Bogata to celebrate 50th year for rodeo

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the Bogata Rodeo, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, Inc., in cooperation with Wing Rodeo Company, Dodge Trucks, Award Design Medals and local businesses.

The Bogata Rodeo is 50 years old and still kicking! Last year, the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association chose the annual Bogata Rodeo as the Southern Rodeo of the Year, an attest to the championship rodeo action that is seen locally each year in June.

Dates for the rodeo this year are June 24-25-26, the last weekend of the month. Performances will begin at 8:00 p.m. nightly at the Bogata Rodeo Arena.

The Bogata Rodeo has a new look this year. With the continuing idea that "every seat is a good seat" for spectators, new bucking chutes, timed event chutes and a center alley for the barrel racers has been added.

Parades will be featured at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday and Saturday, preceding the performances of the rodeo.

This year, in honor of the 50th year celebration, commemorative T-shirts will be available from the Bogata Volunteer Fire Department and will be on sale at the rodeo. Concessions are made possible through the Bogata Lions Club.

Members for the Bogata Rodeo Association this year are: Buck Knight, president; Bryan Williams, vice-president; Randy Huddleston, secretary. Charter members include James Gibson, Travis Hale, Jessie Gray, William Rozell, Helen Williams, Guy Smelser, Steve Biggerstaff

and Henry Hudson.

Members with more than 25 years service and dedication to the association to continue its community-oriented idea of "helping the other fellow" are Travis King, Sam Barnard, C.R. Williams, Vernon Harville, H.E. Bryson, Ennis Moore, Carl Williams, Carl Wood, Helen Yancey, Charlie Lewis, Donnie Strain, Roy Lee Hutson, Bo Harville, Johnny Hudson and Gaston Puckett.

Membership costs \$15.00 per year and the organization meets the first Monday evening of each month at 7:00 p.m. Meetings are held at the Bogata Rodeo Arena or in the winter/bad weather, at the Bogata Community Center. A membership drive is held every year in October.

The Bogata Rodeo Association is a nonprofit organization that began around 1948 in Rosalie by local citizens.

In 1952, the rodeo was moved to Bogata and soon became known to cowboys, cowgirls and spectators as The Bogata Rodeo. Property was purchased on the south side of Bogata and the grounds were prepared in 1954 for the Bogata Rodeo Arena.

The Association became incorporated in 1963 and continues an organized membership of officers and directors of local people who donate their time and energy to this long-standing tradition.

This year, exciting rodeo events will include bareback riding, calf roping, saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling, team roping, bull riding, barrel racing, kids mutton bustin' and for the spectators, Mexican poker.

Bogata has long been known as the home of the Wing Rodeo Company, celebrated rodeo company.

Jerald and Joan Smith, owners and operators of the Wing Rodeo Company, have made rodeo their life's work, and it's evident by the innumerable awards they have brought back to their quiet Pine Branch home. The Smiths have been involved in the bucking horse and bull business for as long as they can remember, and have been successful at reproducing some of the award-winning stock they boast now as coming from their foundation livestock.

Through a carefully selected and highly successful breeding program, the Smith's are reaping the rewards that far surpass the buckles, plaques and awards they have been given. That reward is seeing their hand-picked, home-raised horse and bull progeny being acknowledged as outstanding rodeo stock in the competitive rodeo world of today.

And, as always, Saturday is Frontier Day in Bogata, with the Bogata Lions Club sponsoring all day activities in downtown Bogata. The complete schedule will run in next week's edition of the Bogata News. The final performance on Saturday night will be marked with a rodeo dance at the Moonlight Jubilee in Rosalie.

One dies in early morning crash

A Paris woman was killed in a one vehicle accident Sunday morning at 2:02 a.m. on FM 410 South West of Fulbright in Red River County. According to a DPS report filed by DPS Officer Kevin Gray a 1995 Chevrolet Pickup driven by Michael Webb of Deport lost control and overturned in a ditch.

The driver and three passengers occupied the vehicle at that time. Twenty one year old Cherise Bohanon of Paris was pronounced dead at the scene by Red River County Justice of the Peace J.R. Lewis.

Also seriously injured was 28 year old Tina Bohanon of Paris. Shane

Forbus of Paris and driver Michael Webb of Deport were not seriously injured. According to Officer Gray, the driver was the only occupant of the vehicle wearing a seat belt at the time the accident occurred.

An investigation of the accident is pending, waiting for test results from a DPS lab, Gray said. No charges have been filed against anyone in relation to the accident at this time.

This fatality puts the county death toll at two this year. By this time last year the county had a total of 14 deaths as a result of traffic accidents.

Mutton Bustin set for rodeo

Children six and under can sign up for the Mutton Bustin in the Bogata Championship Rodeo this year. Wing Rodeo Company will have real miniature turn out chutes for this event, just like for the big Bull Riders.

There will be prizes and buckles given to the top contenders in this event. The first twenty contestants to sign up will be taken for Thursday and Friday night performances. The best judged top ten riders will per-

form on Saturday night in the finals for the Championship Mutton Buster.

Contestants can sign up at 6:30 before rodeo on Thursday and Friday at the South gate.

All parents of contestants must sign a waiver release form at the rodeo prior to the event. This taken on a first come first serve basis.

For those who don't know, a mutton bustin is where the kids get to ride sheep and it's worth watching.

Bogata City Hall moved to temporary housing

The Bogata City Hall has been temporarily moved to 213 North Howison St. (Dr. Brook's old office).

The reason for the move stated Mayor, Mike Garretson is because of high gas levels being found under the parking lot and building at the City Hall. Garretson said they are not sure how long the City will conduct business at the temporary site. It will depend on how long it takes Lone

Star Gas Company to find the cause of the high levels of gas in the area. It has been very strange because the high levels seem to move from one site to another.

City Council meetings will be held at the Bogata Community Center until the repairs are made, which could be from one day to one month. The phone number for the City Hall will still be the same.

and the item is tagged by a licensed technician.

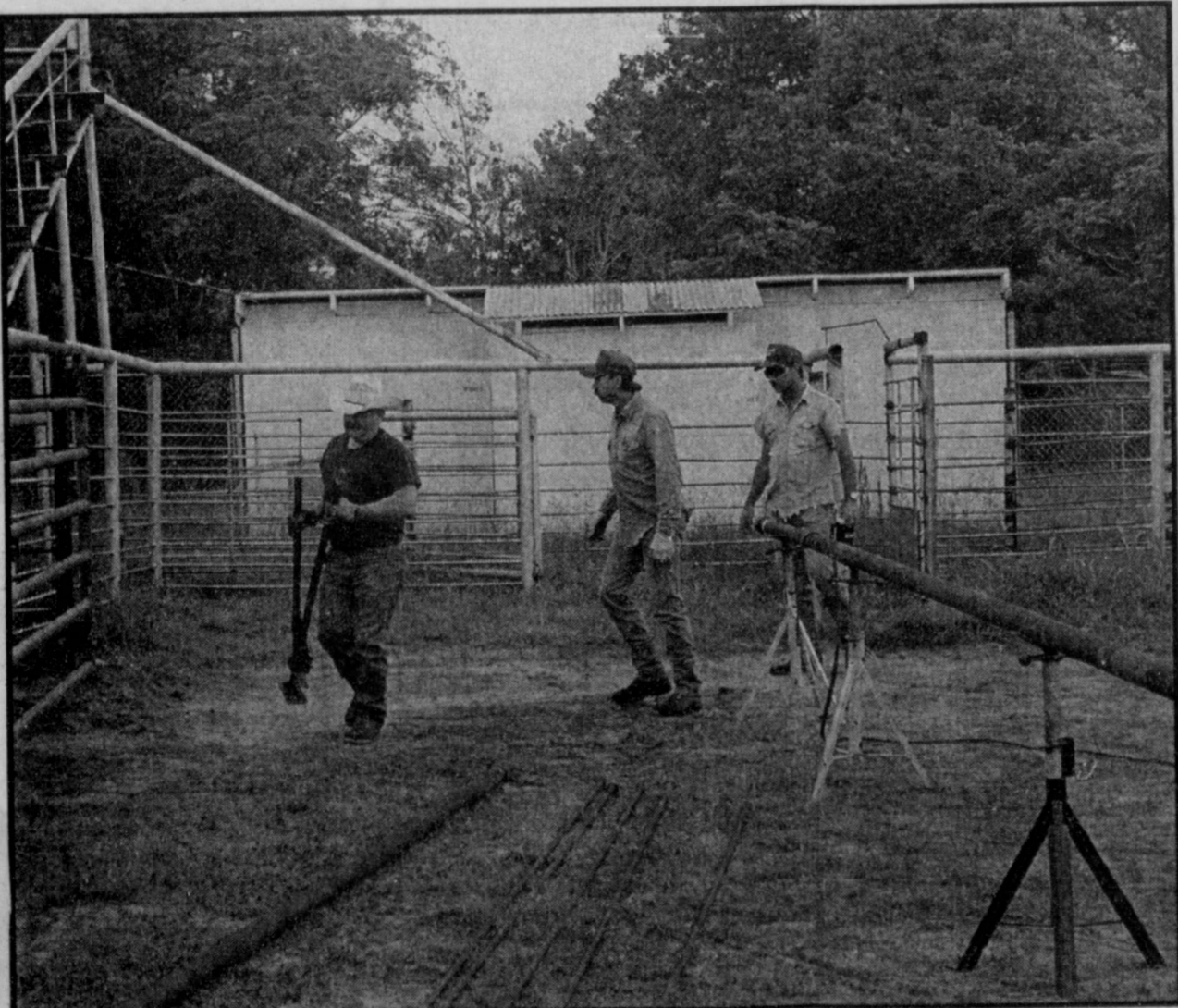

She played volleyball, basketball, ran cross country, ran track and even found time to play softball for the Lady Patriots this year! She was very busy. She also enjoys her Homemaking classes and loves to cook. She earned a blue ribbon and first place at the Christmas Bazaar that is held each year for the Home-making Department with her Marble Cheesecake.

Amber is the daughter of Mark and Deb Dawson and she has three brothers. They are Jason, Chris and Josh. Amber does do a bit of baby-sitting, since she has recently become an aunt for the first time. Chris is married to Tammy and they have son, Walker.

We hope you enjoy Amber's recipes and we will see you in the kitchen!

Marble Cheesecake-This is the recipe that Amber used for her prize-winning cheesecake at the Prairiland Christmas Bazaar. It has got to be good because first of all it is a dessert and second of all it has chocolate in it!

Grandma's Potato Salad- uses bacon, sweet pickles and celery... sounds great!

Peanut Butter Fudge- I know this is good, because I have tasted it and it is delicious!

Chicken Tortilla Casserole-this is a super recipe and can be made and served with a salad and chips and you have a complete meal!

Jalapeno' Jam-got those extra peppers in the garden? Try this and see what you come up with. It is not Amber's recipe, but try it anyway.

Roasted Corn Soup is another one of those recipes I found and if you have a abundance of corn you might try this one!

Marble Cheesecake

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
 - 3 tablespoons sugar
 - 3 tablespoons margarine-melted
 - 3-8 ounce cream cheese-softened
 - 3/4 cup sugar
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 3 eggs
 - 1-1 ounce unsweetened melted chocolate
- Combine crumbs, sugar and margarine; press onto bottom of 9-inch springform pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla, mixing at medium speed on electric mixer until well blended. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Blend chocolate into 1 cup batter. Spoon plain and chocolate batters alternately over crust; cut through batters with knife several times for marble effect. Bake at 450 degrees, 10 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 250 degrees; continue baking 30 minutes. Loosen cake from rim of pan; cool before removing rim of pan. Chill.

Grandma's Potato Salad

- 8 potatoes
 - 2 celery sticks
 - 1 package thin sliced bacon
 - 5 boiled eggs
 - 5 small sweet pickles
 - 1 small onion
 - 1 cup mayonnaise or add to taste salt to taste
- Boil potatoes until soft. While potatoes are boiling, fry bacon till very crusty. When potatoes are ready, crumble bacon into potatoes, then chopped celery. Add with diced pickle and chopped boiled eggs into all ingredients and mix well with mayo. Chill, then serve.

Peanut Butter Fudge

- 3 cups sugar
 - 1 small can evaporated milk
 - dash of salt
 - 2 cups peanut butter chips
 - 1 jar marshmallow cream
 - 1 cup pecans
 - 1-1/2 stick margarine
- Mix salt, sugar, milk and margarine. Cook over medium high heat to soft ball stage. Remove from heat and add peanut butter chips and marshmallow cream. Beat with electric mixer until smooth. Add pecans and pour into a 9x13 inch buttered dish.

Chicken Tortilla Casserole

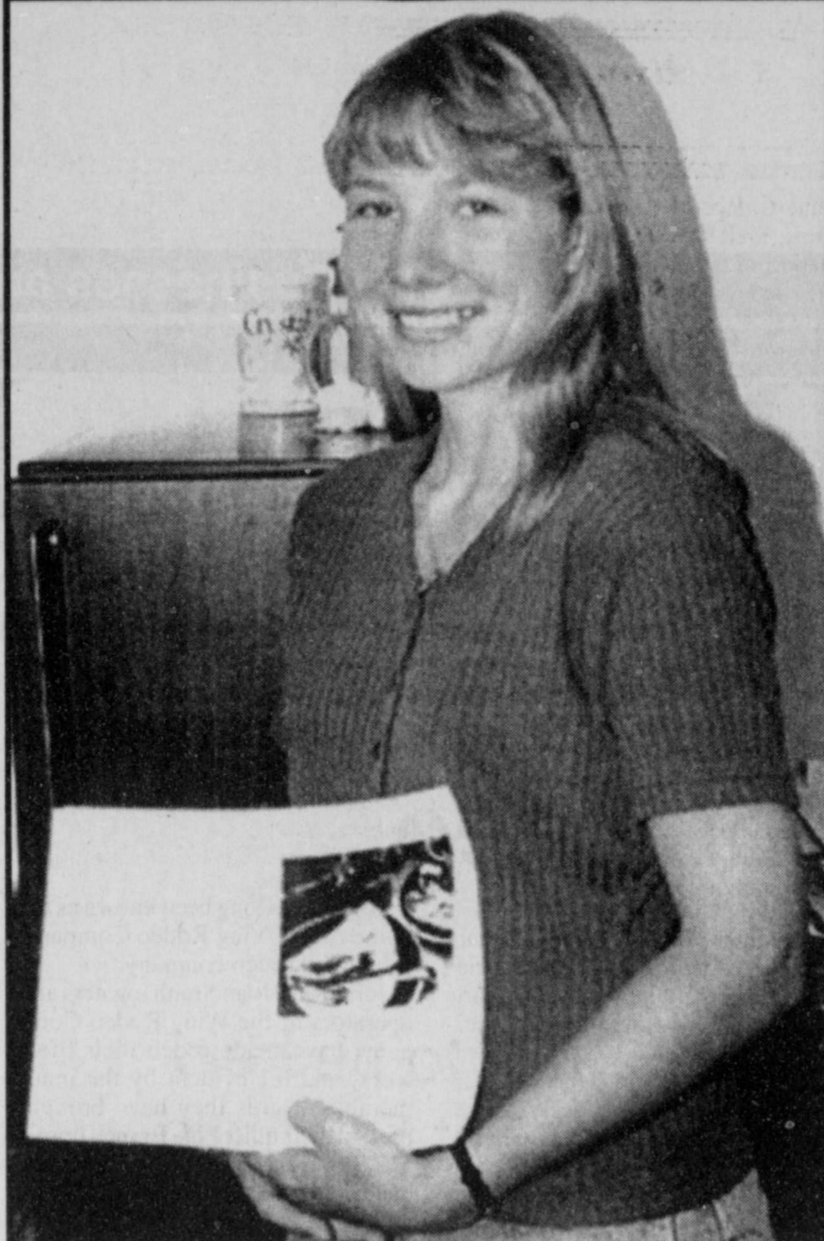
- 1 chicken-cooked and shredded
 - 1 can cream of chicken soup
 - 1 jar picante sauce
 - 1 onion minced
 - butter
 - corn tortillas
 - cheddar cheese-shredded
 - black olives
- Melt butter in pan with onion and cooked til softened. Then add soups. Then picante sauce. In pan cut up tortillas and layer them and add chicken and soup mixture. Layer more tortillas and chicken and soup mixture. Top with cheese and olives. Place in 350 degree oven for about 20-30 minutes.

Jalapeno' Jam

- 7 cups raspberries
 - 2 cups finely chopped jalapenos'
 - 1 package Sure-Jell
 - 6 cups sugar
- Combine the berries, jalapeno's and pectin in a large stainless-steel pot. Bring to rolling boil; stir in the sugar and bring to a boil again and boil hard for at least one minute; stirring constantly. Skim off any foam that has accumulated on top of mixture. Pour into hot half-pint canning jars that have been sterilized.

Roasted Corn Soup

- 6 ears corn with husks intact
 - 3 large cloves garlic-unpeeled
 - 2 cups homemade chicken broth
 - 1 baking potato-peeled and cut into pieces
 - 1 tablespoon cornmeal
 - 1/2 cup heavy cream
 - salt and freshly ground black pepper
 - pinch of sugar
- Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Put unhusked corn and unpeeled garlic onto baking sheet and roast for about 25 minutes, until the corn is fragrant and husks are lightly browned. Let cool; then remove the husks and silks. Cut kernels away from the cobs. Cut 4 cobs in half, crosswise, with heavy knife or cleaver. Discard the remaining 2 cobs. Peel garlic. Set kernels and garlic cloves aside. In saucepan, combine the broth, potato, halved corn cobs and 3 cups water. Partially cover, bring to a simmer over medium heat and adjust the heat to maintain simmer. Cook and cover 20 minutes, until potato pieces are tender. Drain the potatoes, discard cobs and reserve potato broth. In food processor, combine kernels, garlic, potatoes and cornmeal. Puree, adding broth gradually through feed tube. Transfer the soup to a sieve set over a bowl and press the mixture through sieve with rubber spatula, leaving corn skins behind. Transfer the soup to clean saucepan. Stir in cream and reheat. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add sugar is desired.

Mona Childres honorary co-chariman in Relay for Life

Mona Childres, daughter of Weldon and Joyce Smith of Bogata and Fran Davis were named honorary co-charimen of the 1999 version of Simpson County's Relay for Life, which was held May 7-8 at the Magee High School.

Mona and Fran are both cancer survivors who know what the dreaded disease is all about first hand. Both have fought battles with thyroid cancer. Mona just last August, received her Master's Degree in Business Administration from Belhaven College in Jackson. She is an employee of the Boswell Center at Sanatorium. Fran is an LPN at Simpson General Hospital in Mendenhall. She didn't become a nurse until she was 40 years old, but made up for lost time. Fran's cancer was discovered four years ago. She was told it was "the best kind" (if there is a best kind) with a good recovery rate. It was discovered when she started feeling sick and tired all the time. A lump in her neck indicated a malignancy. Her treatment included radiation which she successfully completed with the support of her family.

Dr. Rudy Runnels at Magee Medical and Surgical Clinic found a suspicious lymph in Mona's neck during a routine physical exam. The discovery led to a diagnosis of Medullary Carcinoma of the thyroid, and the diagnosis led to two surgeries; a thyroidectomy in 1988 in Jackson and a right neck dissection in 1992 at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston.

From that point on, Mona said, Anderson charted her course of treatment, which included seven weeks of radiation in Houston and around 24 months of chemotherapy. Mona stated that she feels fortunate in the care that she has received and is thankful for the options made available through cancer research. Medical advances have opened other treatment possibilities and has made it possible for Mona to undergo treatment and remain active in her professional and personal life.

Individuals with cancer; the way Mona see it; have to learn to live with the disease and live the fullest life possible.

My vacation in beautiful Romania

I have just returned from a "vacation" spent in Chij Napoca, Romania. Bogata never looked better to me than it did upon my return May 21, 1999. We left DFW on British Airways on May 2, landing at Gotwick in London, England. This was my first trip to England and I found it absolutely beautiful with very friendly people. We arrived in Budapest, Hungary tired and hungry. Budapest is one of my favorite places in all of Europe. We spent two nights in the home of a wonderful couple who could speak "my" language. Their home was filled with antiques passed down several generations. At night we strolled along the Danube River and enjoyed Viennese pastries at Cafe Mozart. The highlight of Budapest was probably walking into the Tennessee Grill, eating American food and understanding the country

western music being played.

After two nights, we left for Romania, where my son, Wayne Huffman and his family are A/G missionaries. Due to the fact that Wayne's vehicle is exactly like the ones driven by the American government workers we were really checked out at the border. It was really scary, knowing we were so close to the bombing in Belgrade.

Chij-Napoca is a university city located in the Carpathian mountains. The population is over 300,000. Temperatures are very cold. Summer is about 4 weeks a year. The buildings are beautiful with lots of carved statues. It has an opera hall that was not destroyed by communism. I had the good fortune to attend a breath taking performance of "Traviata". While doing so I thought "I cannot believe I am from Bogata, Texas seeing and enjoying this performance so much".

The biggest surprise was box seats for \$1.03 per person, but it was an excellent performance. It makes one wonder why the "arts" are so cheap and the necessities of life are so high. Milk was \$7 per gallon. It cost Wayne \$80.00 American money to fill his

Toyota Land Rover with diesel!

I found out very quick while visiting a state run orphanage I wasn't near as strong as I thought. All the children in one big building. One glance told you they did not get enough to eat. The smell of dirty diapers and bedding turned ones stomach. Their little eyes would light up as they asked if there mama had come for them. Believe me, I hugged as many as I could especially a little girl whose memory I will carry for a long time.

On the same day as this visit we returned to Ocna Mures where Wayne, Drue and Adi work with a church run orphanage. What a difference. Happy kids running and playing, no smell and food for all to eat.

Next to the last night we were to spend in Chij, we were startled by two bombers flying over. As we ran outside for a better look they turned and went back toward Belgrade. I thought of what I had seen on CNN after the bombing of the embassy when they said the maps were old. Chij-Napoca is only 200 miles from

Belgrade.

I returned to DFW on May 20 after spending one more night in London, tired and starving for a cup of Texas coffee. Bogata really is a good place to live. Let's all work together to keep it that way. We have so much to be thankful for, among these things is the good water we have to drink. Our missionaries don't enjoy this luxury. There water has to be filtered in their homes before drinking, when they get it. Chij Napoca is better than Bucharest, Romania, but I am really glad I am a Texan.

\$5 PSA Blood Tests for East Texas Men At Risk for Prostate Cancer

Last year, ETMC issued a call to arms to East Texas men at risk for prostate cancer. In the largest screening of its kind, more than 12,000 answered the call by getting a PSA blood test to help detect prostate cancer at its most treatable stage.

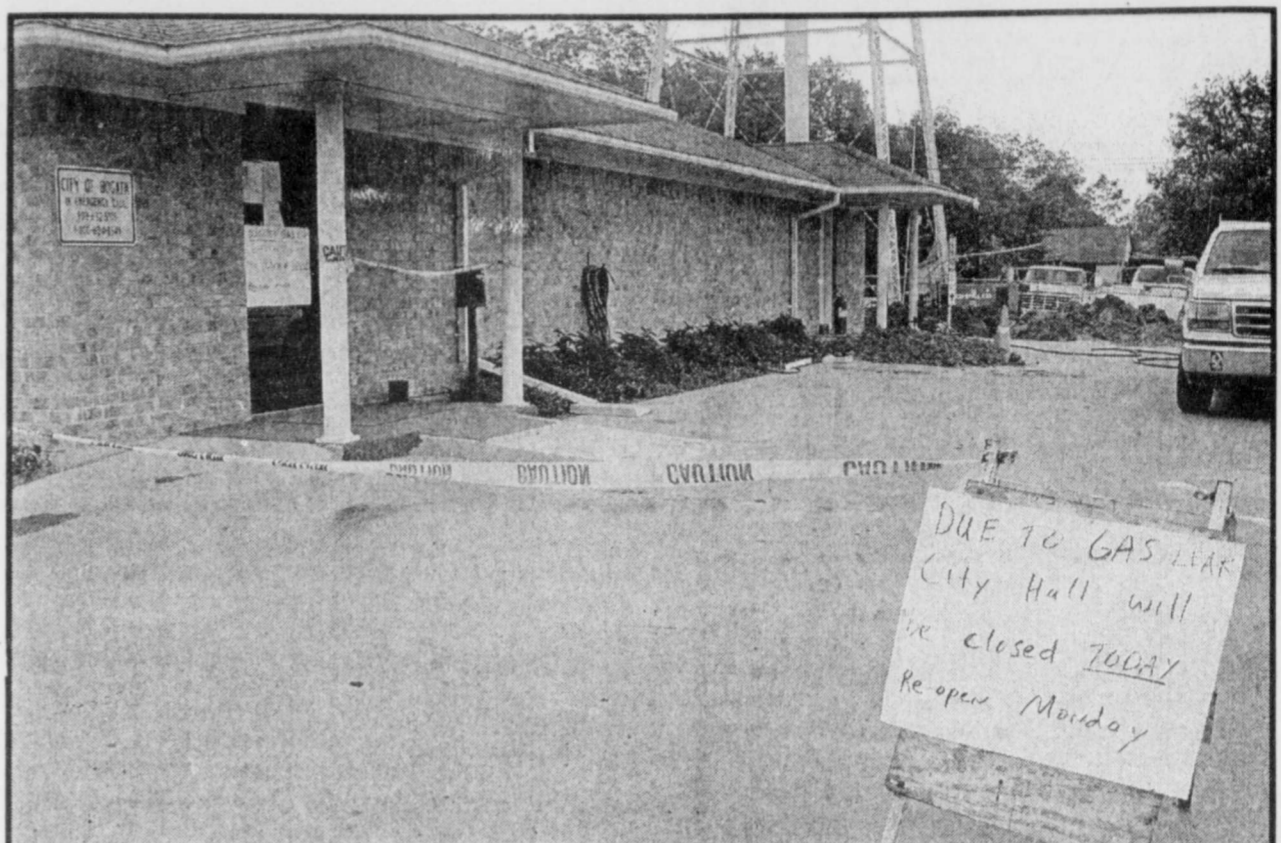

Former resident dies

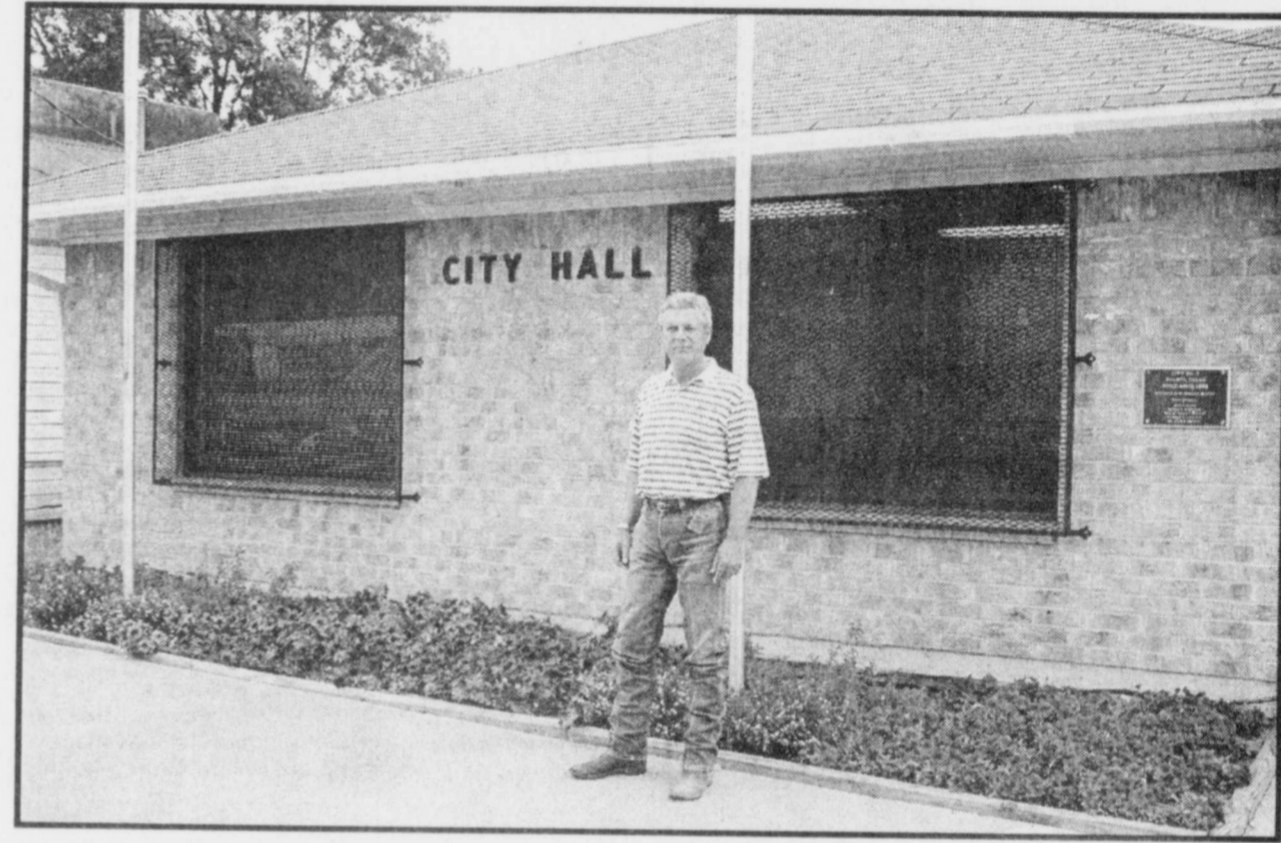

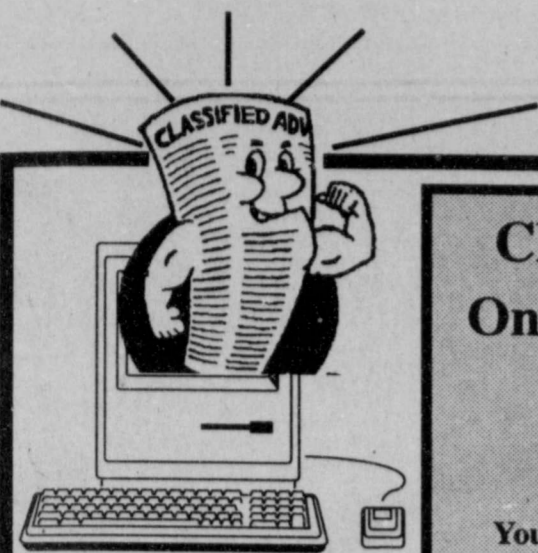

New Band Director welcomed

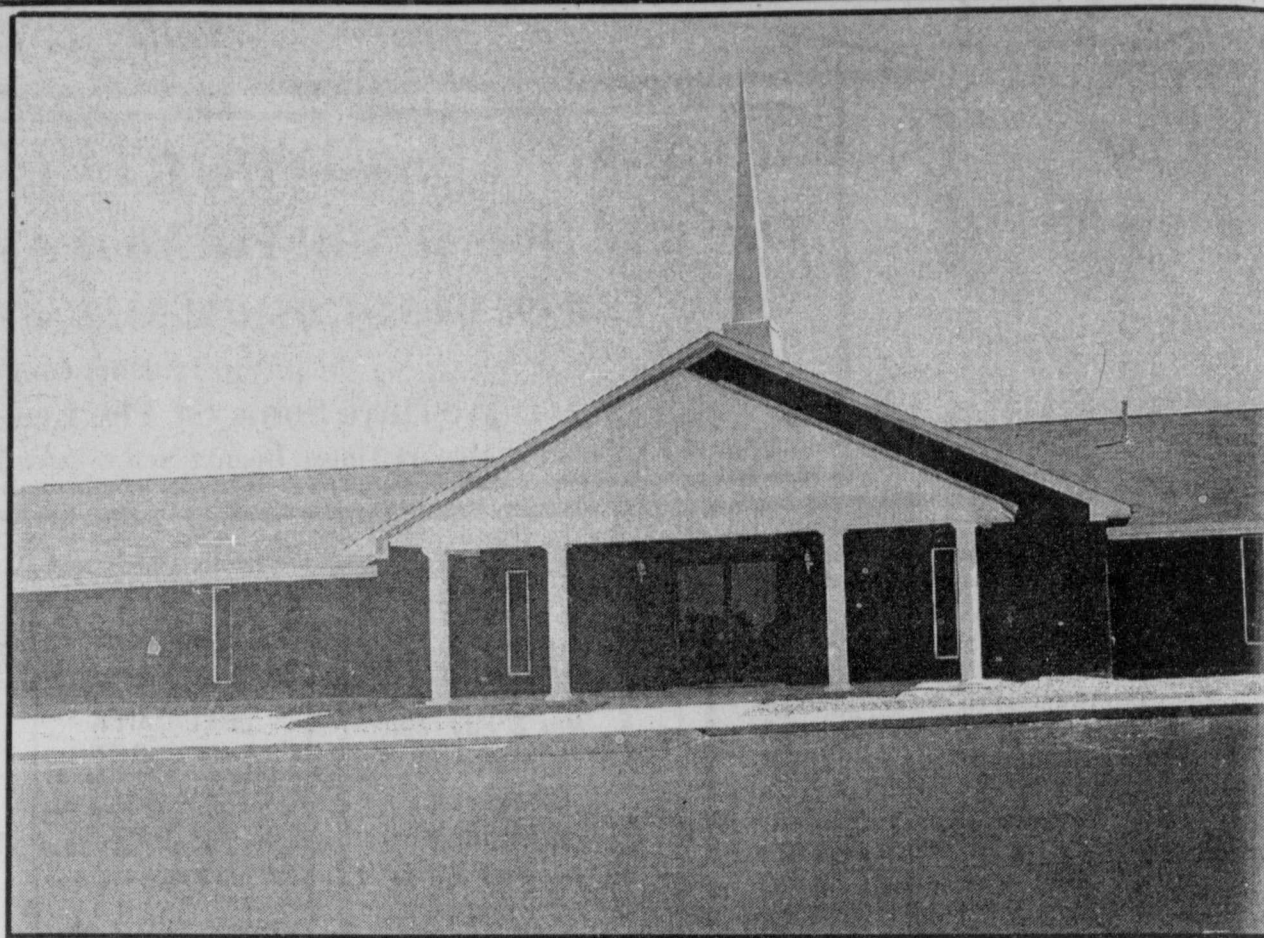
Clayton Taylor will be the new Rivercrest High School Band Director next year.

The service will include special music, recognition of volunteers and donors, a summary of the building

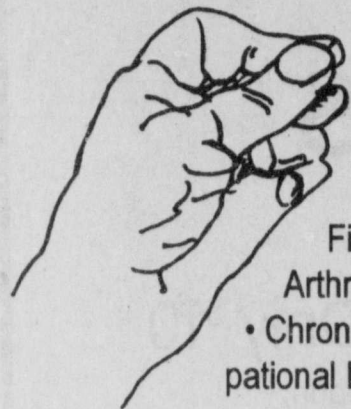
project, and the Dedicatory Sermon by Pastor Larry Neeley of the Missionary Baptist Church of Hughes Springs, sponsoring church for the Mission.
