conceal events affecting entitlement.

A North Carolina man was investigated for concealing his mother's death and forging her signature on her SSI benefit checks. A furniture store reported that someone attempted to cash a SSI check issued to a woman they knew had died. Further investigation showed that the son filed false statements with Social Security each year to continue his mother's eligibility. He was convicted of check fraud and forgery, sentenced to 6 months home detention, placed on 5 years probation, and ordered to pay \$37,053 in restitution.

Social Security Number fraud occurs when individuals submit false applications for false applications for SSNs, false benefit claims, misuses SSNs to establish false identities

Four members of a Massachusetts family were investigated for misusing SSNs and filing fraudulent benefit claims. They collected more than \$100,000 in unemployment benefits. Investigations also showed that they collected \$58,000 in SSI benefits.

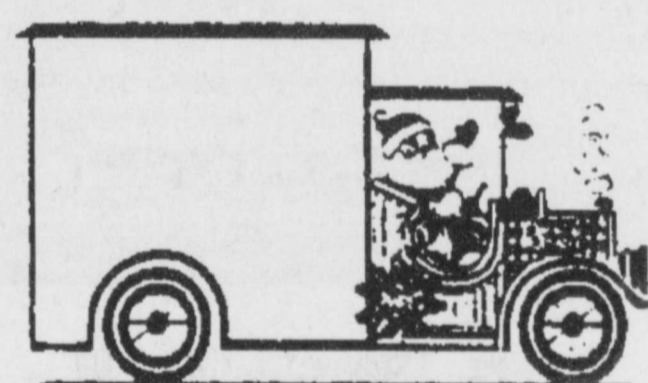

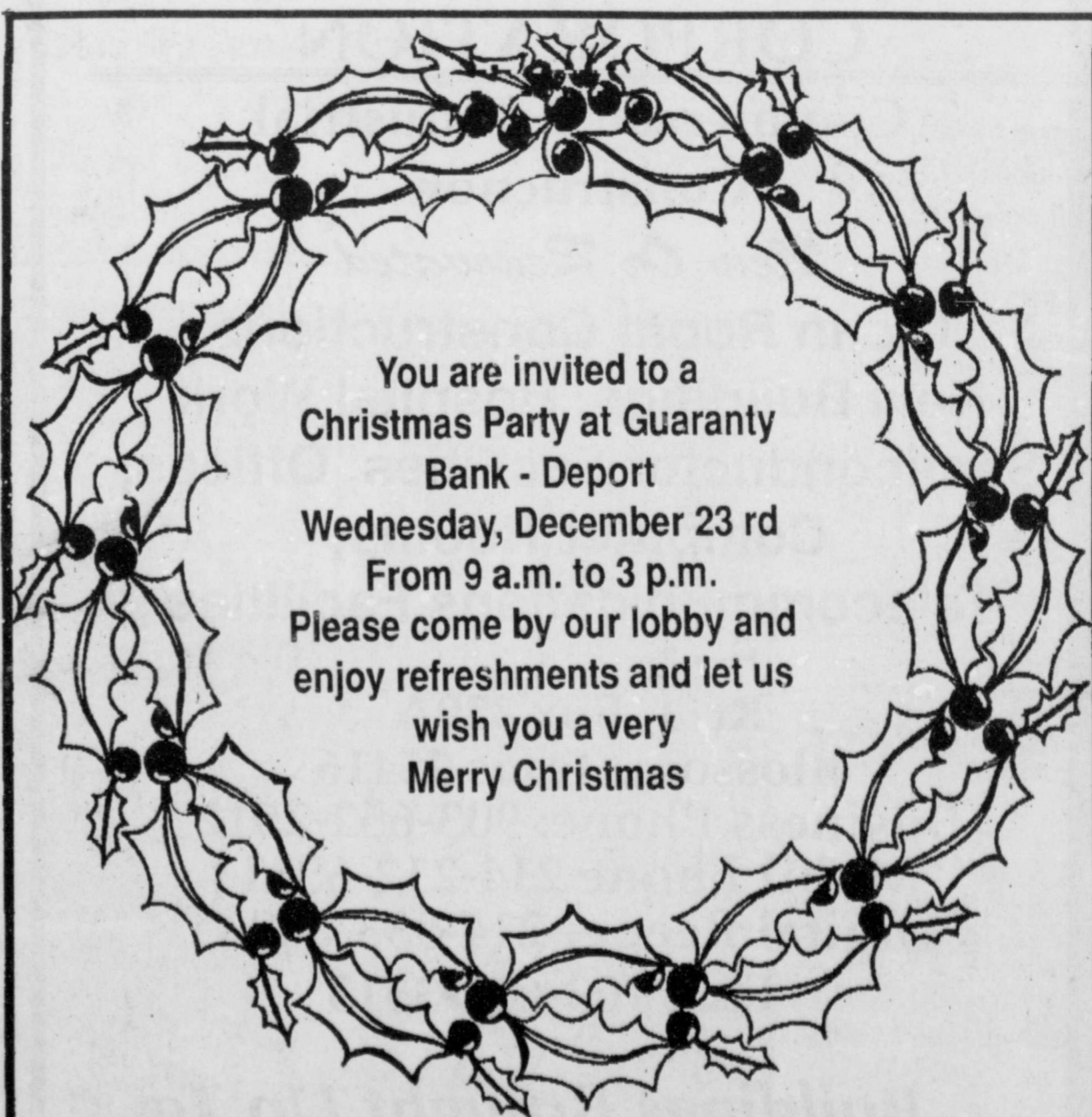
