I laughed. A man across the room asked what was so funny, and I read the note to the entire waiting room. They laughed, and then began to go on about how many times they had waited for hours on end.

I left for a few minutes, and when I came back was going to show Thomas the message. Lo and behold, the receptionist had come out and ripped the back cover off of the magazine! Apparently they didn't like having the waiting room know that hours of waiting wasn't out of the ordi-

It's ridiculous. At a recent book club meeting our roll call was to be answered with a "negative experience at the doctor's". Virtually every member of the club had a story about the long waits in the doctor's office.

Once, at a clinic I began comparing appointment times with other patients waiting. It turned out that four of us had the same appointment time, followed by four more fifteen minutes later.

ANYONE knows that won't work. I don't think many doctors care. It isn't their problem that people have to be off work for these appointments. They don't pay attention to the fact that people have children to pick up, obs to go to and besides, if you are very sick a two or three or four hour wait isn't a great thing.

But all too often I believe the reason for these delays is a callous disregard for the fact that other people have lives too. Well, we do!

There, I got that off my chest! And I'll bet most of you readers can relate a similar tale of wait, wait and wait. Come on out there, let's do better!






