## City Of Bogata And Lions

### Club Offers Reward For Arrest Of Park Vandals

The Bogata City Council met Monday, August 9, 1993 at 5 P.M. with all members present.

Mayor Mildred Eudy called the meeting to order. Councilman Harbison gave the invocation. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, and the paying of city bills was approved. There were no presentations or old business.

In the new business segment, Dooley Plumbing Company was the successful bidder as contractor for 1990 TCDP amendment (sewer Hwy 37 N.) with a bid of \$31,574.67. Contract w/KSA, Inc. to provide engr.

service for the City's 1992 Texas Community Development Program was approved. The council tabled Red River Appraisal District's Resolution to expand board to seven members, and the resolution authorizing appeal of PUC Docket #10200, TNP rate case. They passed a contribution to TML (\$14.21) for TX Water Quality Standards review, okayed waiver of "Payment in Lieu of Taxes" from Housing Authority - 1 year, okayed purchase of Superior Water signs (this is insisted on by the state), considered Fire Words Ordinance and decided to amend at another date.

okayd \$100.00 which will be matched by Lion's Club for a reward for the identity and arrest of vandals at Thomas Park. Water leaks in the City were discussed, and reported to be fixed. The buying of trees for Thomas Park will be turned over to the Park Board. Water Superintendent, Wyatt Bush was authorized to hook up houses to the new larger water line as he has time. The Council urges citizens to call if they see a street light out or a water leak.

At the suggestion of Mayor W.T. Harbison the council voted to amend the Fireworks Ordinance within the city limits of Bogata.

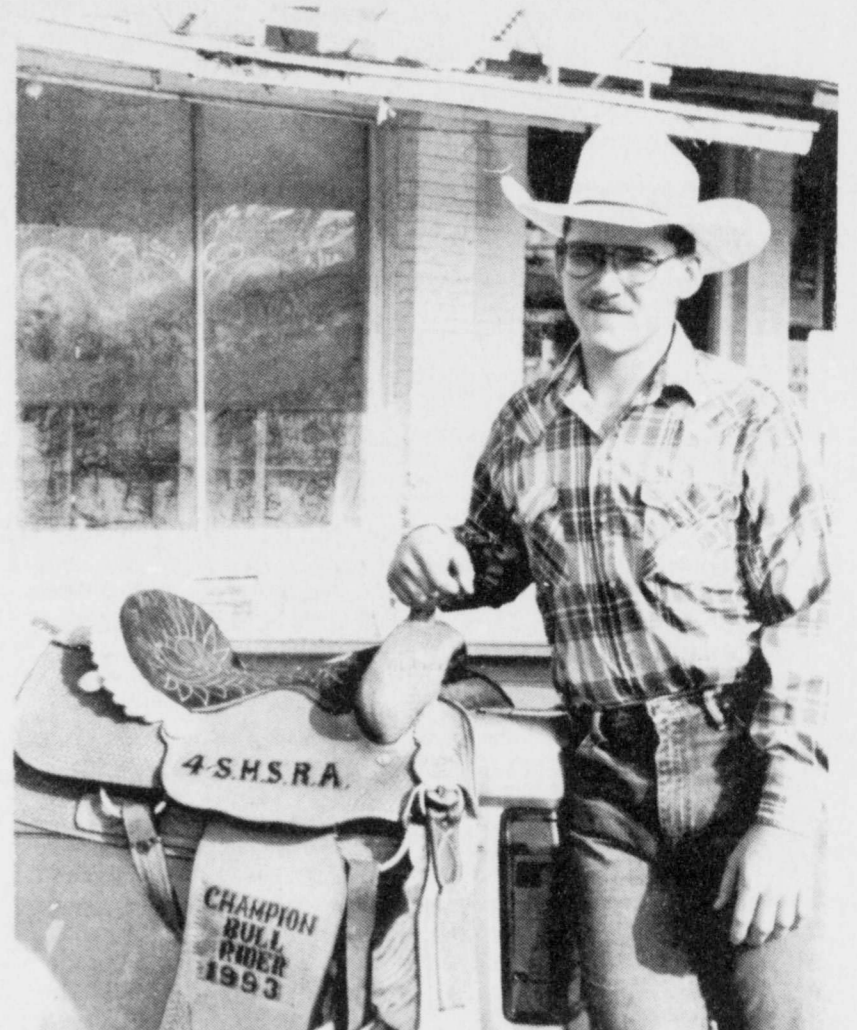
Bogata Lions Club will meet the first and third Thursdays of each month at 7 pm.

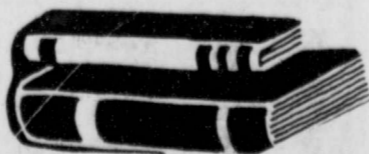

**Chicken Enchiladas**  
By Hazel Vaughan

1 medium onion chopped  
3 Tbsp. Butter  
1 can cream of chicken soup\*  
1 can cream of mushroom soup\*  
1 cup chicken broth\*  
\*Mix these three together  
1 small can green chiles (chopped)  
1-2 to 3 lb chicken cooked and boned  
1 pkg. corn tortillas  
1 lb longhorn cheese grated

Saute onion and chiles in butter. Add soups and chicken. In a large baking dish, place layers of soups, tortillas, and cheese and repeat with cheese on top of casserole. Cook 30 minutes at 350 degrees. let set 10 minutes before serving.

**Rich Chocolate Cake**  
2 1/2 cups sugar

1 cup shortening  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
2 whole eggs  
2 1/2 cups flour  
1/2 cup cocoa  
1 cup buttermilk  
2 teaspoon baking soda and  
3/4 cups boiling water mixed  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Mix all ingredients together and bake at 350 degrees until done

**Icing for Rich Chocolate Cake**

1/2 cup cocoa  
2 sups sugar  
2/3 cup milk  
1 stick oleo  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Put first 4 ingredients in pan, bring to boil and stir constantly. Boil 2 minutes, and take off fire. Add vanilla, and beat until slightly thick. Pour on cake.

J.W. Stinson's football season in Forney, TX early last year and so did his hopes of gaining a scholarship at a four-year school. He tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee on November 13 during Forney's third play. Instead of spending the off season weighing offers, the two-time all district lineman was forced to spend it making offers by selling himself and rehabilitating the knee. With the help of his parents, Jackie and Katy, he found a place to play. SMU asked if he'd be interested in walking on, but the Stinsons felt he'd get more of an opportunity at a junior college. He found his best bet was the junior college route, and on June 23 he signed with Navarro in Corsicana and will report to practice on August 14. He toyed with a lot of defenders on his way to being selected as a first team all district and all county lineman his senior year, but the fun was replaced by hard work as Stinson

began trying to come back from major knee surgery. The Stinsons felt they were in good hands with Dr. Pat Evans, the former team doctor for the Dallas Cowboys, performing the surgery. The knee, so far, looks good, with only a pair of four inch scars, two small dots, where the arthroscopic camera was inserted, and some slight puffiness advertising the November mishap. He's anxious to prove he belongs at a four year college, plus something else. "I've got an uncle that told me I couldn't play with 'em, so I wanna prove him wrong, plus a bunch of other people that doubted me." He's been lifting weights, running two miles a day and has full mobility in his leg. The next step is regaining confidence in the repaired knee. In the end, Stinson and his family feel that everything has worked out for the best. They just hope that continues.

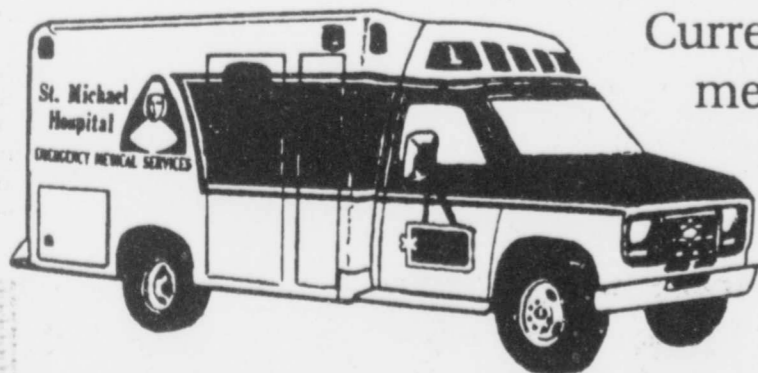

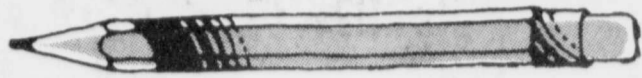

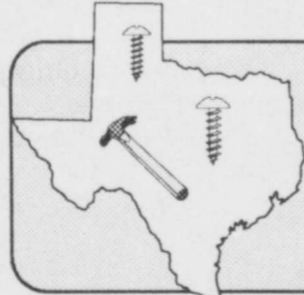

State Boot Camp

You probably have heard of boot camp but wondered what it is and who is eligible to participate in the program.

A district judge can sentence someone to the institutional division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (prison) and retain his jurisdiction for 90 days. After 75 days, but before the 90 days after the convicted person is received into custody, the judge of that court that imposed the sentence may place the person on community supervision (probation) and recommend placement of the person in the state boot camp. A court may recommend a person for placement in the state boot camp program only if:

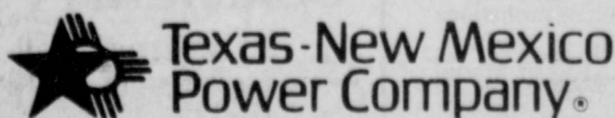
- 1: the person is otherwise eligible for community supervision;
- 2: the person is 17 years of age or older but younger than 26 years;
- 3: the person is physically and mentally capable of participating in a program that requires strenuous physical activity;
- 4: the person is not convicted of an offense punishable as a state jail felony.

This program is available for the younger offender who demonstrates a desire for help and who in the opinion of the court, may be salvaged with the help of the State Boot Camp Program.

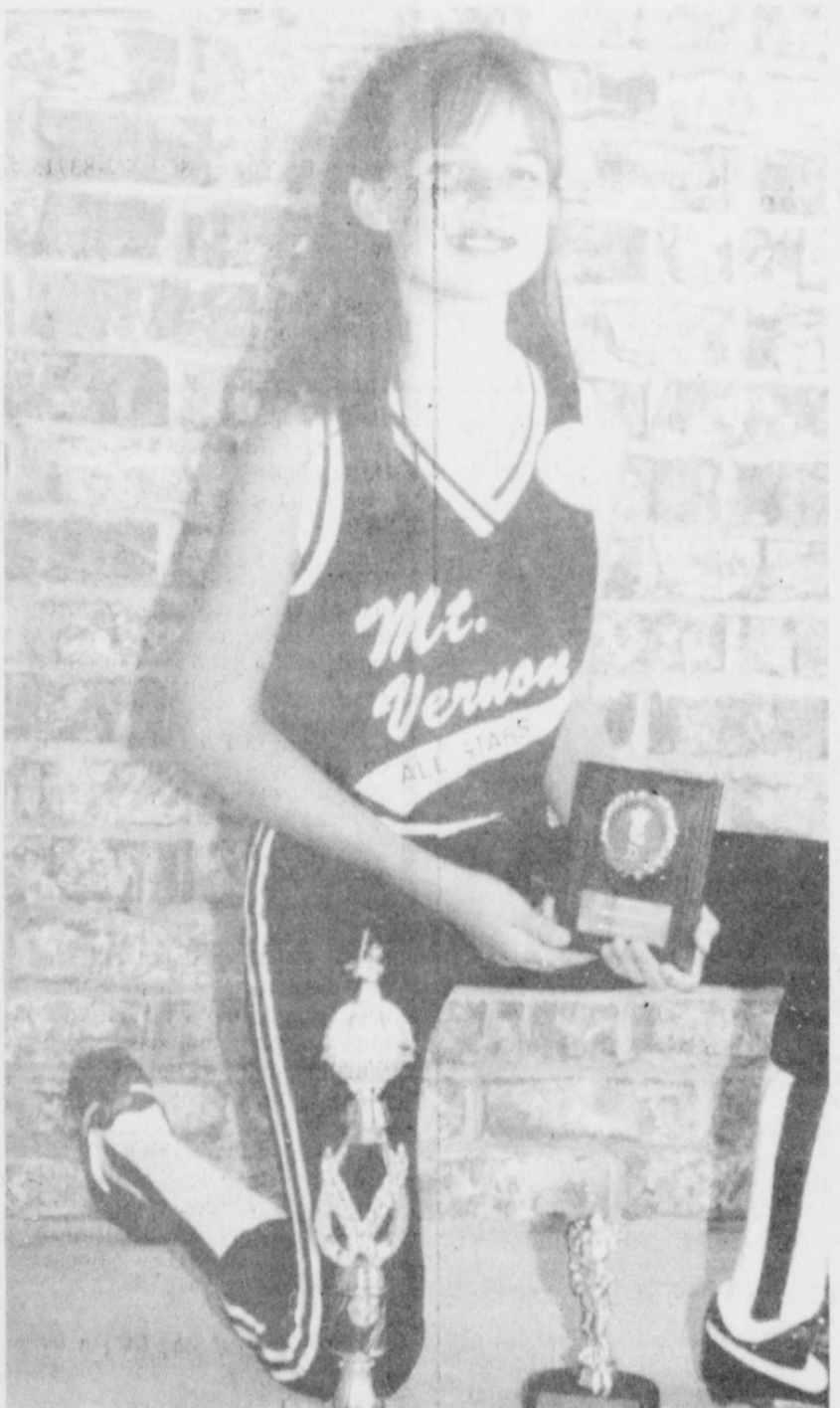

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 office, announced plans today for the continuation of the on-going immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations.

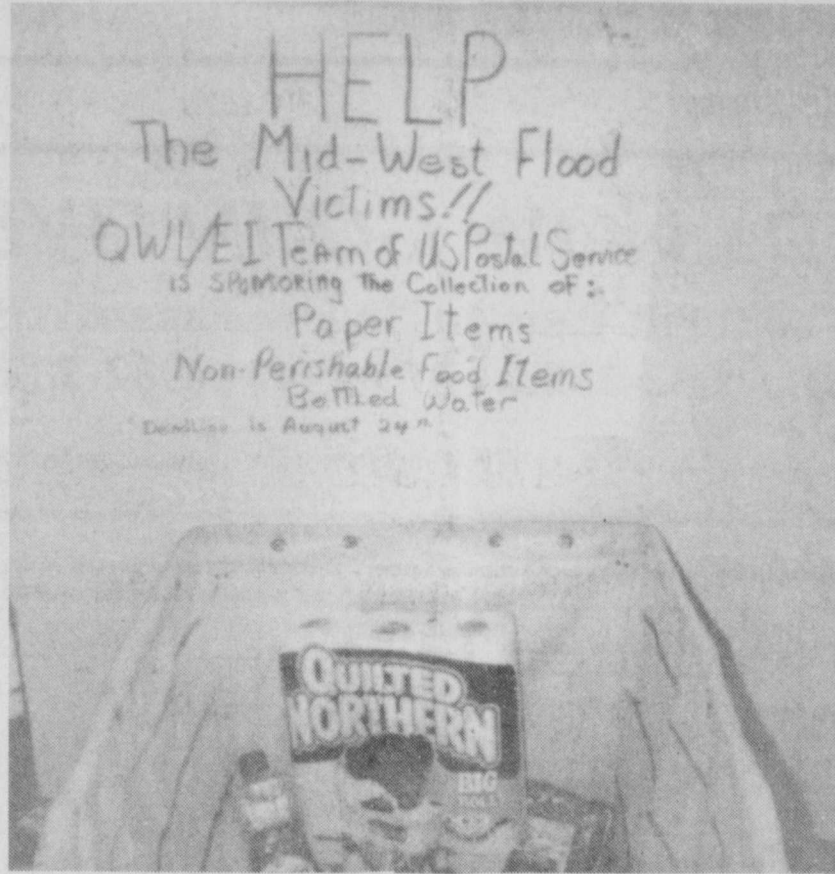
The next clinic will be held August 19.

Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. 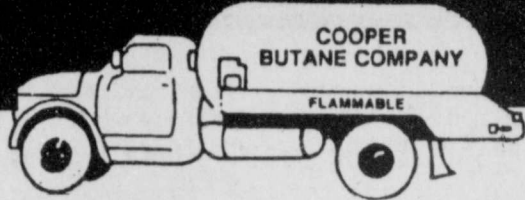
