Clarke Stallworth's comment is "let me give you a rul e of life: When anybody uses IMPACT as a verb, quit reading You've got better things to

I not only agree, but I will continue by saying that all that gobblygook could have been boiled down to one sentence..."the closing of the military base could affect the lives of 6,600 people". Period, that's it, forget input, output, factors, and inter-industry relationships.

I'm glad I didn't write the paragraph. I'd rather make my homey little errors, be a bit politically incorrect and have my readers grasp what I'm try-

ing to tell them. But, there is a disturbing tendency to write this way. Young, just-out-of-journalism-school and-ready-to-save-the-world reporters tená to deal in this specialized jargon. This comes at a time when more and more people are saying they want things written in short, concise and easily understandable

Since confidence in television news is way, way down, why don't we all take the chance to write clearly and honestly, without pretense and without the "bull"? I have a feeling it would be like a breath of fresh air to many readers. You'll notice I didn't say it would "impact print media devotees like a zephyr of unpollulted ozone"? Get the picture? I hope some other people do, too!

Customers are not required to take any action to take advantage of the new service offering. Once extended calling is operational, it is no longer necessary for customers to dial "1" before the number when placing calls between these communities.

The implementation of Expanded Local Calling may require modification to some telecommunications services and/or equipment, such as fax machines, speed calling, PABX's, key systems, automatic dialers and other services/equipment that may restrict

Expanded local calling to Talco and Mt. Pleasant may be added at a later date, pending appropriate legal approval.

Dear Editor. There appears to be a very definite

lack of information and instruction about using the pager number for the Bogata Water Department. The pager number is posted at the Water Department, but is affixed to the chain link fence at the back where the vehicles are kept. During business hours, a person can call the City Hall to report a water leak, etc. and Mrs. Couch will page the water employees. After business hours, the pager number should be called. It is very simple to do. First, dial the pager number; 1-800-604-8549, second; when the person answers the call, listen to the instruction. When he or she says, "Key in your number," punch in the number that you are calling from-Example; 632-0000-then hang up. The pager will then Beep and the phone number you have punched in will show on the pager. The employee will then know what number to call to find out the problem. They will return your call as quickly as possible, so don't get in a tizzy if it takes a little while sometime. The employees could be standing in a hole fixing a leak and be knee deep or even waist in water, and that does happen. Remember, yours might not be the only water leak in Bogata, so get the pager number, learn how to use it, have patience and don't get spastic if they don't show up at your door two seconds after you call. (They will return your call as soon as possible) It is foolish for the city to pay for this service each month with your money, taxpayers, when maybe only four or five people out of a hundred use the pager. The rest either call the employee's house or go to their house, whatever the time, which is usually after working hours or in the middle of the night. You are paying for the

pager system people, so use it.


