Nephew Jeff has a little patch of whiskers. We refer to his goatee in various disparaging terms. Well, he decided to try out his uncle's electric trimmer.


Carefully, he selected the length guard he needed and trimmed away.

The tanker truck was owned by Deport Farm Supply and was hauling 4,200 gallons of liquid nitrogen


After leaving the roadway, the truck and tank overturned, coming to an effort to rescue him.


