Then there was the one about "flying and flapping...." well, you are bound to be beginning to get the picture!

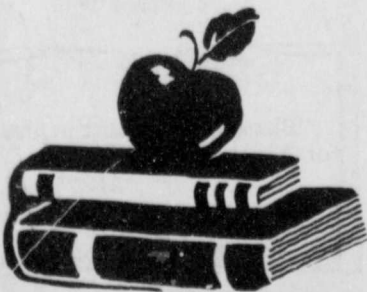
No bouquets of flowers or "You are a special person" for me. No tender verses or tear-jerking prose!

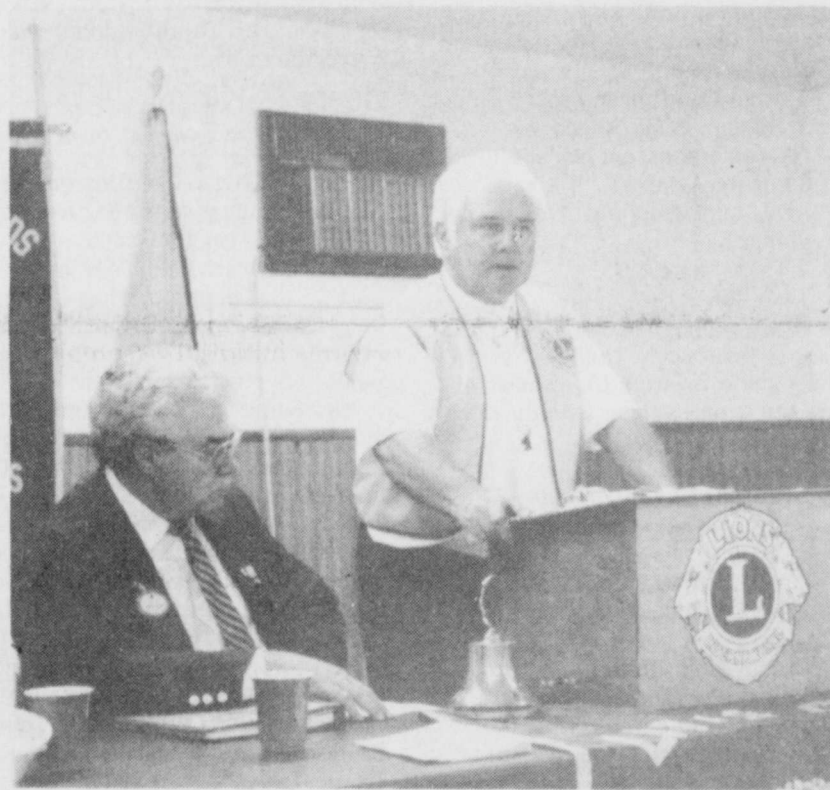

## Support Group Donates To New Library

On the second Monday of each month at 7 p.m. a group gets together at the Paris Library, and for one hour they cry, hug and heal each other. This group is the Bereaved Parents Support Group. "Last year, I highlighted 71 obituaries in the Paris paper alone that listed a parent survivor," said Irene Bryant, member and sometimes group leader. "Most people think that the bereaved parents are only for the parents of young children. That is not so. The loss of a child is overwhelming, regardless of age." Mrs. Bryant's son, Scott, was killed in an automobile accident in

1989. The group has a monthly newsletter that they send to bereaved parents. The newsletter is filled with stories about the loss of a child, articles on ways to work through grief and personal accounts by parents telling of how they managed to cope. They have an annual picnic in which the whole group gets together with the families of the members and at Christmas they decorate a memorial tree in Bywaters Park which people can bring ornaments in memory of a loved one. The group is funded by donations that mainly go towards publishing

Donald and I were at the Tip Top one day eating more than we needed, and I asked Dianne Williams if I could interview her for this column. She laughed and I begged. She said that she would have to clean her house and have time to think about recipes. I didn't give up. I told her that I knew she did not have to clean her house because it was already perfect and that she already had recipes. She wanted to know why I thought her house was perfect, and I gave her an explanation so logical that neither she or any other woman would argue with it. I told her that I knew how she kept her house by how perfect her lipstick is every time I see her.

Dianne Williams and her husband, Mike, live at Rosalie. She is a beautician, (cosmetologist?) by profession, and has been for 27 years. She owns the Razor's Edge Beauty Shop at her home in Rosalie. At the present time, she is also helping her sister-in-law at the Tip Top, in Bogata. Mike has worked for GTE for 20 years. They have 2 sons. Brad graduated from T.C.U. in Ft Worth in December. He works for Conoco Oil Co. Brandon graduated from Rivercrest this May. He will be attending NETCC this fall on an academic scholarship and a rodeo scholarship. Dianne enjoys anything to do with water sports, especially water skiing, watching Brandon rope, working in the yard and cooking for her

family. The Williams family has 4 horses, and she enjoys riding them. Her horse is named Skip. She says she asked her family what their favorite thing was for her to cook for them and they would give her no specific answer. They just said they liked everything. I'm not surprised. Her recipes look wonderful.

Dianne is really pressed for time right now. With the responsibility of her shop and helping Sheila, she doesn't have time for much except Brandon's rodeos.

I am going to tell you all about the recipes Dianne gave me, but I first want to tell you that I didn't believe she used them until she assured me she does. You see these are all a bunch of little bitty slim folks. Even her mother-in-law, Maggie, who makes those pies that taste like Mama's isn't as big as a minute. Perhaps she just makes these recipes and eats a sensible portion. That would probably work.

The recipes Dianne gave me are Chicken Spaghetti, a version which she has created to her own taste, Caramel Squares, which was given to her by her friend Linda Wilson from Arkansas, Aunt Sue Hendricks' Green and White Salad, and Choc-Oat-Chip-Krisp Cookies which was given to her by Brad's friend Mark Musser from Tulsa.

**Caramel Squares**  
by Dianne Williams  
1 German Chocolate Cake Mix  
14 oz. bag caramels  
3/4 cup butter (softened)  
1 cup chopped pecans  
6 oz bag chocolate chips  
2/3 cup evaporated milk  
Combine caramels and 1/3 cup milk in double boiler (I use microwave). Stir until melted. Combine cake mix and 1/3 cup milk and butter. Mix with mixer until dough holds together. Stir in pecans. Press half of cake mixture in long cake pan (greased). Bake at 350 degrees for 6 minutes. Pour chocolate chips over the mixture, then pour caramel mixture over that. Then crumble rest of cake mixture on top of melted candies. Return to oven for 15-18 minutes. Cool and cut into squares.

**Chicken Spaghetti**  
8 chicken breasts, cooked and deboned  
1 bell pepper, chopped  
1 onion chopped  
4-6 stalks celery sliced  
1 clove crushed or minced garlic  
1 Tbsp oil  
1-2 cans Cream of Mushroom soup  
1- 4.5 oz jar sliced mushrooms  
1 lb. Velveeta Cheese  
1 can Rotel tomatoes and green chiles  
1 med. package spaghetti, cooked and drained  
1/2 cup to 1 cup chicken broth  
1/2 cup milk  
Pepper and seasoning salt to taste

Saute' onions, bell peppers, and celery in 1 Tbsp oil until tender. Mix all ingredients together. Simmer about 30 minutes until cheese milk and the mixture becomes creamy. You may need to add more broth and milk to keep it from being

too dry.

**Green and White Salad**  
2 stalks broccoli, washed and cut in pieces (peel the stalk and cut it up also)  
1 small cauliflower, broken up  
1 1/2 cups celery sliced  
6 green onions, cut blades and all  
1 cup mayonnaise  
1/2 cup chipping cream, not whipped  
4 Tbsp. Sugar  
1 tsp. salt  
Black pepper to taste  
Toss broccolt, cauliflower, celery and onion well. Cover and chill. Keep stirred to coat with the mayonnaise mixture.

**Choc-Oat-Chip-Krisp Cookies**  
1 cup (2 sticks) Margarine or butter softened  
1 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
2 eggs  
2 Tablespoons milk  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
1 3/4 cups all purpose flour  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 1/4 cups Quaker Oats (Quick or old fashioned uncooked)  
1 1/4 cups Rice Krispies  
1 12 oz pkg. Nestle Toll House semi sweet chocolate morsels  
1 cup coarsely chopped nuts  
Heat oven to 375 degrees. Beat margarine and sugar until creamy. Add eggs, milk, and vanilla; beat well. Add flour, baking soda and salt; mix well. Stir in oats, rice krispies, chocolate morsels, and nuts; mix well. Drop by rounded measuring Tablespoonful onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 9 to 10 minutes for a chewy cookie or 12 to 13 minutes for a crisp cookie. Cool 1 minute of cookie sheet; remove to wire rack. Cool completely. About 5 dozen 2 1/2 inch cookies.

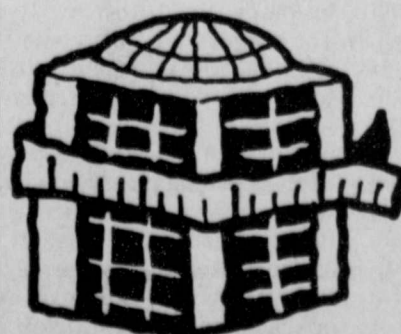

### Free/Reduced Price Meals To Be Offered At Talco-Bogata

The Talco-Bogata School District takes part in the National School Lunch Program/School Breakfast Program. Meals are served every school day. Students in grades K-8 may buy lunch for \$1.20 per day or \$6.00 if they purchase a weekly ticket. Students in grades 9-12 may buy lunch for \$1.40 per day or \$7.00 if they purchase a weekly ticket. Students in K-8 may buy breakfast for 55 cents and high school students may buy breakfast for 65 cents. Meals are also available free or at a reduced price. If you now get food stamps or AFDC for your children, your children can get free meals. If your total household income is the same or less than the amount in the income chart, your children can get free meals or reduced price meals. A foster child may get free or reduced price meals regardless of your income. The re-

duced price is 40 cents for lunch and 30 cents for breakfast. To get free or reduced price meals for your children, you must complete an application and return it to the school. An incomplete application cannot be processed. Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to send papers showing that your children should get free or reduced price meals. Contact the school for an application. In the operation of the child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against, because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, DC 20250.

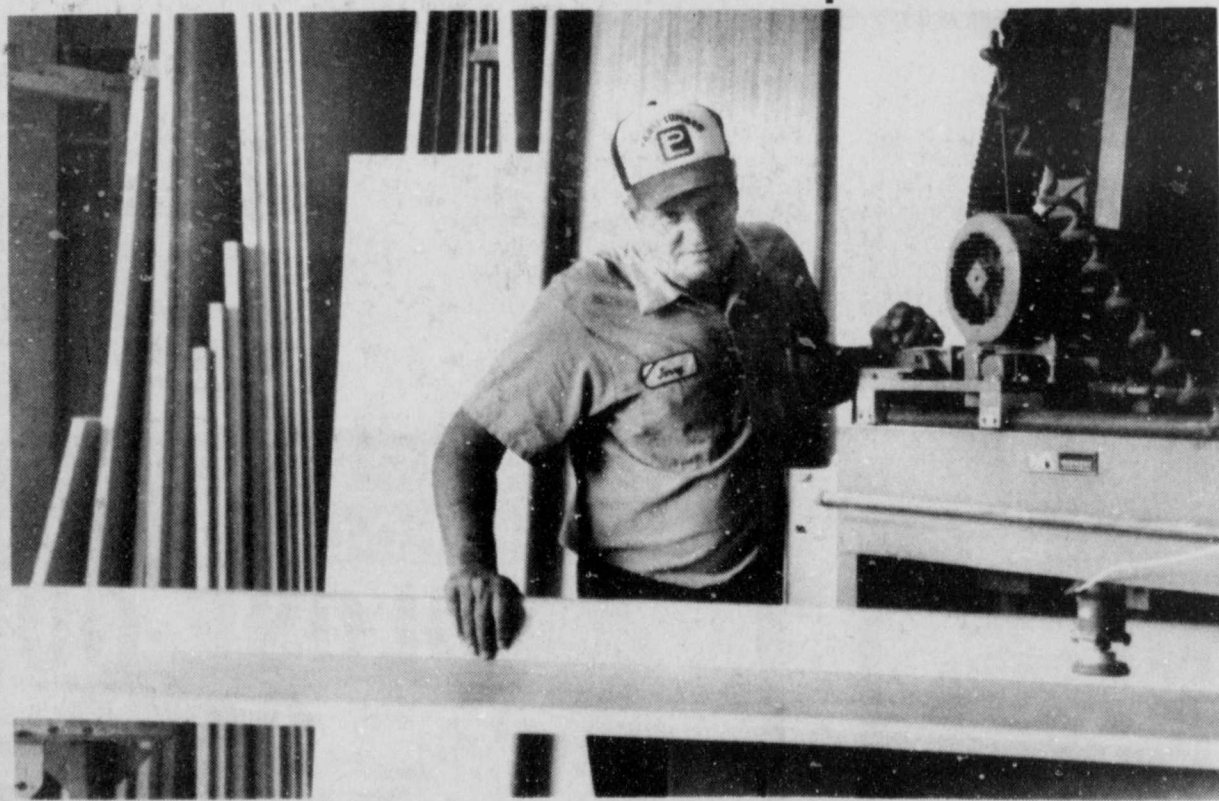

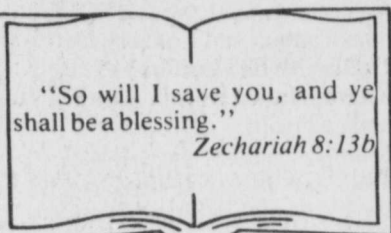

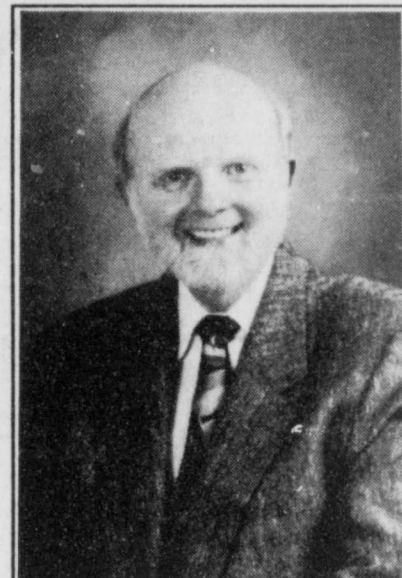

Mr. Wade said that this semester for the first time there will be a Pre-Kindergarten at the Talco Campus. There are 32 students from the whole district. The class will be taught by Mrs. Kathy Brown.

Mr. Wade said that the changes

this year would not be too negative for the district. There is no new state money. They will just redistribute the money which is already available. Rivercrest will not suffer as much as many districts. The Career Ladder has completely been abolished rather than phasing it out. Folks who were already participating will not lose anything. Their stipend is still there, but, rather than a lump sum payment, it will be paid in installments beginning with the Sep-

tember paycheck. There is an insurance committee which has been trying to figure out which company offers the most benefits for the money. They have not recommended any changes other than that there be a survey done of the people who are in the insurance program, and see if they want to stay with Diversified Industrial (They have had problems with this

company being slow to pay claims in the past, but the company promises that this will not happen again.), or if they would prefer to contribute more of their own money to go to a company with more benefits.

Next week, the two Junior High campuses will be receiving new IBM compatible computer systems. These are different from the Apple Systems which they have been using. The computers will also be installed at the High School before mid-term. There will be two sessions to instruct employees on the new system. The instruction will be on the 28th and 29th, the first 2 half day in service days. MetroCrest people will be on hand to serve as instructors on the computers they sold the district.

The Talco Campus and Principal Johnny Gable were again commended for the \$30,000.00 award they received for so much improvement in test scores.

Mr. Wade asked if the parents who were there remembered how they used to pull their children's loose baby teeth with a string, and sometimes just with clean fingers. He said that he had had a new experience during the summer break. He went to Baylor

Dental School and his daughter removed one of his wisdom teeth.

In closing the breakfast and sending the staffs to their respective schools to start their first work day of the semester with an assembly, Mr. Wade compared discipline in years gone by to discipline 1993 style. It seems that in the 1700s students were punished by being made to kneel on dried peas for long periods of time. Memory of the pain was to keep students from repeating the mischief. In the 1800s, the whipping post was used. This was also to scare the student enough so that they would behave. In the 1900s behavior modification counseling and non physical discipline is used.

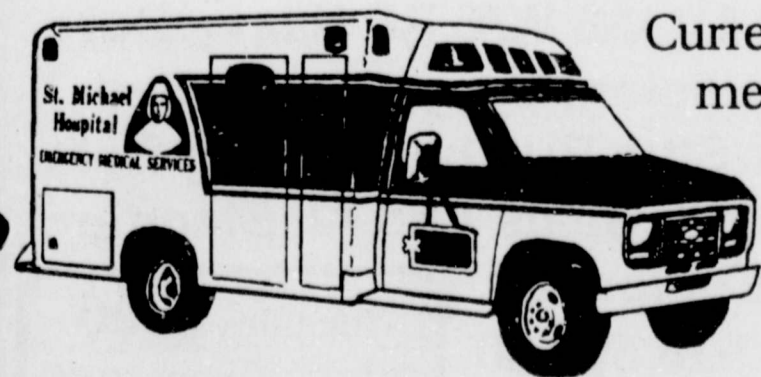

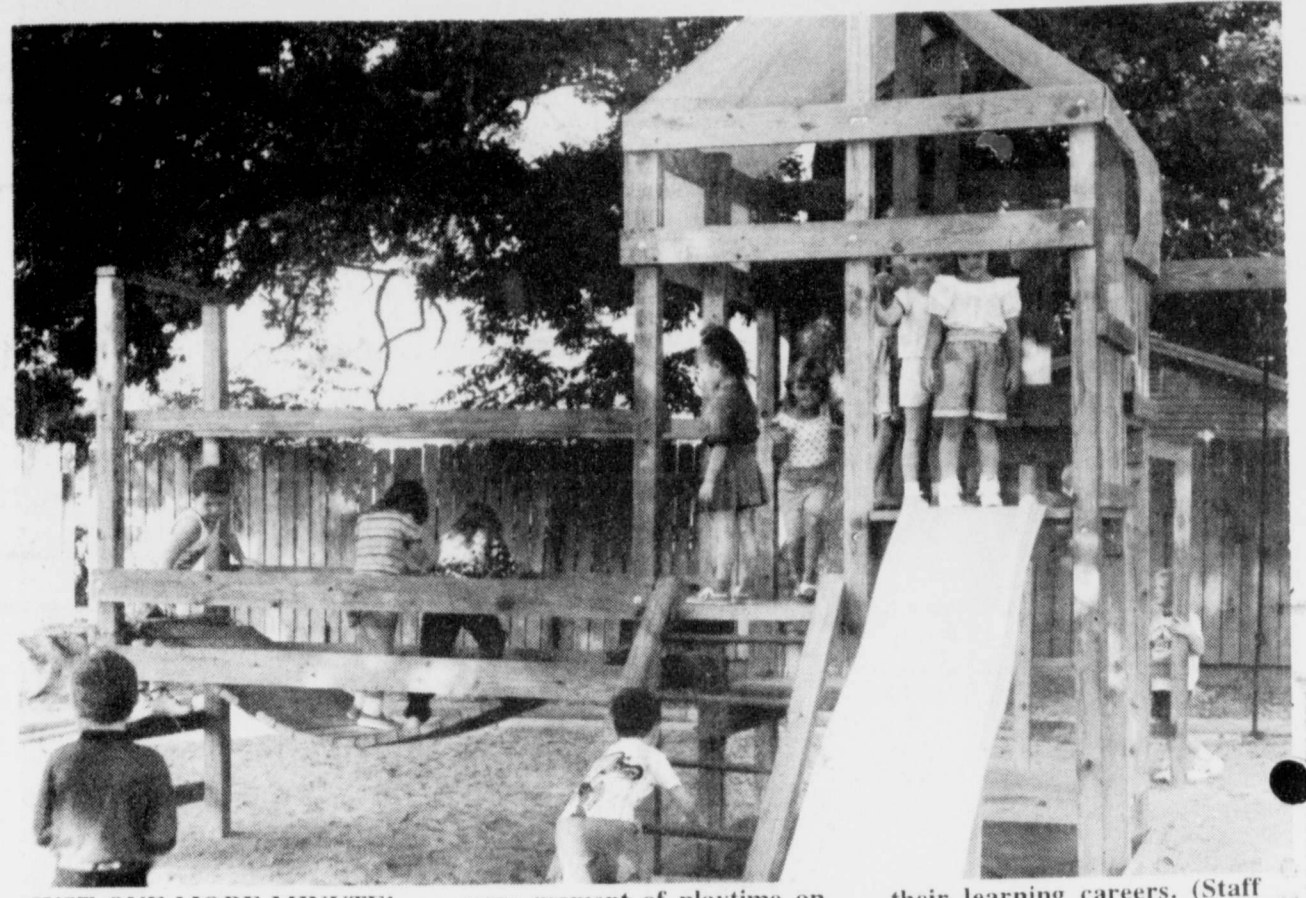

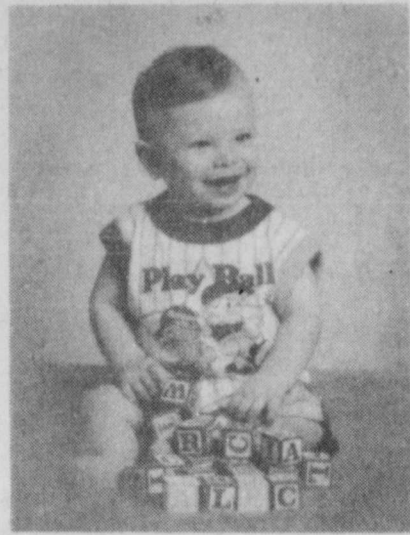
