## Local Students Receive

### Regional Welding Award

Rivercrest High School students, Michael G. Tabb, Marty Wayne Gray, and Jimmy Bryan Ottinger have received a \$125.00 Regional Silver Award for their Region II, Division I entry in the 1993 School Shop Arc Welding Awards Program of the James F. Lincoln Arc Welding Foundation. The National program, which recognizes excellence in the application of arc welding techniques to school shop projects, granted a total of \$25,150.00 in awards. Division I entrants are 18 years old or younger; Division II is for career students of 18 years of age.

The Rivercrest team's entry describes the "Complete BBQ Center" they designed and fabricated under the supervision of shop instructor, Craig Ingram.

For the purpose of the Division I Awards Program, the United States is divided into four geographic regions. Region II encompasses the states of Kentucky, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennes-

see, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas, as well as Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

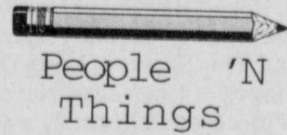

Nixon of Evanston, Wyoming.

Lincoln Arc Welding foundation, established in 1936 by The Lincoln Electric Company to advance the science and application of arc welding, has offered awards annually for 57 years to recognize superior achievements in these fields. ## Letter To The Editor

To the Editor:

The Safe Drinking Water Act of 1986 is being reauthorized by HR3392. It will eliminate a lot of the unnecessary expense being imposed on everyone that produces water for resale.

The organization that monitors the drinking water has gone through many changes in the past few years. For many years we were regulated by the Texas Department of Health, which was recently changed to the Texas Water Commission and now it is the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Committee, or TNRCC. I have heard this fondly referred to as standing for "Train Wreck".

The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Committee is a combination of Texas Department of Health, Texas Air Board, Texas Water Commission and the Department of Interior. I suppose someone thinks bigger is better.

What we have now is a rapid process of moving from the ridiculous to something no one can understand, and compliance is very expensive if not impossible.

We now have sixty-six unfunded Federal mandates. It is so easy to tell someone what to do if you don't

consider the cost or consequences.

The opposition to HR3392 is coming from Representative Bawcus and is referred to as the "Bawcus Bill". He is supported by the EPA, or the Environmental Protective Agency, and many environmentalists.

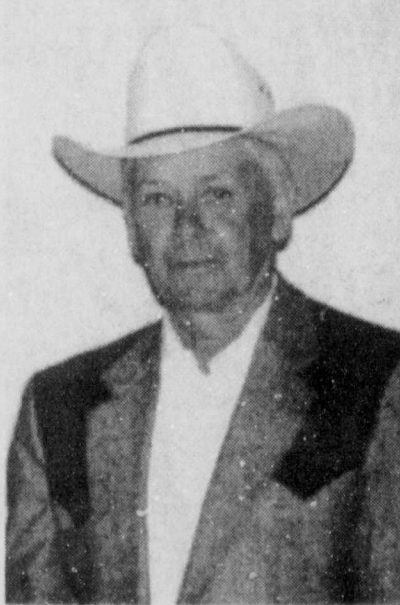
If we don't short stop this opposition and rewrite the Safe Drinking Water Act as suggested in HR3392, we will see more and more intervention in water production, waste collection and sewer treatment.

You can ask any Mayor, City Councilperson, or anyone else remotely connected with the above mentioned services and they will tell you that rules and regulations are coming faster than you can imagine, and often amended before they are implemented.

HR3392 needs 218 sponsors to pass, it now has 33. Please call or write your congressman and ask him for his support.

Lets stop these "Unfunded Federal Mandates" that are contained in the Safe Drinking Water Act of 1986.

### The Egg In The Hole

by Virginia Wright

Place a skillet on medium heat. Take 1 slice of bread and with a cookie cutter, cut the center out. Place bread in skillet. In the hole put about 1 Tbsp Margarine. Then break an egg in the hole after the margarine has melted. Put a small amount of margarine on round piece of bread. Place in skillet. Turn over egg and bread when white begins to look done.

### Hot Cranberry Cocktail

2-32 oz. cranberry juice  
1- 8 3/4 oz. Red Hots (I use more. I like it nippy)

4 cups water  
Heat above until red hots are melted.

Add  
1- 6 oz frozen limeade  
1-6 oz frozen orange juice  
Heat again, serve hot.

### Martha Cake

(Read entire recipe before beginning)

1 box German Choc. Cake Mix  
1 cup water  
1/2 cup Crisco oil  
1 stick margarine  
3 eggs  
1/2 can Eagle Brand Milk

Mix well and pour 1/2 of mixture into 9"X13" pan. Place in 325 degree oven. Bake approx 20 minutes.

Before I start cake, I start unwrapping

November 25, 1993

a 12 or 14 oz. bag of caramel candy, place in double boiler w/ remaining 1/2 can Eagle Brand Milk (left from cake) while the cake is baking I melt the candy mixture. Remove cake from oven and pour candy mixture over cake, then add remaining cake mixture-return to oven to bake 20 to 30 minutes

### Icing

1/2 cup cocoa  
1 stick soft margarine

Blend the two above ingredients

Add 2 cups confectioner's sugar and small amount of milk to blend. Add Vanilla Butter flavoring

Mix well, pour over cake.

### Blue Berry Salad

1 large black cherry jello  
2 cups hot water

Dissolve the above together

Add:  
2 cans blue berries- drained  
1- 8 oz crushed pineapple, drained

Mix well and pour 1/2 mixture in serving bowl. Let gel

Mix 1-8oz pkg Philadelphia Cream Cheese

1-8 oz carton sour cream

1/2 cup confectioner's sugar

Remove salad from refrigerator and spread mixture on top. Add remaining salad on top-return to refrigerator and let gel.

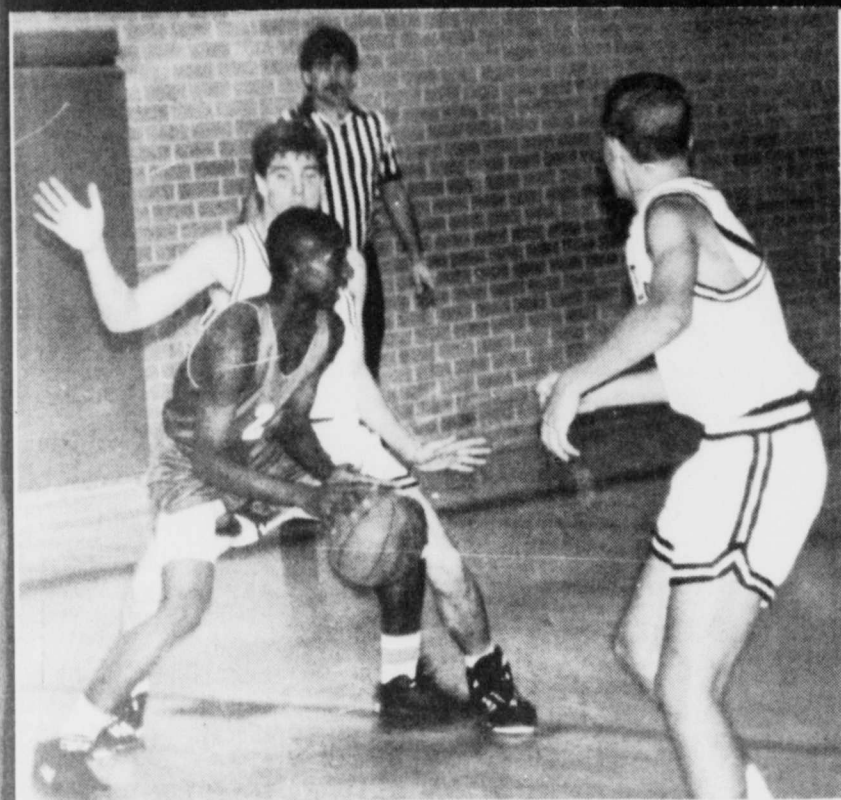

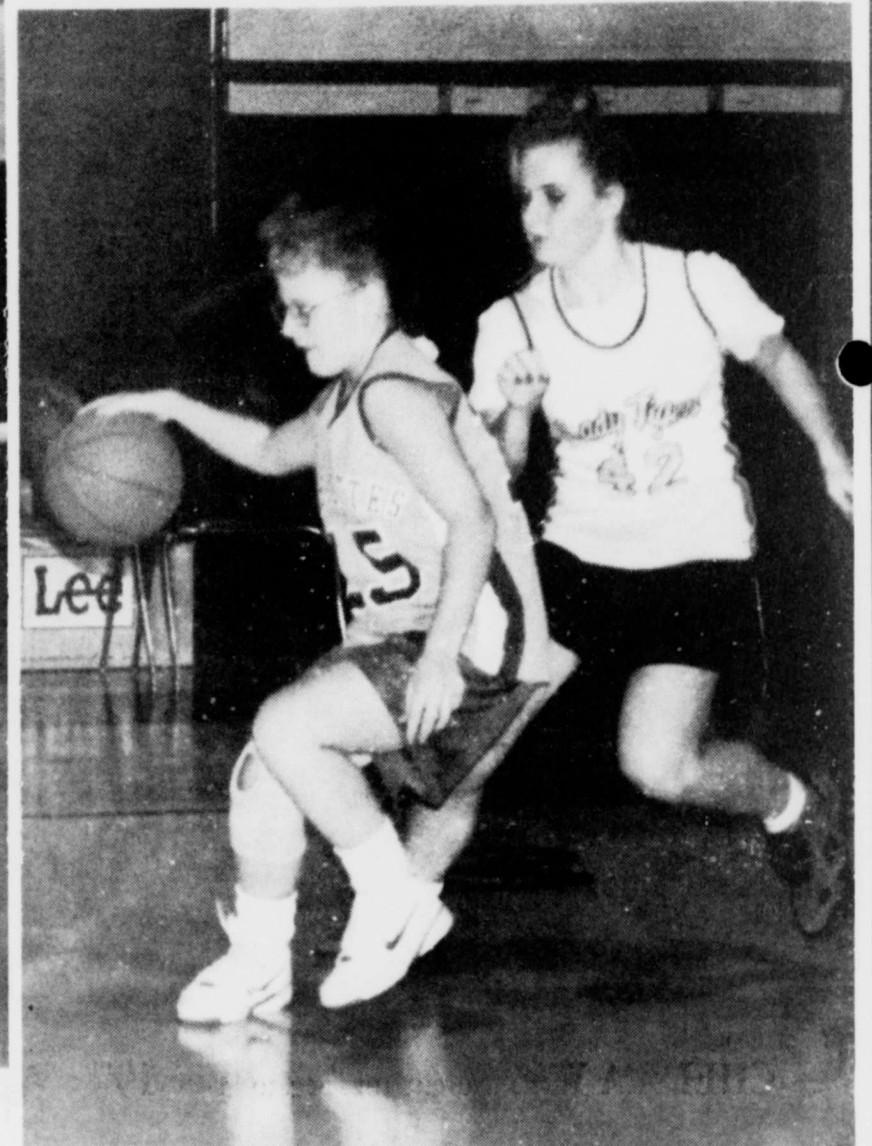
The final score was 42-37, Mt. Vernon. High scorer for the team was Michelle Giles, followed by Kathy Hinsley.

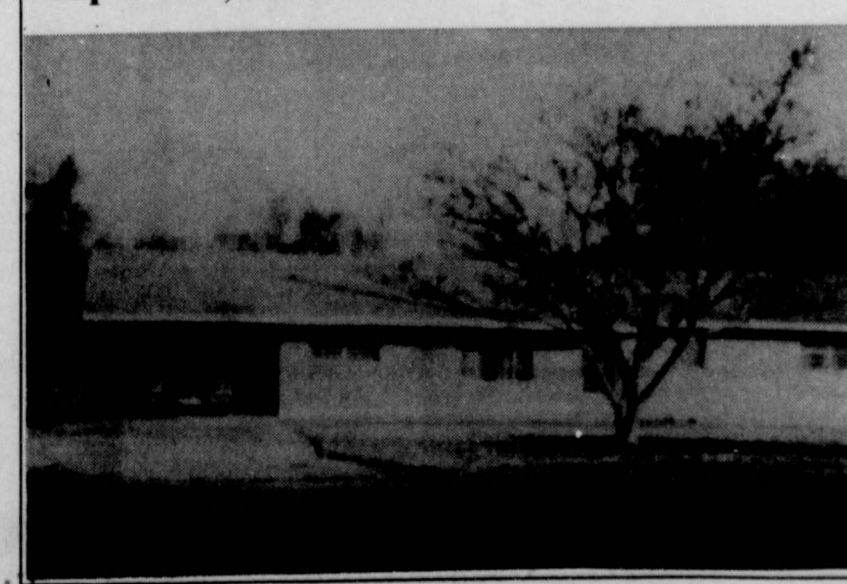

**After 45 Years At GNB Retirement Brings Honor**

When Billy Mauldin arrived at GNB Battery Technologies, in Farmers Branch in 1948, he did not plan on staying long, but because he liked his co-workers and the pay was so "high" - 95 cents an hour - he just couldn't leave.

Through the years, Mauldin, 65, witnessed dramatic changes, not only in technology and production, but also to the human side of the battery manufacturing equation. The company recently honored him with a special ceremony recognizing his 45 years of service - the longest stint in the firm's history - after he retired in September.

A native of Cuthand, Mauldin settled in Irving after serving in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. With the aid of a friend working at GNB, he started working there mixing mud for the battery plates for 95 cents an hour.

When such tasks became obsolete, Mauldin repaired, inspected,

and analyzed batteries. He was in charge of lot sampling and analysis of batteries that would be shipped to and from an analysis center.

Since retiring, he has devoted more time to gardening, bowling, miniature golf, and picking up aluminum cans. He has a brother, Tommy, who has worked for GNB for 31 years.
