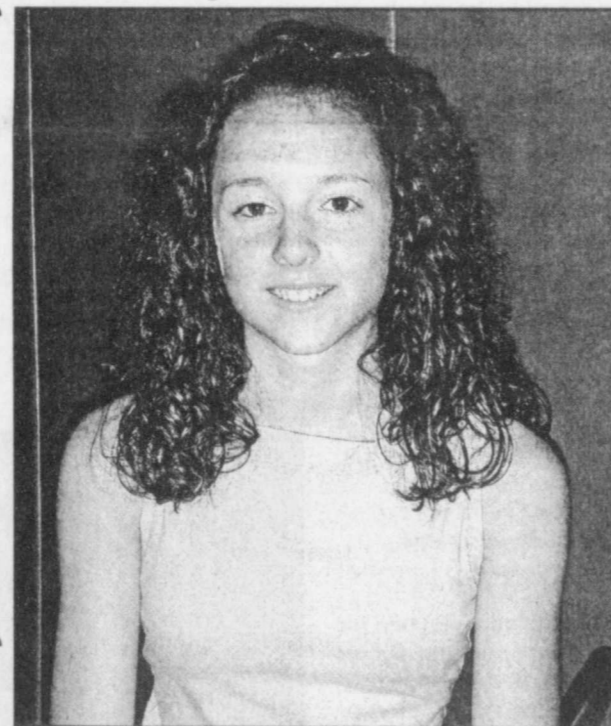

## Bogata mayor, councilman resign

Jack Crane resigned his position as Mayor of Bogata in executive session Monday night, and a council member, O.E. (Edd) Spencer, resigned Tuesday morning.

The council members, Mayor and sixteen citizens and employees were on hand for the meeting Monday night, May 14.

Rick Hanning, District Operations Manager of TXU Electric & Gas, introduced himself and told the council to call on him if there were any problems.

Chief Clegg gave his report, and the council took no action on approving SRO Grant for the Police Department, awaiting a decision from the school. The council voted unanimously to pay overtime hours for the Police Department which were worked during the ice storm.

Wendell Davis, Water/Street Superintendent, gave his report, which included 84 work orders. TNRC has made their inspection of the sewer plant, he reported, and the debris site is closed.

Fire Marshal Randy Lemme reported 5 medical calls and a structure fire out of town. He also reported that the fire department's recent fundraiser was successful, netting between

\$2,000 and \$2200.

The council voted to implement a drug policy requiring drug testing for all new hires, all vehicle and equipment accidents and lost time accidents. This policy will be implemented in 30 days.

They voted to recommend to the Texas Department of Transportation the B 2 A proposal for the four lane project of Hwy. 271. This is the route that would go straight through Bogata with five lanes, one to be a turn lane. Four voted for this proposal, one against.

The council went into executive session and upon coming out Mayor Pro-Tem Randy Kennedy announced that Mayor Crane had resigned.

The council voted to table hiring a new City Secretary Assistant until next month. They approved a Volunteer Fire Department grant, and tabled action on setting a policy for large water bills due to leaks. They voted to adjust a large water bill at the First Baptist Church Parsonage, and voted to pay \$600 for materials to help remodel the Library. A meeting was scheduled for Friday, May 18, at 4:00 p.m. to appoint a mayor to fill the unexpired term left vacant.

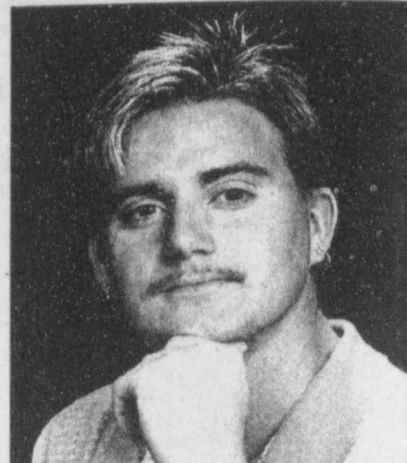
### Dear Editor:

## Country Cooking, May 17, 2001

### Onion dip

1 pouch dried onion soup mix  
1-16 oz. container sour cream  
1/2 Cup shredded cheddar cheese (optional)

In medium bowl, combine soup mix and sour cream. Cover; refrigerate until serving time, at least 2 hrs. Makes 2 cups.

1 slice plain bread  
1 slice wheat bread  
1 slice rye bread

Spread the peanut butter on the plain slice of bread and the jelly on the rye slice. Sandwich the wheat slice between the rye and plain slices of bread. Then cut it in half and you can see why it gets its name.

### Egg in a Nest

1 egg  
1 slice bread  
Butter

Butter-bread and cut out center. Put in preheated pan and crack egg in the center. Turn when toasted. Done when both sides are toasted.

### French toast

1 slice of bread  
2 eggs  
Cinnamon  
1 tbsp. sugar

Crack egg in medium bowl and mix sugar and cinnamon in and stir. Soak bread in mixture and toast in skillet until done. Serve with syrup.

### Tortilla Pizza

Flour tortilla  
Spaghetti sauce  
Shredded cheese

Any other goodies in the fridge

Place tortilla on microwave safe plate. Spread spaghetti sauce over tortilla. Place goodies over tortilla. Cover lightly with shredded cheese. Microwave until cheese is melted.

### Pigs in a Blanket (yum, yum)

Hot Dogs  
Canned Biscuits  
Shredded Cheese (optional)

On a plate spread one biscuit dough thin and in rectangular shape by pushing with your fingertips. Place hot dog on bottom edge of the dough. Roll hot dog in dough sealing ends together by pinching dough. Place on cookie sheet and bake at 375degrees until dough is done. (Optional, Shredded cheese can be spread on dough before hot dog is rolled)
