

worked during the ice storm. Wendell Davis, Water/Street Superintendent, gave his report, which included 84 work orders. TNRCC has made their inspection of the sewer plant, he reported, and the debris site is closed.

Fire Marshal Randy Lemme reported 5 medical calls and a structure fire out of town. He also reported that the fire department's recent fund raiser was successful, netting between

The council voted to implement a drug policy requiring drug testing for all new hires, all vehicle and equipment accidents and lost time accidents. This policy will be implemented in 30 days.

They voted to recommend to the Texas Department of Transportation the B 2 A proposal for the four lane project of Hwy. 271. This is the route that would go straight through Bogata with five lanes, one to be a turn lane. Four voted for this proposal, one against.
