The hawk outflew him time after time, skimming effortlessly away from the smaller, less aerodynamic creature. Determined and squawking loudly, the crow would eateh back up, taking short dives at the larger bird, and using what sense he has (crows have too much sense, I think) to stay carefully above the level of those deadly talons.

This went on for a long time, the hawk zigzagged across the pasture, coming straight towards the yard where I was watching happily.

Just about even with me, the hawk apparently had enough. He gained a little altitude, leveled off and waited until the crow came diving down on him again. Quick as a wink the hawk rotated himself in mid-air, literally turning over on his back. His talons yanked a clump of black feathers loose from the crow, who screamed at incredible volume and took off. The last time I saw the crow he was still trailing crow cuss words behind himself, and flapping fast and furious.

The hawk never even attempted to follow the crow, he just continued on in his graceful flight, letting out a peaceful

little whistle of satisfaction. It was truly quality entertainment, and gave me a good laugh?

If your paper has been late, please read this

If you have been receiving your paper late, please read this, it is important. With many people's subscriptions due for renewal during the December paper sale, now seems an appropriate time to have a word with subscribers.

In July of this year the U.S. Postal Service "redid" second and third class mail. All of our newspapers are mailed second class (it's now called periodical class). There were new rules, some new routing and a price increase. Since that time we have been deluged with stories of papers that are arriving two to seven days later than they used to, or sometimes not arriving at all. This seems to be happening whenever our papers have to go outside the local post offices.

This is not our fault, we still put all our mail bags into the post offices on a Wednesday night so that they go out first thing Thursday morning, just like always. It is NOT your local post master or post office's fault either, they put the mail up when they receive it. Where the problem seems to be in is distribution

We have changed our labels, we have begun using bar coded labels, we have now done everything that

the post office has suggested and many papers are still delayed. Our local post masters have worked long and hard to help us. One is hand carrying bags to one location. another has made a special trip to Greenville to try and find out why they might be delayed.

I have personally spoken with numerous people within the postal system, as have the postmasters. I have even been told that if the bags are going through the North Texas Processing Center they are so backed up that they will automatically have a 24 hour delay! I have also been told that there are a lot of temps (temporary employees) on duty at the Greenville Distribution Center.

We have solved several problems, and many customers are now saying that they are getting their papers in a more timely fashion.

We are doing everything we can. So are the local postmasters. Our local postmasters at every location are great and have been tremendous. I want to assure our subscribers that we are will continue doing any thing suggested by the post office to help speed delivery.

However, we have no power over the distribution centers. We have mentioned to many people in the Post al Service that our business is being affected by this slow down. They promise things will get better. We hope so. In the meantime, we wanted you, our valued subscribers, to know what was happening.




Mandy Mabry, Clarksville, has been nominated to receive the American FFA Degree, the highest degree awarded by the National FFA Orga-
