## Tractor Pull Has New Location

Again this year local people will participate in the annual Paris Young Farmer's Tractor Pull, long a favorite event for area people.

The Keys brothers, James and Paul from Deport will be competing, as well as David Basinger of Deport, James Winters of Pattonville, and Melvin Webb of Blossom. The Allens of Allen Farms will be back as usual, plus other local entries.

The main change in the event this year will be the location. The new location will be on Loop 286 NW of Paris, between City Electric and Cagle's. The new site will have a three hundred foot long track, as compared to the old track at the Rodeo Arena in Paris, which was only half as long.

The Young Farmers presently have some 500 seats erected, but will put up 2000 more on Thursday before the pull. There will also be room for people to back their pickups in and sit on tailgates, or to put up lawn chairs to sit in. Parking will be more than adequate.

## Roach's Burglarized Second Time Within Two Weeks

For the second time within two weeks Roach Oil Company has been burglarized.

Burglars broke the same window that had been unlocked, located at the back of the building, and entered through it.

They took some forty

cartons of cigarettes, several cartons of chewing tobacco, two electric drills and a variety of tools. Amount of the burglary is as yet undetermined.

Lamar County Sheriff's deputies have taken fingerprints, photographs and are making every effort

to solve the case. It is not believed to have been the same people who stole the entire safe from the building Tuesday, July 7, because of the different method of entry. Small bare footprints were found on a chair which had been pulled up to some shelves to reach

items above the burglar's reach.

One of the thieves cut themselves, apparently upon entry into the building through the broken window. Blood trails were found over the station.

Investigation into the case will continue.

## City Sales Tax Payments Are Higher

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Tuesday said payments of the optional one-percent city sales tax for 1981 to Texas cities are 17 percent higher on a statewide average compared to last year.

Bullock's office Tuesday paid 713 Texas cities \$32,698,770 in sales tax rebates for July.

City sales taxes are

collected by merchants and businesses along with the state's four percent sales tax and are rebated monthly by the Comptroller's office.

Statewide, Texas cities have received \$343.4 million during 1981 compared to 1980 payments through July of \$291.9 million.

Rebates for our area were: Blossom—\$4,139; Bogata—\$9,428; Deport—\$3,060; and

Talco—\$15,408.

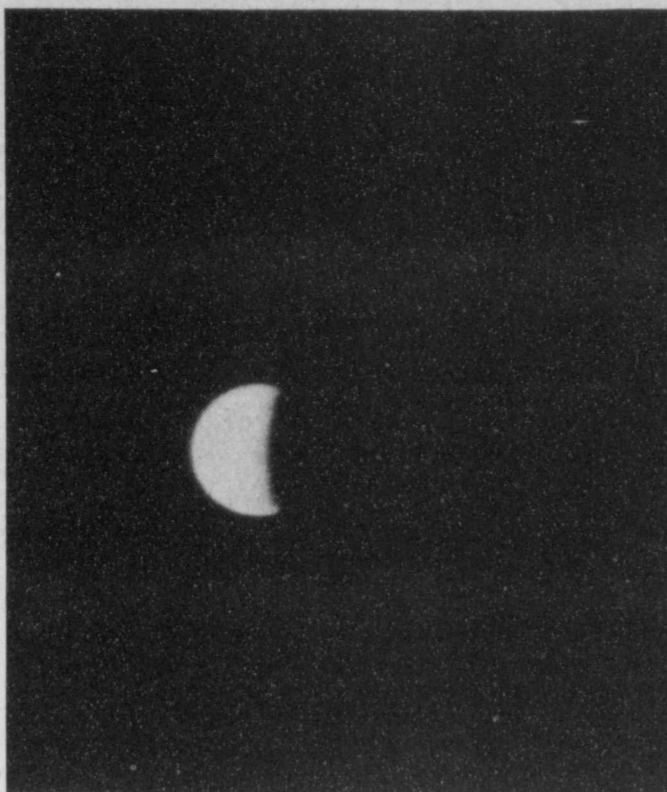
