

Under the direction of Patricia Graham and Charlene Barker plans have been made for a pot-luck dinner to be held immediately following the worship service. ### Road Work Scheduled For Area

Work in the Lamar County area is included in a huge highway rehabilitation and improvement program approved recently by the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission. District Engineer R.S. Thornburrow said the work in this area is part of a statewide effort to modernize roads and highways which are worn out or inadequate for today's traffic.

Area projects include a seal coat project on U.S. Highway 82, from Blossom to the Red River County Line, a distance of 5.3 miles, and additional financing for reconstruction, base, and resurfacing on F.M. Highway 196, from Pattonville to Cunningham, a distance of 13.3 miles.

The 1982 Rehabilitation and State Highway Safety and Betterment and Farm-to-Market Road Improvement Program will cost an estimated \$213.6 million, with \$1.6 million held in reserve for later assignment. The program includes improvement and rehabilitation of 5,478.3 miles of state-maintained highways. In all, there are 898 separate projects in 218 counties of the state. The work includes projects which will upgrade existing highways to handle heavier volumes of traffic, enhance safety, reduce the amount and kind of maintenance necessary and to protect the large public investment in the highways of Texas. Almost 70 percent of the work is on US and State numbered highways in Texas with the remainder being on FM roads.

### Farm Bill Could Destroy Farmers

The Board of Directors of the National Farmers Union (NFU) said in June that a weak farm bill, combined with high interest rates and a tax cut oriented to the wealthy, could wipe out the newer generation of farmers and deal a drastic blow to agriculture and rural communities.

The statement was issued by the board, which includes national officers and state Farmers Union presidents, including Texas Farmers Union President Mike Moeller, following a day of conferences with key leaders and staff specialists of the agricultural, budget and tax-writing committees of the Congress.

The NFU officials charged that the Reagan economic package being debated on Capitol Hill is largely misdirected since "It fails to cope with the most hard-hit sectors, agriculture, housing, autos, and heavy industry."




