The total number of votes was an alltime record for the school district since consolidation, with 1,044 people expressing their opinion in the matter. The trustees also approved the 1982- | 83 amended school budget, and sent it to McClanahan and Holmes for auditing. <br> In other business the board raised the salary per day of substitute teachers from $\$ 25$ to $\$ 30$, and decided that the annual junior-senior prom would be for Pıairiland juniors and seniors only, not invited guests. <br> The minutes were read and approved, and the meeting adjourned without further discussion. |
