of year, the most often asked questions from gardeners. Since water both essential for healthy plant
growth and often costly to apply to
plants in quantity during the summer, plants in quantity during the summer,
it is important to get the water to the plant's roots and keep it there. The

is to try to sprinkle them each day by using their thumb and the end of a
running hose. Most gardeners do not have the patience to stand in one spot
long enough for deep penetration.
