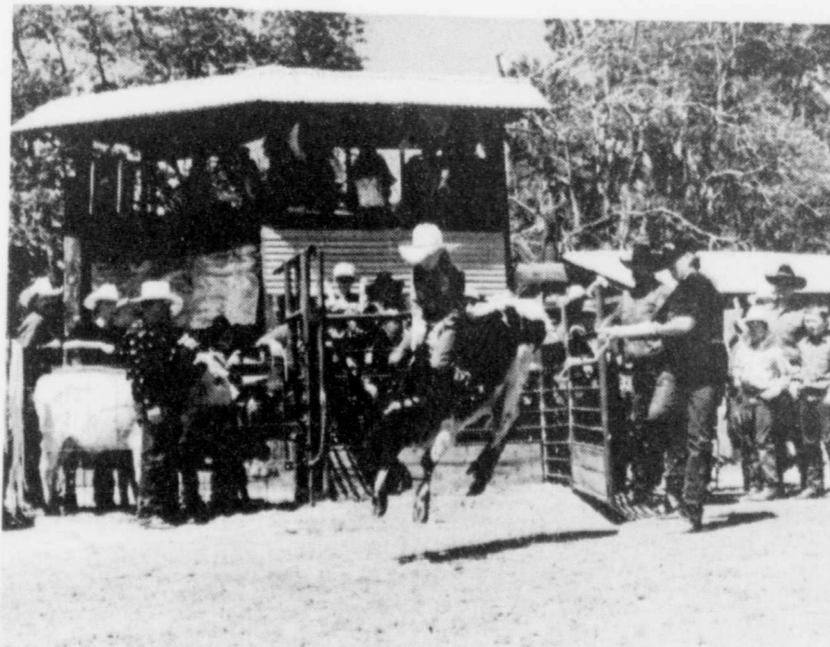
## Bogata Kindergarten To Hold Registration

Bogata Elementary will have Kindergarten Registration Friday, May 6, 1994 at 9:00 in the kindergarten classrooms.

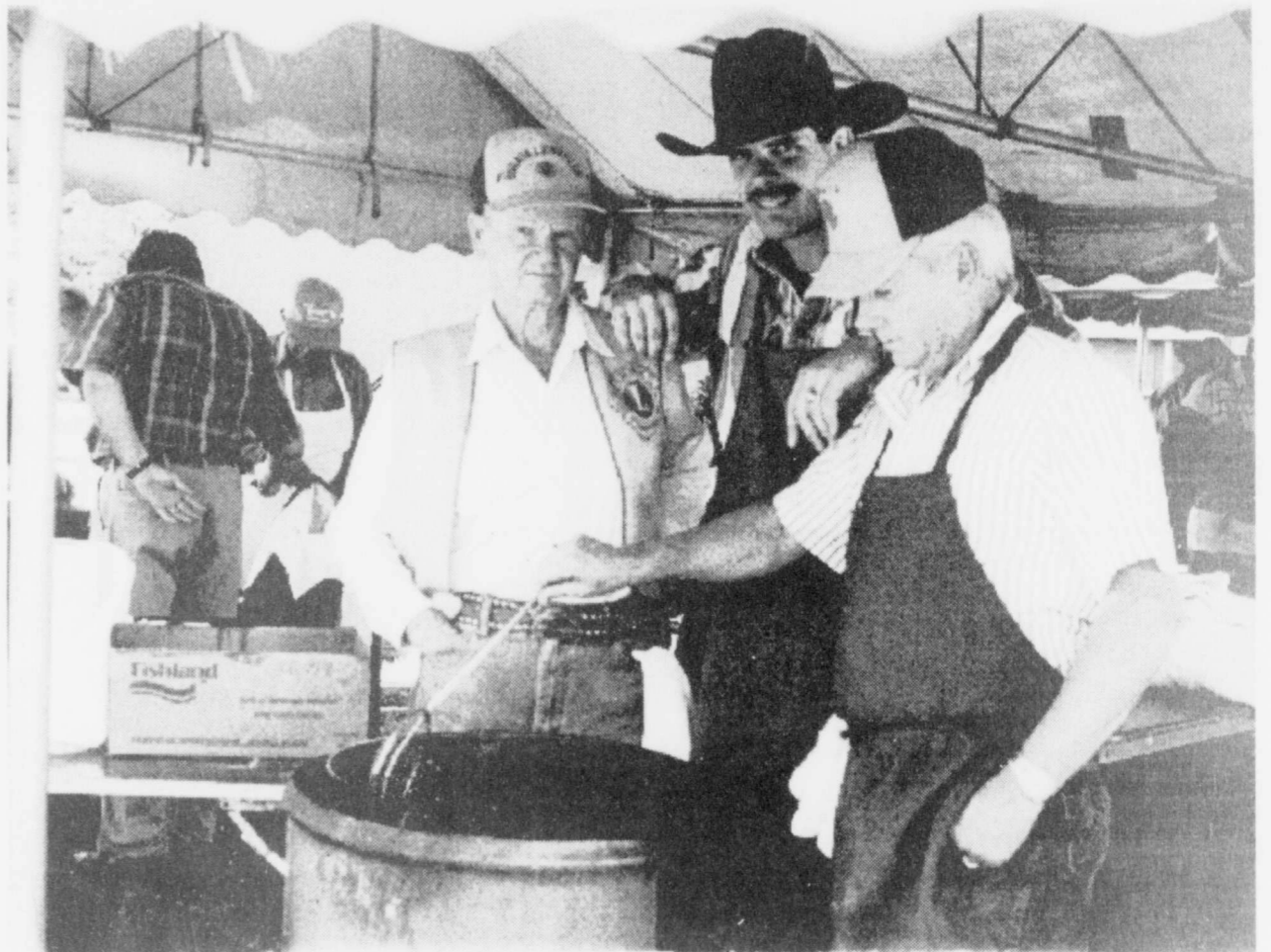
