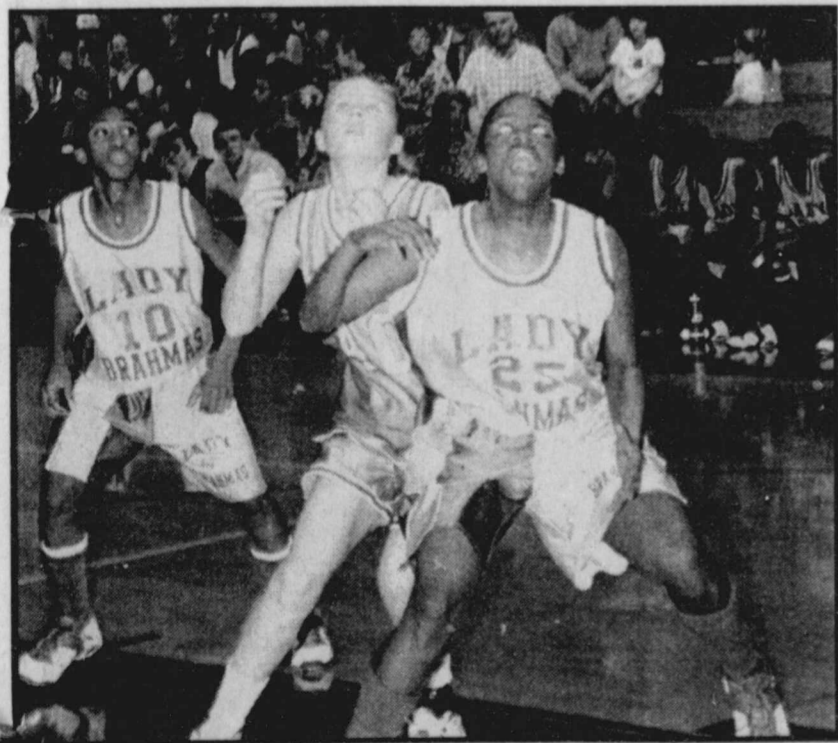

### Work on "Project Graduation" has begun

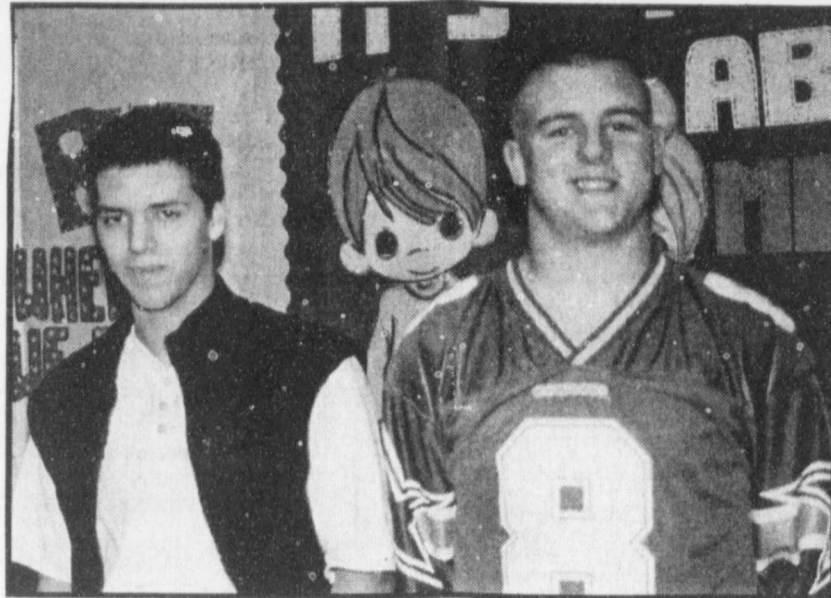

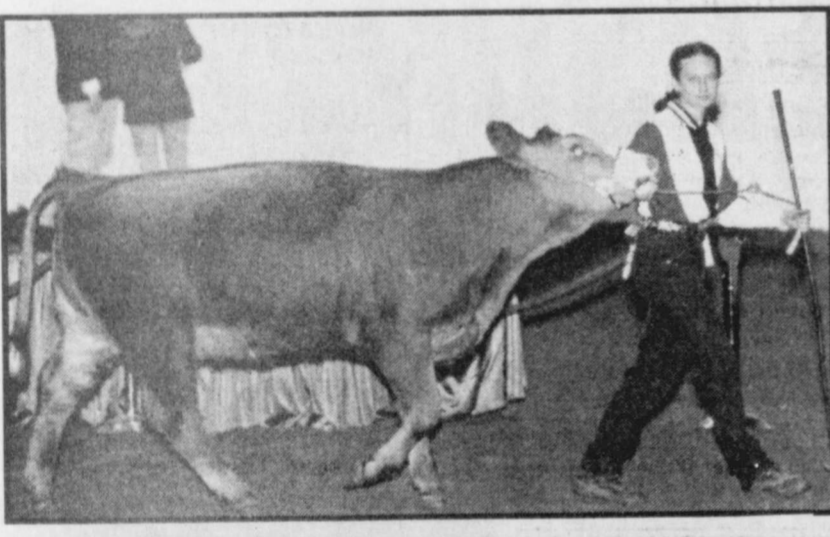
