We moaned and complained for a while before drifting off to sleep.

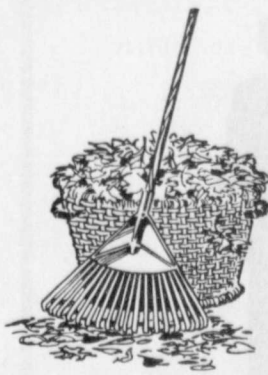
Getting up Monday morning would have made a great comedy video!

Everyone is invited to attend the Halesboro-Morris Chapel Homecoming on Saturday, October 13. The group will meet at the Morris Chapel Community Building.

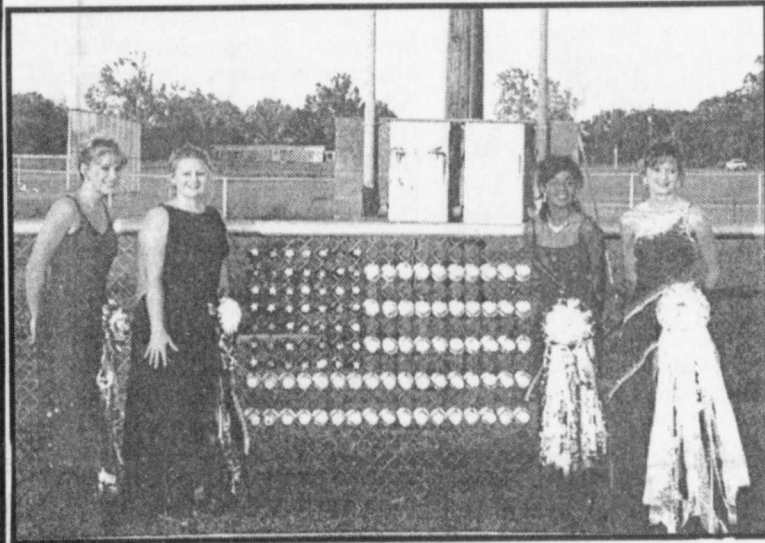

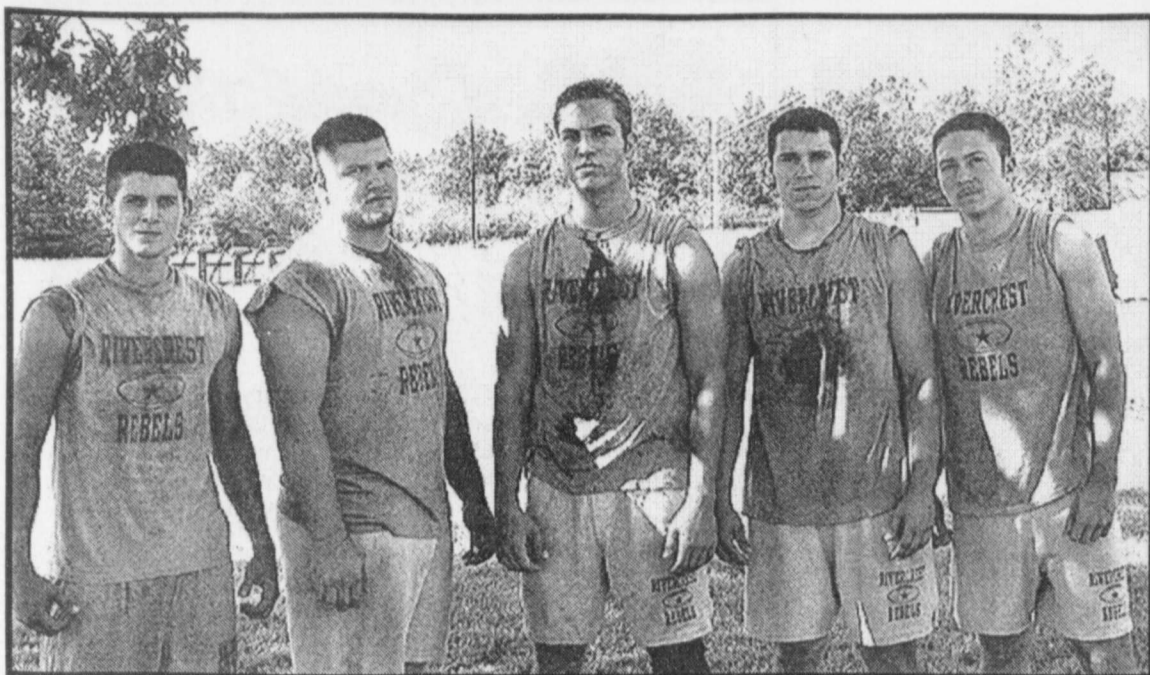

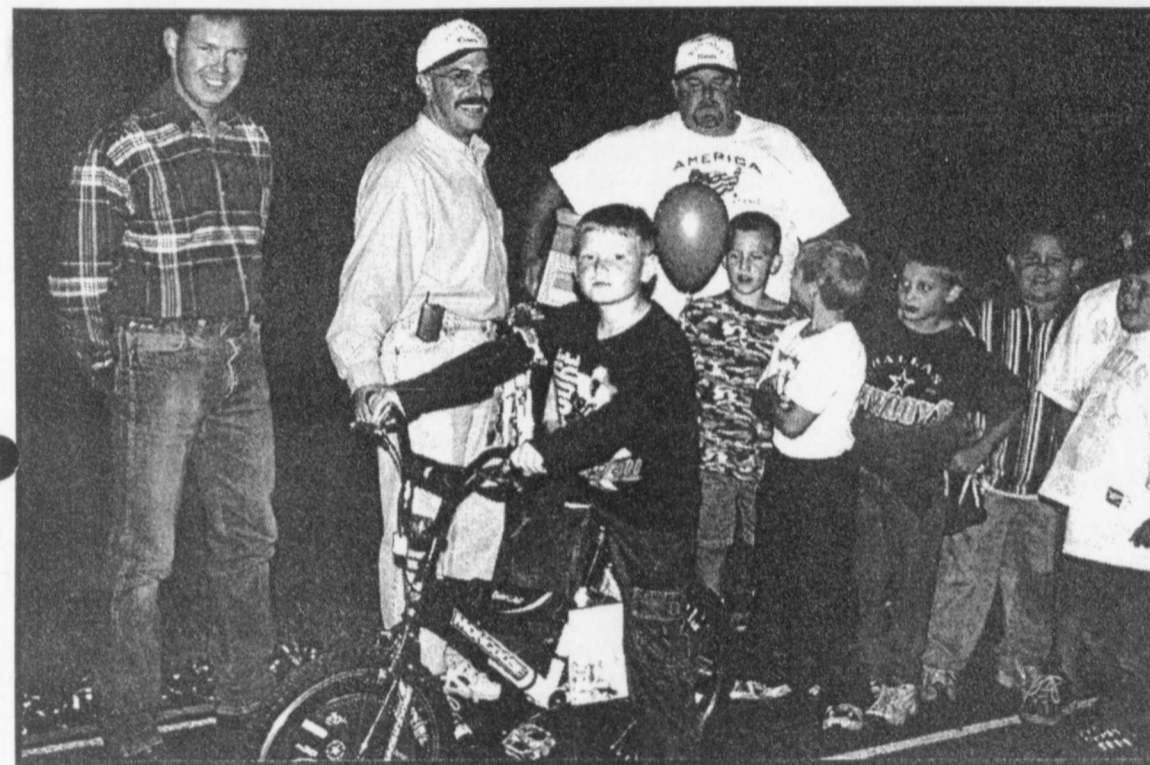

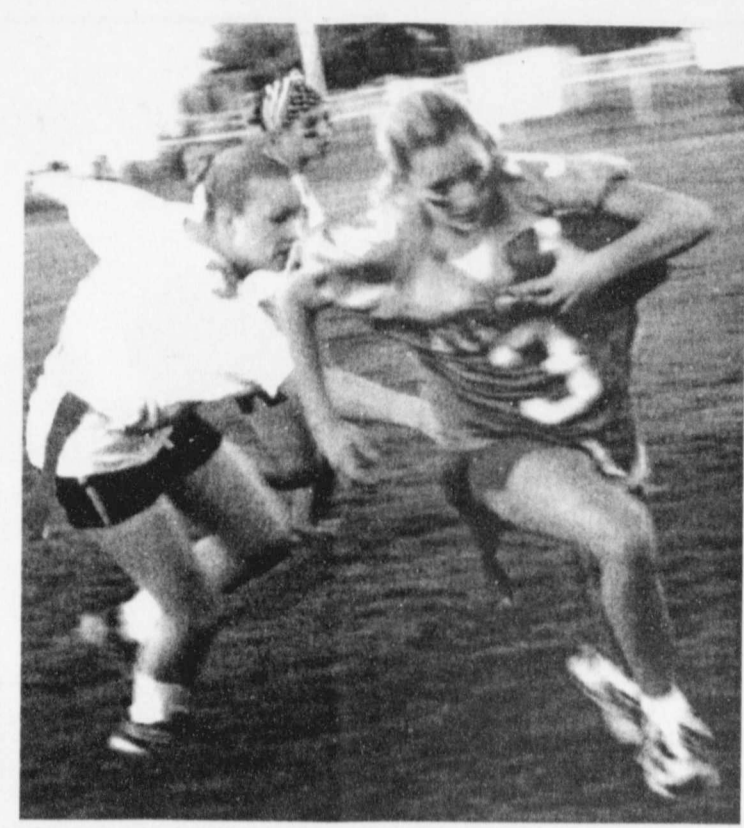
