One dies in early morning crash

A Paris woman was killed in a one vehicle accident Sunday morning at 2:02 a.m. on FM 410 South West of Fulbright in Red River County. According to a DPS report filed by DPS Officer Kevin Gray a 1995 Chevrolet Pickup driven by Michael Webb of Deport lost control and overturned in

The driver and three passengers occupied the vehicle at that time. Twenty one year old Cherise Bohanon of Paris was pronounced dead at the scene by Red River County Justice of the Peace J.R. Lewis.

Also seriously injured was 28 year old Tina Bohanon of Paris. Shane Forbus of Paris and driver Michael Webb of Deport were not seriously injured. According to Officer Gray, the driver was the only occupant of the vehicle wearing a seat belt at the time the accident occurred.

An investigation of the accident is pending, waiting for test results from DPS lab, Gray said. No charges have been filed against anyone in relation to the accident at this time.

This fatality puts the county death toll at two this year. By this time last year the county had a total of 14 deaths as a result of traffic accidents.

Shooting occurs at Johntown



Marble Cheesecake

cup graham cracker crumbs 3 tablespoons sugar 3 tablespoons margarine-melted 8-8 ounce cream cheese-softened

teaspoon vanilla

3/4 cup sugar

-l ounce unsweetened melted chocolate Combine crumbs, sugar and margarine; press onto bottom of 9-inch springform pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla, mixing at medium speed on electric mixer until well blended. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Blend chocoate into I cup batter. Spoon plain and chocolate batters alternately over crust; cut through batters with knife several times for marble effect. Bake at 450 degrees, 10 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 250 degrees; continue baking 30 minutes. Loosen cake from rim of pan; cool before removing rim of pan. Chill.

celery sticks

package thin sliced bacon boiled eggs

Boil potatoes until soft. While potaoes are boiling, fry bacon till very crusty. When potatoes are ready, crumble bacon into potatoes, then chopped celery. Add with diced pickle and chopped boiled eggs into all ingredients and mix

Combine the berries, jalapeno's and pectin in a large stainless-steel pot. Bring to rolling boil; stir in the sugar and bring to a boil again and boil hard for at leas one minute; stirring constantly. Skim off any foam that has accumulated on top of mixture. Pour into hot half-pint canning jars that have been sterilized.

Roasted Corn Soup 6 ears corn with husks intact 3 large cloves garlic-unpeeled 2 cups homemade chicken broth I baking potato-peeled and cut into piece I tablespoon commeal

salt and freshly ground black pepper pinch of sugar

1/2 cup heavy cream

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Put unhusked corn and unpeeled garlic onto baking sheet and roast for about 25 minutes, until the corn is fragrant and husks are lightly browned. Let cool; then re move the husks and silks. Cut kernels away from the cobs. Cut 4 cobs in half. crosswise, with heavy knife or cleaver. Discard the remaining 2 cobs. Peel garlic. Set kernels and garlic cloves aside. In saucepan, combine the broth, potato, halved corn cobs and 3 cups water. Partially cover, bring to a simmer over medium heat and adjust the heat to maintain simmer. Cook and cover 20 minutes, until potato pieces are tender. Drain the potatoes, discard cobs and reserve potato broth. In food processor, combine kernels, garlic, potatoes and commeal. Puree, adding broth gradually through feed tube. Transfer the soup to a sieve set over a bowl and press the mixture through sieve with rubber spatula, leaving corn skins behind. Transfer the soup to clean saucepan. Stir in cream and reheat. Season with salt and

pepper to taste. Add sugar is desired.

Mona and Fran are both cancer survivors who know what the dreaded disease is all about first hand. Both have fought battles with thyroid cancer. Mona just last August, received her Master's Degree in Business Administraton from Belhaven College in Jackson. She is an employee of the Boswell Center at Sanatorium. Fran is an LPN at Simpson General Hospital in Mendenhall. She didn't become a nurse until she was 40 years old, but made up for lost time. Fran's cancer was discovered four years ago. She was told it was "the best kind" (if there is a best kind) with a good recovery rate. It was discovered when she stared feeling sick and tired all the time. A lump in her neck indicated a malignancy. Her treatment included radiation which she successfully completed with the support of her family.

Dr. Rudy Runnels at Magee Medical and Surgical Clinic found a suspicious lymph in Mona'd neck during a routine physical exam. The discovery led to a diagnosis of Medullary Carcinoma of the thyroid, and the diagnosis led to two surgeries; a thyroidectomy in 1988 in Jackson and a right neck dissection in 1992 at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in

From that point on, Mona said, Anderson charted her course of treatment, which included seven weeks of radiation in Houston and around 24 months of chemotherapy. Mona stated that she feels fortunate in the care that she has received and is thankful for the options made available through cancer research. Medical advances have opened other treatment possibilities and has made it possible for Mona to undergo treatment and remain active in her professional and personal life,

James Green, criminal mischief, 6 months probation, \$500 fine, \$2264.69





I have just returned from a "vacation" spent in Chij Napoca, Romania. Bogata never looked better to me than it did upon my return May 21, 1999. We left DFW on British Airways on May 2, landing at Gotwick in London, England. This was my first trip to England and I found it absolutely beautiful with very friendly people. We arrived in Budapest, Hungry tired and hungry. Budapest is one of my favorite places in all of Europe. We spent two nights in the home of a wonderful couple who could speak "my" language. Their home was filled with antiques passed down several generations. At night we strolled along the Danube River and enjoyed Viennese pastries at Cafe Mozart. The highlight of Budapest was probably walking into the Tennesse Grill, eating American food and understanding the country by Sue Huffman

After two nights, we left for Romania, where my son, Wayne Huffman and his family are A/G missionaries. Due to the fact that Wayne's vehicle is exactly like the ones driven by the American government workers we were really checked out at the border. It was really scary, knowing we were so close to the bombing in Belgrade.

Chij-Napoca is a university city located in the Carpathian mountains. The population is over 300,00. Temperatures are very cold. Summer is about 4 weeks a year. The buildings are beautiful with lots of carved statues. It has an opera hall that was not destroyed by communism. I had the good fortune to attend a breath taking performance of "Traviata". While doing so I thought "I cannot believe I am from Bogata, Texas seeing and enjoying this performance so much".

The biggest surprise was box seats for \$1.03 per person, but it was an excellent performance. It makes one wonder why the "arts" are so cheap and the necessities of life are so high. Milk was \$7 per gallon. It cost Wayne \$80.00 American money to fill his

Toyota Land Rover with diesel!

I found out very quick while visiting a state run orphanage I wasn't near as strong as I thought. All the children in one big building. One glance told you they did not get enough to eat. The smell of dirty diapers and bedding turned ones stomach. Their little eyes would light up as they asked if there mama had come for them. Believe me, I hugged as many as I could especially a little girl whose memory I will carry for a long time.

On the same day as this visit we returned to Ocna Mures where Wayne, Drue and Adi work with a church run orphanage. What a difference. Happy kids running and playing, no smell and food for all to eat.

Next to the last night we were to spend in Chij, we were startled by two bombers flying over. As we ran outside for a better look they turned and went back toward Belgrade. I thought of what I had seen on CNN after the bombing of the embassy when they said the maps were old. Chij-Napoca is only 200 miles from

Belgrade

I returned to DFW on May 20 after spending one more night in London, tired and starving for a cup of Texas coffee. Bogata really is a good place to live. Let's all work together to keep it that way. We have so much to be thankful for, among these things is the good water we have to drink. Our missionaries don't enjoy this luxury. There water has to be filtered in their homes before drinking, when they get it. Chij Napoca is better than Bucharest, Romania, but I am really glad I am a Texan.
