



Most of the money spent in grocery stores-78 percent-went for food. The meat department alone accounted for 21.8 percent of total grocery sales.

Start at home. To determine foods you need, take inventory of food supplies already on hand. Check weekly food specials in the newspapers and note inexpensive or in-season foods. Plan menus to combine the weekly specials and foods on hand; then prepare a shopping list based on your weekly menu.

Clip coupons. They can save money on products you normally buy.

Compare prices. Often, costly brands are conspicuously shelved at eye level. So, look up or bend down to spot bargains.


